# Hopes and Breams

Far-flung exhibitors find their way to Amarillo for the Adequan Select World Championship Show.

FROM 42 STATES, TWO PROVINCES AND FOUR COUNTRIES, EXHIBITORS flocked to the 2011 Adequan Select World Championship Show in Amarillo.

They brought their hopes, dreams and horses with them, and tagging along for the ride were a lot of life stories, earned

through success, failure and the push toward excellence.

# 99 Years of Experience

IT TAKES A LITTLE LIFE EXPERIENCE TO COMPETE AT THE Adequan Select World. For Ruth Ann Barr and Johnny Be A Goodbar, that's 99 combined years of experience. Ruth, who hails from Millsap, Texas, is 80. "Hershey" is 19.

Ruth has ridden all her life, but she only began pleasure driving five years ago, giving Hershey the edge in experience in the event.

"I never drove until I was at (AQHA Professional Horseman) Kevin (Dukes's) barn. I just did western pleasure," Ruth said. "(Kevin) said, 'Have you ever driven?' I said, 'No, but I used to ride with my dad in the old wagon when he took us to school. He always drove the harness horses, and it was fun, but I've never driven.'

"Kevin said, 'Come on and drive Hershey.' Two laps around the pen, and I said, 'He's *mine*.' "

That same year, 2007, Ruth and Hershey were fourth at the Adequan Select World in pleasure driving. Ruth lives about 20 minutes from Kevin's barn and rides at least once a week, western, but her addiction is driving.

"It's just a thrill," Ruth said. "You can feel the horse through the reins and it's so fun to do a park gait. It's like you're going through the park with the flowers and the bees,

and then I'm in the road gait. It's Sunday morning and I've got my hat on, and I'm going to church, and I crack that horse – I'm late, so I've got to get to church on time! That's how I think of the park gait and the road gait. I had to tell my kids that. They didn't know what park gait and road gait were."

Ruth is a retired travel agent, and she and her husband had a restaurant for a while in Nebraska, open from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. every day. Now she's ready to drive and maybe win, though that's not her goal.

"There are a lot of good horses (here)," she said. "Anybody could win it now. It's pretty good. We're going to go and have fun and if we can both do the best we can, that's all I ask."

# Finally a Win

HARL PRUITT OF ROSENBURG, TEXAS, WAS BESIDE HIMSELF.

"This (2011) is my sixth or seventh year to show (at the Adequan Select World), and the best we've done is seventh," he told the Journal after winning the 2-yearold mares halter class. "Today is just fantastic!"

The mare he showed to the top 10 in Select yearling mares last year, Exceptional Playgirl, walked out of the Amarillo National Center on September 1 with a world championship in 2-year-old mares.

"We breed, foal and raise our own babies," Harl said. The "we" includes his wife, Chanci McKinnon. "All the horses we have now were born on the farm. That makes it even more special. We don't do so well all the time, but they are our horses."

Harl gives "100 percent" of the credit to the mare's success this year to AQHA Professional Horseman Luke and Abbi Castle of Wayne, Oklahoma.

"(Luke) took her and gave her the opportunity to progress within herself, and he and Abbi just did a world champion job. I can't say enough good about Luke and Abbi."

He grudgingly admits the mare is spoiled: "When she was a baby, my wife would lay down in the stall with her. Because she's N/N, we didn't do anything with her for the first year, just left her at home. She was spoiled rotten.

"With a halter horse, it's OK if they are a little bit spoiled, but not too spoiled. So we have a little bit of a challenge when we go out and show her. She knows that I'm easy on her. She pushes me, but today, it just worked."

Harl grew up around horses but didn't start raising American Quarter Horses until about 13 years ago, on the encouragement of his daughter, Shelly. He bought a daughter of Obvious Conclusion and kept her with Shelly in Oregon.

"One day, my wife said, 'Why don't we buy a place down here (Texas)?' "Harl recalled. "We were living in a townhouse. I grew up on a farm, and at that time, she didn't know what a halter was."



They built a farm, moved the mare, Obvious Della, to Texas and bred her twice to Playgirls Conclusion. Harl and Chanci hauled to weekend shows with a two-horse trailer, and those two fillies – Playgirl Bachelorett and Playgirls Lady – ended up top 10 at the Adequan Select World and at the AQHA World Championship Show. Harl found himself turning down a lot of money for the mares, hoping they would be the start of a broodmare band.

"Everyone told me I was crazy," he said. "So I'm vindicated (today)."

Exceptional Playgirl is Playgirls Lady's first foal.

Harl is in the offshore oil and gas business, fabricating offshore structures. But he and Chanci's other full-time job is the horses.

"We don't have any hired help at our place. My wife and I do it all," he said. "This business is a labor of love, because if you don't love it, you'll hate it. When it's 110 or 20 degrees outside, you have to take care of those horses twice a day. It'd sure be easy to roll over and sleep a little longer, but those horses have to eat."

# From Snow to SHOW

THE EXTREMELY COMPETITIVE ROBIN BEALL OF GRAND MARIAS, Minnesota, had a goal to make it to the western pleasure finals at her first Adequan Select World and she did.

But horse shows are not the only place where Robin competes. She is a professional musher and dog sled racing trainer.

Robin and her husband, Greg, work together training 20 Alaskan Huskies a year to become sled dogs. They currently have 50 dogs at home, plus their Miniature Australian Shepherd, Copper.

The well-trained dogs are used by the local YMCA to educate people about the art of sled dog racing.

Training schedules run year-round, even without snow.

"In the summer, we hook them to four-wheelers," Robin said, adding snow is on the ground in Grand Marias from November to April most years, providing people many different places to race.

Robin has finished in the top 10 at every John Beargrease Sled Dog Marathon race (in Duluth, Minnesota) that she has entered.

There is not a Select division in sled dog races.

"I'm the oldest one out there, usually. I'm the old girl chasing all these young farts," Robin joked.

Her sled is pulled by eight dogs. The first set is called the lead dogs.

"Their responsibilities are to take my commands of steering the sled and to lead the rest of the pack," she explained.

Then come the swing dogs, the team dogs and the wheel dogs, which are closest to the sled.

"The biggest myth is that you want your biggest dogs as your wheel dogs," Robin said. "You want smaller built dogs because the larger ones are not as agile."

Getting ready for a dog sled race is a lot like getting ready for a horse show, Robin explained: "You have a lot of stuff to get ready, it's like let's go, let's get on the trail. But horse shows definitely make me jitterier."

The dog sled races themselves are also like horse shows. Each team of dogs is required to have pre-race vet checks and at least one mandatory check along the route of the race.

"The mushers are also (concerned about the dogs). If you don't have healthy dogs, you don't go anywhere," Robin said.

The hardest part of sled dog racing for Robin is running at night: "It's so narrow; all you see is basically the dogs in front of you. Even to this day, I don't like running at night."

The hardest part of showing her horse as a Select is remembering everything.

Robin purchased her gelding, Always Heaven Sent, from her trainer Jody Ploog, who bred and raised "James." Robin travels five and a half hours, one way, to get to her weekly lessons.

Horse showing is where Robin goes to get away from the excitement of her racing life. She grew up showing and riding, but took 30 years off.

"When I turned 50, I told my husband I wanted to buy a show horse," Robin said. "Sled dogs are all about speed, fast, fast, and then I come here and it is like, 'oh, it's time to go slow."

# Gunnin' to Win

STEVE GUNN WAS NO stranger to a win photo, but for the first time, he was the one sitting tall in the saddle, with an AQHA world championship trophy perched in front of his horse.

After years of supporting his daughters, Jessica and Caroline, with their endeavors in the show pen, the Greensburg, Indiana, farmer finally took the reins for himself in 2008.

But before he could tackle those daunting Tim Kimura-designed trail courses, Steve needed to find the perfect partner. For the task, he enlisted son-in-law Jason Gilliam.

Motion By Pro, a 1988 sorrel gelding by The Promoter and out of Lady Queen 1 by Sorrel Rondo 5, was a more-than-decorated competitor himself

- in that right, he was the perfect fit with the Gunn family.

"He's been good for me and he's taught me a lot," Steve

said of "Mo." "You could say that he was the 'pro' and I was the 'motion.'"

Steve and Mo saw quite a bit of success in the show pen right off the bat, and the duo has qualified in trail at the Adequan Select World every year since 2008.

Shown to a long list of awards by previous owner Ashley Aikman, there was one thing that 23-year-old Mo had yet to achieve – his own world championship.

Riding 12th in the trail finals August 31 at the Adequan Select World, Steve and Mo deftly navigated the course.

"I made some mistakes in my other finals patterns (over the years), but I put it together today," Steve recalled. "I came out and thought I had a good ride, but it was even better than I expected."

A few runs later, Steve and Mo filed back into the arena along with their fellow trail competitors.

Once realization set in that he and Mo had finally achieved what they set out to do three years ago, Steve let out a war whoop and punched the air.

"I had a good time out there – I let everybody else out there know I had a good time," he exclaimed.

Steve enjoys the family aspect of his win – he rides under the critical eyes of his daughters and son-in-law, and receives boundless support from his wife, Janet.

The family atmosphere of the Adequan Select World is also one of Steve's favorites.

"We're all the older generation, you might say, but if it wasn't for us, the younger generation wouldn't be here. We're glad to get together and have a good time. We're still competitive, but most of the time we don't chew on each other very hard, and we'll pat each other on the back and encourage each other."

It's that kind of support, plus the personal challenge, that has attracted Steve to trail.

"A lot of people have beat me over the years, I've beat a lot of people, but it's all about how you do on that day with your horse."

# Am I Dreaming?

THE ROAD TO A WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP BEGINS WITH A STRONG athlete. Mix in the kindness of family members and a lot of years of experience, and it was a winning combination for Billy Emerson of Addison, Texas.

On August 29, Billy rode Stylish Lizzorro to the cutting world championship at the Adequan Select World, with a 221.

"I have a very kind son to loan me a horse like this," Billy told the *Journal*. "I appreciate the AQHA. It's such a family-oriented association and allows us to share immediate family members' horses. He can show mine, and I can show his. I had two qualified. My mare, I messed up my cut on the preliminary round and didn't make the finals, so fortunately, I had this second horse and it looks like my son's horse is the best horse."

Stylish Lizzorro, a 2005 sorrel gelding by Lizzys Gotta Player and out of Stylish Sharon by Docs Stylish Oak, was bred by Timothy Drummond of Pawhuska, Oklahoma.

"He's just a big old athlete that can hold the toughest cow," Billy said. So he and his herd help were looking for fresh cows that would challenge "Lizard."

"I was just concentrating on trying to pick cows," Billy said. "I was 14th (in the draw), so I was worried about whether there would be any good cows left and fortunately they were, so I was just trying to stay focused and not worry about what everybody else was doing. It's just me and that cow out there."

Billy had help from his trainer, Josh Townsend, AQHA Professional Horseman Teddy Johnson, Rick Darling and Bill Perkins.

"We had four real true professional helpers and, believe me, they helped pick the cattle and pointed them out when I was deep in the herd. They made the whole run possible," Billy said. "We had three cows that were left that we knew were fresh, and it was pretty difficult – it's like I tell the trainers – we can't interview the cows the way we do employees, so you just have to try to judge them the best you can, and this particular horse has such a big stop. We know that the



judges are going to mark him better if I cut a cow that will what they call 'carry him' somewhere, make him have a big stop, very athletic, and he can come back through, so we needed a little tougher cow to mark a big score on him than you would a horse that's real fancy in the middle."

Billy has been showing for about 20 years as a stress relief from his work in the music distribution business

"Then after retirement, that's when I tried to get serious and learn to show," he said.

For the last few years, he has been showing at the Adequan Select World, hoping for a win. His gold trophy was a dream come true, he said.

"I really want to compliment AQHA for having the consideration to have a senior Select show to give us old geezers a chance to compete and have an opportunity to win a world championship," he said. "Also to Adequan – it's very kind of them to sponsor and it's been a lot of fun. I've been up here several years, and it worked out really good this time."

# Bucket List

IN 2008, KATHERINE HAYNES OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI, WAS diagnosed with myelodysplastic syndrome, a serious form of cancer that affects the blood-forming cells in bone marrow. A doctor gave Kathy only three months to live if there was not a perfect match for a stem cell transplant.

Thankfully, her youngest brother was that match. Kathy and her husband, Sandy, moved to Vanderbilt Hospital in Nashville, Tennessee, for six months.

The cure for her disease was the highest and strongest form of radiation that requires patients to be under the age of 50, which Kathy just met.

Doctors dropped her white blood cell counts down to zero. Kathy explained it as erasing everything off of your computer and "rebooting" it.

"That's what they did to me," Kathy said.

The transplant had a 30 percent chance of success – which meant there was a 70 percent chance of it not working.

"I looked at the chart and said I want to be in the 30 percent, and I never thought about anything else."

With Sandy's strong support, she made it through the first 19 days not knowing whether the transplant was going to work and being incredibly susceptible to any kind of infection. After the first 19 days, Kathy got the good news that the transplant was increasing her white blood cells to healthier levels.

"My husband did not leave my room for weeks at a time, not even to go to the cafeteria," she said. September 12 marked their 30-year anniversary.

"I would not have made it without his support. Also, the support of my friends and family. We made it by just taking it day by day."

"I just went for my three-year checkup, and when you hit the three-year mark, your chances (of long-term survival) go way up."

During her six months of treatment, Kathy left her youngest child, Austin, and horse, A Bold Artifact, at home with her brother and sister-in-law. She is the mother of three children, Randall, Justin and Austin. She also considers herself the mother of her horse.

"I picked this mare (the Thoroughbred River Cam) out just to breed to Indian Artifacts. I sent her up there (to be bred.) I am the breeder (of A Bold Artifact). I literally had to pull his feet out myself," Kathy said.

She shows her horse in hunt seat equitation, hunter under saddle and showmanship, and made the hunter under saddle finals at her first Adequan Select World.

While Kathy was recovering from her treatment, she was not allowed to ride, to go the barn or be around horses for a year, a hardship for a horse enthusiast who has been in the saddle since she was 6 months old.

"I couldn't live without (riding)."

Kathy's first time back in the saddle was at a show more than a year after her treatment, aboard her good friend Sandy Slocum's gelding, Shifty Lynx.

At the Adequan Select World, Kathy's friends burst into applause as she made her first loop around the arena, some of them tearing up.

"God is the only reason why I am here. He left me here, and I am happy," Kathy said. "I'm not only lucky to be here at the Select World. I am lucky to just be here."

# A Second Chance at the World

THE JOURNAL FIRST MET LISA HAMILTON AND CREEPY JUNIOR. at the 2010 Region Two Championship in Rapid City, South Dakota. Lisa calls the big, rangy gelding "Big Brown," or "Brown."

On the hunt for a barrel horse, she stumbled across a 1989 campaigner desperately in need of a good home, and her heart – and horse trailer – went out to him.

She hauled him home, fed him up and discovered Brown still had spunk in him. She eased him into running barrels again, and raced at the 2009 Region Two and again in 2010, after he won his first paycheck with Lisa. He won regional buckles.

"I believe in second chances for everybody, kids, horses, it doesn't matter," Lisa said at the Region Two – she works with troubled teens in Billings, Montana – and she decided to give Brown a shot at a world title.

At a show in Gillette, Wyoming, in early May, they earned enough points to qualify for the 2011 Adequan Select World.

"I didn't expect to qualify. I just went to see how we were doing," she said. "I ran seconds straight through, and my friend, Rhonda (Russell), said, 'You just qualified for the world!' I knew without a doubt I was going to come. I was thankful I got my points when I did because then we had that EHV-1 outbreak and a lot of shows in Montana were cancelled."

But the challenges were just beginning.

First, Lisa tore the meniscus in her knee – and had to start riding in a brace.

Then her dear friend Rhonda found out she had cancer and started chemotherapy immediately.

Then Lisa couldn't find a ride to Amarillo - two confirmed



rides fell through. Two weeks before the show, she found a ride with Laurie Marcotte, who was showing in aged geldings. Laurie was willing to come several days before she had to: "God bless them for helping me out," Lisa said.

In Amarillo, when Brown unloaded, he had a three-inch cut on his leg, despite wearing protective boots. It was fresh, and the show veterinarian quickly sutured him up. They kept an eye on him and Lisa rode him lightly.

"It is awesome to be here; it is a dream come true," Lisa said before the prelims. "As a 12-year-old, I remember going and sitting and looking through the Quarter Horse Journal and thinking, 'Wow, I'd love to be there some day.' This is great. I'm here, and with a 22-year-old!

"It was just a dream. Am I really here? It's amazing."

Come prelims day, the vet OK'd Brown to run. Everyone who could was set up to watch through the Pfizer Animal Health Web Cam – Brown's former owner, Lisa's friends from work and family.

Then, in the alleyway two goes before theirs, another competitor's horse kicked Brown. Lisa went ahead and ran, but she could tell he was off his game – they finished 20th in the prelims and didn't make the finals.

It's been an emotional year for Lisa. On top of trying to get to the Adequan Select World, an adopted child, she was able to reconnect with her birth mother and family this summer. Her newfound family members were among those cheering her on through the Internet.

"He's himself," she said later, looking at Brown. "He is so funny; I love him to death. He's fine with all this (show commotion). He's just in his stall with his head in his fan, just standing there.

"You just have to be hopeful and keep trying and don't give up," Lisa added, finally tearing up at not making the finals.

Despite the challenges and the frustration – she's proud of herself and Brown. They made it to the World.

"We're not done," she said. "We need another chance in this arena!"

# FARNAM SELECT ALL-AROUND AMATEUR

Anne Wilson of Dallas had lowered expectations coming into the Adequan Select World.

She had reason for her pessimism: Her horse had been injured for four months; she had only been riding him for three days; and on one of those days, he bucked with her.

Her biggest goal was to maybe – maybe – defend her show-manship world championship title from 2010.

She had no idea that on September 3, she would win the 2011 Farnam Select All-Around Amateur with Visible Investment, aka "Dudley."

The award carries with it a \$10,000 cash award plus \$1,000 in Farnam products; an original Lisa Perry bronze; and an embroidered cooler.



Visible Investment is a 2000 bay gelding by Investment Asset and out of Visibly Royal by Sonny Go Royal. He was bred by Donald L. Moothart of Fairfield, Iowa.

"My horse got injured the first of May," Anne said. "He has been hand-walked for four months. When we sent in our entries, my trainer told me I had a less than 50 percent chance of being able to show here. We just continued to hand-walk, and the Monday before the show, the vet came and put him on the longe line and he was completely sound. So I came here with three days of riding."

One of those days included a practice show with Anne's trainers, Jill Briggs and AQHA Professional Horseman John Briggs of Pilot Point, Texas.

"That practice show was pretty rough for me," she said. "He bucked in the practice show, but he didn't buck in the real show, so I'm glad he picked his time to get it out of his system."

Even after arriving in Amarillo for the Adequan Select World, Dudley was still pretty fresh and needed plenty of riding time.

"Every single day, he has gotten so much better," Anne said. "I think the break was good. It refreshed him. He's just been great. He has performed perfectly for me. I'm so thrilled with him. Completely surprised."

Anne and Dudley were qualified for the Adequan Select World in six events, showed in five and placed in four.

They were eighth in performance halter geldings, fourth in hunt seat equitation and third in horsemanship.

Best of all, they defended their world championship in showmanship.

Anne showed horses as a 4-H youth in Ohio, but family and career pulled her away. After volunteering at a therapeutic riding center for a few years, the center offered riding lessons for the volunteers.

"When I got on the back of a horse, I didn't want to get off," she said. "I thought I'd show four times a year, and by the end of my first year, I was showing four times in a month. You know how that can happen with these horses. It's a little contagious."






# More Trophies

AQHA to recognize more exhibitors at this year's world shows.

AQHA IS RECOGNIZING A NEW LEVEL OF EXHIBITORS AT FOUR OF its world championship shows this year. At the 2011 Built Ford Tough AQHYA, Adequan Select and Bank of America Amateur and Fedex Open Weeks at the AQHA World Championship Show, AQHA will recognize the top three Intermediate exhibitors in each youth, amateur, Select and open class.

"This is a great way to introduce some of the show or competition-leveling concepts that AQHA has been exploring over the last couple of years," says AQHA President Peter J. Cofrancesco III. "Recognizing the Intermediate exhibitor is a way to shine the spotlight on exhibitors who have worked hard to qualify for our world shows and are tough competitors at our world shows year after year, but don't make it into the Top 10."

An Intermediate exhibitor at the AQHA world shows is defined as follows:

- An exhibitor who has never been in the top 10 at a world show in the particular class in which they are competing. Halter classes (including performance halter) will be all-inclusive, meaning any top-10 placing in halter, regardless of sex division (ex. a top-10 finisher in 3-year-old geldings is not considered an Intermediate exhibitor in any halter class even though he/she might have placed outside of the top 10 in a different halter class). Open performance classes will be the same. For example, AQHA will not separate junior reining from senior reining, or junior western pleasure from senior western pleasure, for purposes of determining whether an exhibitor is an Intermediate. However, AQHA will recognize the Intermediate exhibitors in each of the junior and senior open classes.)
- Intermediate will run as classes within classes, not separate.
   AQHA will not bring back the top Intermediate riders for a ride-off or in a separate class.
- Intermediate exhibitor status is based only on an exhibitor's lifetime, combined world show record, not on the number of points he/she has accumulated.
- An exhibitor does not have to make it to the finals of his/ her class to be considered for an Intermediate award.
- There is no entry fee or nomination procedure for an exhibitor to be considered for an Intermediate award.
- The awards will be called the AQHA Intermediate champion, AQHA Intermediate reserve champion and the AQHA Intermediate third place.
- Intermediate accomplishments also will appear on the exhibitor's and horse's AQHA official record.

The Intermediate exhibitor recognition package will include an 8-inch clear globe for first place and 6-inch clear globes for second and third place. Each Intermediate champion will also receive a specially designed patch that can be placed on a qualifiers jacket that can be purchased by the exhibitor. The top-three Intermediate exhibitors will also have the option to purchase a championship buckle.

On the following pages, you will find the list of Intermediate Award winners from the 2011 Adequan Select World. Some classes didn't have any exhibitors who qualified for the Intermediate awards, while other classes only had one or two exhibitors who qualified for Intermediate awards.







AS A SMALL-TIME HORSE OPERATION, MY family likes to keep tabs on the handful of American Quarter Horses we sell.

For this task, AQHA's member services has been a great resource – we track the show and ownership records of the few horses we sell, but we haven't been so great on following up with direct communication to our horses' new homes.

At a recent show, one of our friends overheard a certain gentleman bragging on his wonderful mount, Wright On TC. Knowing that my family bred, raised and showed "Curly," as we affectionately called the 10-year-old brown gelding, our friend suggested that Jack Hunter, Curly's new partner in crime, contact us.

What ensued can be considered the best phone call the Christiansen family has ever received.

#### The Back Story

IT ALL STARTED WITH SUGARI COLONEL. Bred by the late Greg Ward, the 1988 daughter of Just Plain Colonel was purchased by my grandfather, Dave Christiansen, as a 50th birthday present for my grandmother, Bonnie.

"Sugari's" greatest accomplishments in life have been achieved as a broodmare – her first foal to show being the Christiansen family favorite, TC Lena.

Pleased with our Lenas Wright On cross that resulted in TC Lena, aka "TC," we bred back to the son of Smart Little Lena two years later, the result of which was Curly.

Now, TC and Curly may be full brothers, but most of the time, they're as different as night and day.

When TC came up lame at the end of 2004, my dad, Terry, handed me Curly's reins and wished me luck on





my maiden voyage down the fence ... on a 4-year-old. Those familiar with reined cow horse events know that an old, broke cow horse can keep a rookie out of trouble – a 4-year-old certainly isn't old and most of the time isn't all that broke.

Looking back on it now, I realize just how spoiled I was at 16 – Curly didn't know how to get into a dangerous position going down the fence and avoided hairy situations at all costs.

But by the end of 2005, after Curly and I had placed fourth in working cow horse at the Built Ford Tough AQHYA World Championship Show, we realized that our barn was filling up and we couldn't keep them all. The long and short of it was that Curly found a new home with our family friends, the Hannans.

And that's where Curly stayed until 2009, when the Hannans experienced the same horse multiplying effect that we had, and Curly made his way to the sale ring at the Snaffle Bit Futurity.

#### Off To a Rough Start

RECENTLY, MY MOM, ANNETTE, ANSWERED A PHONE CALL FROM Beulah, Colorado. What she was treated to was a long conversation with Jack Hunter, the proud owner of Wright On TC.

In the two years that Curly has been with Jack, a lot has changed for my ol' faithful youth horse. For starters, he's no longer a Northwest native – he lives in Colorado. Secondly, he's got a new name: "TC." Yes, that's right – we've got another TC to add to the family.

"A good friend and trainer, Blue Allen, first told me about TC, and after reviewing the video on the sale website, we decided to go to Reno," Jack says, starting off his story on how TC No. 2 came to join the Hunter herd.

The Hunters, along with good friends and fellow Colorado natives Mike and Holly Major, took off for Reno with Wright On TC in their sights.

"Like most of us, I had a budget on what I felt that I should or wanted to spend on a good horse. It didn't take long for my budget to go out the window when my wife mentioned that the day after the sale would be my 68th birthday, and (she asked me) how long was I going to wait for a really good horse. As they say, the rest is history."

Unfortunately, the duo got off to a rough and dangerous start. TC No. 2, the playful cow pony that he is, wasn't even with Jack for a month before he found a way to get himself hurt. In November 2009, TC No. 2 found himself en route to Denver for surgery.

"It took about 18 months of casting, bandaging, therapy and additional treatments, including IRAP, as well as shockwave," Jack recalls. "The end result is a fantastic horse that is *sound*."

#### **New Heights**

NOW THAT TC NO. 2 IS ON THE MEND, JACK HAS HIS EYES SET ON new heights.

"I am trying to get up to speed with TC, and I have been working with Kyle Trahern for reined cow horse competition," Jack says.

Kyle, the 2004 Ford Youth World working cow horse world champion and 2005 senior working cow horse reserve world champion, has been familiar with TC No. 2 for quite some time.

"Kyle knows TC quite well from Reno when he was 3 and the (Ford Youth World) as a 4-year-old," Jack explains. "My goal is to qualify for the (Adequan Select World Championship Show) next year in cutting, (working) cow horse and maybe reining, also. (TC) can do it all. He just needs me to catch up."

#### **Full Circle**

LAST YEAR, I SIGNED UP THE FORMER HORSES OF THE CHRISTIANSEN herd with the AQHA Full Circle program. The Full Circle program is open to any current AQHA member and should a horse you enroll in Full Circle ever become unwanted or ready for retirement, you could be contacted to help.


Even though the Full Circle program isn't how Jack got in touch with us, it gives me peace knowing that my horses just might find their way back to me, should they need me.

Not that I expect TC No. 2 to make his way back to my herd – I think he's got a great "forever" home with Jack, and I look forward to meeting up with them in Pueblo, Colorado, for reined cow horse shows.

I, on the other hand, am looking forward to the 2012 Adequan Select World, where I hope to cheer on my favorite team: Jack Hunter and Wright On TC.

#### **By Tom Moates**

"I'M FINDING OUT A LOT OF THINGS THAT THE HORSE WORLD prepared me for," says Edwin "E" Gaffney as he leaves high school and his second term of office as AQHYA Region Eight director.

E's current crossroads in life is sweeping by any standards. He has managed many notable accomplishments so far: He earned AQHYA youth world championships in impromptu and public speaking, and team demonstration; competed against professional trainers in the first Project Cowboy contest in Fort Worth; and he was the first African American to be elected to the AQHYA national board of directors.

Now, with high school and AQHYA behind him, E is blazing another impressive trail. The Aurora, Colorado, cowboy is embarking on a trip to France where he has been hired by Disney to work as a cowboy for the Buffalo Bill Wild West show at Disneyland Paris. And he's finding that his experience with horses has done a lot to prepare him for any new challenge.



#### **Cowboy Service**

"I DON'T REALLY COME FROM A RURAL BACKGROUND," E SAYS. "I live in the city. There's more asphalt in my neighborhood than dirt. Somewhere along the line, I just got bit by (the horse bug). I'm one of five brothers and sisters. All of us ride and have shown at least once. I'm the second oldest.

"Because of my location (near Denver) I didn't really have a lot of opportunities with horses, so I sort of had to make opportunities. Any time I'd get a chance to ride a horse I'd take it. I just really wanted to ride.

"Then several years ago, there was a 4-H leader here in Arapahoe County, and she was leasing some horses. We would travel about 30 miles from home and go over to her place and work with the horses we were leasing there, and take care of them, feed them, and feed all the 20 or so horses at the barn at least once a week."

E became active in 4-H and says he came to AQHA by way of his 4-H successes. He is now a 10-year 4-H member. In 2007, he won the Colorado state 4-H championship for individual horse demonstrations. After that, he represented Colorado at the National Western 4-H Roundup where he won his first national 4-H championship. His score for horse demo helped the State of Colorado win high state overall for the Horse Classic.

That performance caught the judges' attention and prompted one to suggest he look into opportunities through joining AQHYA. E got his membership and went to Oklahoma City to compete at the Built Ford Tough AQHYA World Championship Show where he took reserve world champion for prepared speaking and won the world championship for impromptu speaking.

With his love of horses, proven talent as a public speaker and keen interest in AQHA, it wasn't long before E was headed for office.

"Back in 2009, I ran for Region Eight director for AQHYA," E says. "Region Eight is Colorado, Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico and Kansas. It is the heartbeat of horse country, as I see it, because you don't get any horsier than those five states right there. I went down there and ran the best campaign I possibly could. I think there were six candidates running; I was blessed enough to be chosen by the youth of Region Eight to represent them as one of their directors. That was a great experience."

E was re-elected in 2010, and in his second term, he also served as chairman for the AQHYA National Public Policy Committee. He also helped with *The American Quarter Horse Journal's* online video coverage at the Built Ford Tough AQHYA World Championship Show.

While serving as director for Region Eight, E went to QuarterFest in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. Unfortunately, the most severe storms in a century rocked the area during the event with heavy downpours, tornados and extreme flooding. E recalls helping coordinate the evacuation of people from the barns and getting them to safe shelters. In a storm that had nearby Nashville flooded and killed 31 in the region, he feels blessed that no horses or humans were injured at the event.

"I had a lot of great times and great experiences," E says. "The principles for working with horses have taught me so much. What we do with horses relates to people and vice-versa.

"One of the great things about horses is they aren't judgmental. A horse doesn't say, 'Oh, I heard what this one person said about you.' A horse kind of says, 'OK, show me what you have to offer, and I'll judge you by how you treat me.'

"A horse has never said to me, 'I'm going to buck you off because you're too skinny or you're too fat.' Or, 'I'm not going to go on a trail ride with you because your skin's the wrong color.' Or any number of those things. A horse says, 'I'll judge you based upon how you treat me,' and I think that's an important principle.

"The definition of character is doing what I ought to do whether I feel like it or not, even when no one's looking. That is something that really applies to horses. Who's going to know if you do or don't clean out that water tank? You're going to clean out that water tank because you're going to do right by your horse. And that same thing applies to life in the business world. What if I can get away with cheating on these taxes? It's just a small little item, who is going to find out about it? But character says to do the right thing at the right time."

#### **Heading to Disneyland**


THE OPPORTUNITY WITH DISNEYLAND PARIS CAME THROUGH QuarterFest, in a roundabout way. E says he came across an audition notice online from Disney, calling for actors and stunt men with excellent horsemanship skills. It seemed perfect for him, but he set the notice aside and forgot about it. When he met Rial Pate, clinician Curt Pate's son, at QuarterFest, the audition came to mind as they spoke and the pair decided to travel and audition together. A week later, they took a 700-mile road trip to Browning, Montana, and the Blackfeet Reservation to audition.

In the first round, they were asked to ride a horse bareback and fast.

"I'm thinking, OK, a horse I've never ridden before, I have no idea when he was ridden last, I've got 60 mile-an-hour winds gusts going on right now, and they want me to go gallop him bareback ... sounds like fun!" E says.

Despite the challenging conditions, both cowboys passed the first round, completed the second round, and went home to wait and hear whether they made it.

"I got a letter from Disney saying, "Thank you for auditioning for the Buffalo Bill Wild West Show at Disneyland Paris. Based on your application, we don't have any current positions open at this time," E says. "But thank you for auditioning; we'll keep your application on file.' So I thought, 'Oh, well, I didn't make it but at least I auditioned. How many cowboys can say they've auditioned for Disneyland Paris?' It was a great opportunity and I sort of forgot about it."



A few months later, E received a call from Disney. The company had a part open in the show, and he was first on its list to fill the vacancy. E accepted the position, and should be an active cast member in Paris by fall.

Now he has devised a way to use his upcoming opportunity to help others – through his Facebook page.

"I was thinking about being away from home and wanted to give people the chance to experience vicariously what I'm experiencing in my adventure to Europe, because it really is a once-in-a-lifetime experience," he explains. "So I decided to put together a Facebook page so I could post videos and photos and just tell about all the cool stuff that's going on with my adventures with Disney. Literally, you dream about these kind of things happening, but I opened my eyes and I'm not dreaming — it's real!

"It occurred to me there are so many people in need, and I've just been really blessed with this great opportunity and I really wanted to bless other people and to give something back. One of the things that I decided to do was for every 'like' that my page gets, I make a donation to the Red Cross.

"All people have to do is go onto Facebook and type in my name, "E Gaffney," and they can go to my page and check out what I'm doing and have an opportunity to really help people in need

"I look around as a 19-year-old, and there are a lot of people in the spotlight, and they have a lot of power and a lot of influence, but they don't use it for good – one of the things that I wanted to make sure that I did. Since I've been given such a great opportunity and put in such a fantastic position, I wanted to make the most out of it. I saw it as a great opportunity to help people really rebuild, and since 1881, the Red Cross has been doing that. All anyone has to do is make a click and the rest comes out of my pocket."

Ultimately, with E the conversation never drifts far from horses. He constantly links his many accomplishments back to his experiences with them.

"To be a good horseman you can't say, 'What's in it for me?" E says. "You have to say, 'What can I do to serve the horse, or make the horse better?' As someone inside the equestrian world and outside, I kind of have to look at things

and look at people and say, 'How can I make this organization or this person better?' There are just so many principles like that that I've learned and (that) have really stuck with me that working with horses have really helped to reinforce."

### DEMO TEAM

#### A LOOK AT FORD YOUTH WORLD COMPETITION OUTSIDE THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR PARK ARENA.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This article was part of the Journal's online coverage of the 2009 Built Ford Tough AQHYA World Championship Show.

Youth can face all kinds of challenges on the road to the Ford Youth World: delayed flights, flat tires on trucks and trailers, long hauls on lonely highways.

And the Transportation Security Administration could confiscate your competition gear.

Brother and sister, Edwin, "E," and Julia Gaffney, can testify to that. On the way to Oklahoma City for the 2009 Ford Youth World team demonstration contest, the TSA frowned upon the benign but flammable props they packed in their airline bags for their demonstration on barn fire safety.

"Well, we had some props that were hazardous materials," E said with a sheepish smile. "These were things you want to be careful with if you have them around the barn. We checked them."

E and Julia flew from their home near Denver to Dallas to pick up their grandparents who live in Tyler, Texas; the family planned to drive to Oklahoma City from there. But the teens' box of props didn't show up on their flight, or on the next three flights. Finally, the airport called.

"When we went to pick it up, it had TSA tape on it," E said. "We opened it and there were all these cards in there talking about the materials we had."

"They took the WD-40, the little bottle of hoof polish and the fire extinguisher," added Julia.

With the plane delay, the Gaffneys didn't arrive in Oklahoma City until the morning of the competition August 3 and without necessary props for their demonstration.

There was a sudden scramble to help out. Riders at the Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Youth Association stalls donated some hoof polish, and Ward Stutz, AQHA director of youth activities and educational programs, borrowed a fire extinguisher from the sales pavilion kitchen.

The Gaffneys ended up winning world championship buckles in the competition. On August 5, E also won the world championship in prepared public speaking.

E and Julia have long been involved with 4-H in showing their horses and participating in public speaking competitions.

"We were crazy about horses before 4-H," E said. "Maybe it was watching Westerns at Grandma and Grandpa's, but we'd always ask for toy horses. Mom and Dad don't know where it came from."

E and Julia's parents are Dr. E.C. and Toni

Gaffney of Aurora, Colorado. E.C. is the president of Essentials for Life, a company that provides character-based leadership training for schools, businesses and families. He also authored the book "How to have Self-Controlled Children in an Out-Of-Control World."

Toni homeschools the Gaffney children. Rebecca, 19, is the oldest and a student at the University of Northern Colorado. Next are E, 17, Julia, 15, Esther, 12, and 8-year-old Samuel. Rebecca was the first Gaffney child to show an interest in horses, and the other siblings have followed suit.

E became involved in AQHYA after he met Kayce Carter, AQHA's former senior manager of youth programs, when she judged a national 4-H competition. She encouraged him to join AQHYA and try competing at the Ford Youth World.

In 2009, E was elected an AQHYA Region 8 director at the annual Youth Excellence Seminar in Amarillo. As a youth director he handed out awards and helped with the Oklahoma State Fair Park Q-J video team coverage of the Ford Youth World, in addition to competing.

"I want to help the American Quarter Horse and be involved, and help AQHYA maximize our people potential and be all that we can be," E said. "That's what I want to do. I was blessed and fortunate enough to be elected. It'll be exciting."

# Laughing

HE WASN'T SUPPOSED TO RIDE AGAIN. HE REALLY WASN'T expected to walk or talk.

But 16-year-old Trey Schwab has always had a little ornery streak and more than a touch of competitiveness, things that are serving him quite well. His eyes sparkle now as his sister chides him for going too fast in his stake-race run at the 2011 Built Ford Tough AQHYA World Championship Show. He also competed in barrel racing aboard Poco Jacko Express, or "Jocko."

Just a year ago, that was unthinkable. Trey, who lives in Hamilton, Ohio, was critically injured in a truck-and-trailer accident on the way to a horse show May 22, 2010. He sustained a traumatic brain injury, and his mother, Cindy, also suffered near-fatal injuries in the wreck. Doctors warned the family not to get their hopes up.

"They pulled Tena (Collier, Trey's sister,) and I off to the

side one day and just told the two of us, 'Don't expect much.' He was laying in that bed, and they told us, 'This is pretty much what you're going to have,' "says Trey's dad, Paul.

But they didn't know Trey.

"They said (riding again) won't happen. And now we're like, 'It's happening!' "Tena says. "And his doctors say it's the best therapy in the world for his balance, and it's strengthening his leg muscles for walking, so riding is actually really, really good for him."

Asked how it feels to be back in the saddle, Trey says, "It feels like I just made a new life. That's awesome."

He's talking. He's walking. And, yes, he's running in speed events. ■

# Helping Hay Hand

Grass-roots efforts are helping to keep horses

home and out of rescues in this tough economy.

HAY BANKS ARE PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE free hay to horse owners with immediate, short-term needs. Such programs are an effective means to help bridge the emergency feed gap so that some horses can remain at home with owners to care for them rather than be moved to other places, such as rescues with uncertain futures.

Due to tough economic times and sudden and, often unexpected, financial distress for many otherwise responsible horse owners, the term "hay bank" is becoming increasingly common.

#### **Early Development**

MANY SMALL-SCALE OR INFORMAL hay-assistance programs have been in existence around the country through the years, sometimes associated with various rescue organizations.

The Oregon Horse Welfare Council in 2008 set out to establish a way to help struggling but responsible horse owners with temporary supplies of hay to weather tough times. This

pioneering effort to organize a hay bank on a larger, more formal scale than was previously attempted has taken root. The group's success has prompted the creation of many other sizable hay assistance programs around the country.

The Oregon Hay Bank owes its creation to the impromptu organizing work of a group of concerned citizens from rescue organizations, law enforcement agencies, veterinary clinics and breed associations, along with other individuals from the community who came together in Bend, Oregon. The program is an outreach arm of Equamore Foundation and Strawberry Mountain Mustangs Inc.

The hay bank is a way to make options available to keep horses home with their responsible owners and to reduce the demands on already overburdened horse rescue groups.

The Oregon Hay Bank, which keeps careful track of its data, says 99.4 percent of the horses it has

helped to feed temporarily are still with their original owners. With such an overwhelming rate of success, it is no wonder that other regions of the country have looked to the Oregon Hay Bank as a solid model to create other hay banks.

#### Programs Expand

SOON TO FOLLOW THE OREGON HAY BANK MODEL WAS THE Michigan Horse Welfare Coalition's Hay Bank. Again, it was a large cross-section of concerned members from the regional community trying to find a way to improve the chances for horses to remain with responsible owners that led to its creation in January 2009.

Jodi Louth, the program coordinator, says that as of mid-2011, the group has assisted in feeding 101 horses at a cost of more than \$6,000. The money comes from private donations.

Most hay banks established around the country seem to work on the Oregon model, which is to accept cash donations and, in turn, purchase hay from an applicant's regular local hay supplier.

This scenario works well as a fast and effective means to provide hay relief to a large area, according to Jill Frith, one of those responsible for beginning the Michigan hay bank. She says that often hay suppliers provide bales at a reduced rate when the hay bank is making a purchase to further help stretch the dollars.

All hay banks have an application process for horse owners

in need. The information gathered typically includes the number of horses owned, the name of the regular vet, the date of the most recent vet visit and the date of the most recent hoof trim.

Several hay banks will not provide hay assistance for horses used for breeding purposes. Often owners who board their horses are disqualified because boarding a horse is viewed as a luxury. Applicants must agree to farm inspections by hay bank personnel to establish the conditions where horses are kept. Some groups require some kind of documentation to substantiate financial need.

In addition, there are some more obvious requirements spelled out, such as stipulating that none of the donated hay can be resold or transferred to others, that applicants cannot be an equine business and that plans are established to work toward avoiding the need for future hay relief.

Some rescues require residency within a certain state or region. Hay banks commonly purchase and provide enough hay to carry the horses in need on a qualified farm from a couple of weeks up to a month.

#### Variations of Help

ONE NOTABLE EXCEPTION TO THE RELATIVELY STANDARD CASHbased format set forth by the Oregon Hay Bank is The Hay Bank based in Parker, Colorado. This group receives, stores, handles and delivers hay to accepted applicants.



"I have volunteers in and around the Denver-metro area to pick up and deliver hay for us, as well as store hay," says Amy Ryals, The Hay Bank's founder. "I have different locations where we store hay when it is donated, depending on where I need hay at that time. I try to keep at least a hundred bales in each of our distribution locations so my volunteers can access hay close to them and deliver it to applicants that are approved."

Amy explains her basic system: Applications are taken online; references are mandatory; and those references are investigated to make certain that applicants are responsible horse owners and that their story is verifiable. If everything checks out, The Hay Bank delivers some hay.

The Hay Bank accepts donations of hay or money. When money is donated to the organization, Ryals explains, it is typically used to purchase hay that is then brought into her distribution system, a difference from the Oregon model, which usually deals with the horse owners' regular hay suppliers.

"Most of the people from whom we take applications are hurting financially, obviously, so they don't have the capacity to drive too far to pick up hay," Amy says. "Some of them have literally been my neighbors. I live in a county that's been pretty hard hit. We have a lot of horse people, so I have had a couple that have picked up hay from my location. But for the most part, we deliver everything.

"Our average load is 20-30 bales (a pickup load), based on the number of horses, as well as the quality of hay being provided. Obviously, when we have donated hay, we may not have first-choice-perfect horse hay. I may get some bales that have a bad spot here and there, and I compensate for that.

Amy says The Hay Bank isn't set up to help horse-rescue organizations.

"Our goal is to help the individual horse owner who has their horses at home to keep their horses for a little longer period of time than they might be able to on their own so their horses don't end up in a rescue situation or going down the road to a sale barn," she says. "Our scope is very simple and very small; we deal with individual horse owners, and we have been able to give them a reprieve.

"I had a biochemist that we provided hay to – she lost her job, her company downsized, she'd been with them for 18 years. Applicants are usually people who have always been able to care for their horses very well, and then just something unforeseen, catastrophic happened, and they lost jobs, terminal illnesses, loss of a spouse – you just can't even imagine how that affects a person."

The Hay Bank opened its doors in January 2010, and by January 2011, it had distributed 960 bales of hay.

"I get applications in daily," Amy says, "and I'd say that of the applications we get, about 90 percent of them are approved. It usually takes about a week. I spend most Sunday afternoons driving and delivering hay. I make the four- or five-hour roundtrip and deliver as much as I can in one big loop."

Another variation on the hay bank is the United States Equine Rescue League, which offers an equine crisis intervention fund for residents of North Carolina and Virginia that includes temporary hay and feed assistance, among other assistance, like some veterinary care.





The British Columbia Quarter Horse Association sponsored a team of American Quarter Horses for the "Battle of the Breeds" at the Pacific National Exhibition.


That team won.





THE 2011 NSBA WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW RETURNED TO Tulsa, Oklahoma, August 17-21 along with the Breeders Championship Futurity. The show, which has followed on the heels of the Reichert Celebration in recent years, stood on its own successfully with good entry numbers. The NSBA World Show and Breeders Championship Futurity had 1,592 combined entries.

#### **New in 2011**

Rather than the exhibitor competing in an age division, the classes are divided by levels of experience, offering the Limited, Intermediate and open division, based on number of points earned.





# Seven.

"WE'VE GOT TO BRING IT BACK TO the people," said Terri Wirthlin of Las Vegas, the show manager for the 2011 AQHA Region Seven Championship August 18-21 at the Blackhawk Arena in Salina, Utah.

The "it" she's talking about is showing horses.

Cheryl Smith of Ouray, Colorado, agreed. An avid cow horse competitor, Cheryl brought along her daughter, Skyler, for a cattle class debut and a full weekend of showing.

"We heard it was a really fun show," Cheryl said. She was encouraged to try the Region Seven through Skyler's 4-H friends. (Colorado is in Region Eight but the Smiths competed at Region Seven on a hardship clause: Salina is only five hours from Ouray).

"I thought, you know, it'll be a perfect opportunity for my daughter and me to show together," Cheryl said. "I never thought we'd be doing this! We're hauling together – show girls' weekend."

And show they did! At almost

every gate call for almost every class they could enter, either Cheryl or Skyler were ready to ride with big smiles on their faces. Actually, they were just one of several families at the show doing the same thing – showing horses together.

That's what Terri and the rest of the Region Seven Committee want to see: "When people walk in and look at the awards that are given away and the saddles, they think, 'Wow, I can win something nice. I want to do this! There were a lot of first-time people."

Terri is personally pleased with the way the committee came "together as a group and worked as one unit." She pointed out schedule changes they made, along with running an AQHA double-judged pointed show alongside the Region Seven.

"The schedule this year was exhibitor-friendly," Terry said. "The cattle people could come in and enjoy their two days and go on to the next event, and then the

all-around people, western and English, could come in. They moved in; it was easy, no rush.

"And having the option of having both sets of judges (for the AQHA pointed show and the Region Seven) in the arena at the same time, I think was a blessing," she added.

"With the economy the way it is, people being able to come and show to four judges helps, and in the format we have it is so much more relaxed and not rushed."

By the time the last entry went through the gate, the combined entries for the Regional Championship and the AQHA pointed show had swelled to more than 920 (unofficial at press time), up from last year.

"(The Regional Championship) is all about exhibitors enjoying their horses." 

■

AQHA Shows Most AOHA shows offer a variety of classes (English, Halter, Western) and divisions (youth, amateur, open) for competitors of different skill levels. Some shows may offer novice classes for the youth and arteur divisions and some offer the special Select classes for amateur exhibitors what every dears of age and older. Below are additional show formats which various show managements offer to meet

exhibitors needs.

Double Judged/Double Point ("DJ/DP") Want to earn points fast? Then a double judged/double point show might just be the ticket for you. This format features one show with two judges, meaning that your top placings could earn two sets of points without having to exhibit twice. Double judged/double point shows are primarily found at major livestock shows where there are a large number of exhibitors. The majority of exhibitors who attend these shows are highly competitive, so expect top-quality exhibitors and American Quarter Horse. Expect to pay two entry fees. Spirl/Combined ("S)C") Another efficient way for exhibitors to tack up more points is to attend a split/combined show. Any two consecutive shows (like a starturday and Sunday show) can be combined into one show and split over two days. There are two judges and two sets of points and the class is held only one- a real onus for exhibitors who are trying to qualify for the World Shows or earn year-end awards. Expect to pay two entry fees.

Special Events ("SpEr") Want to meet more people who show in the same event as you? A special event just might be the ticket. Versatility Ranch Horse Competition The Versatility Ranch Horse competition demonstrates the versatility of the working ranch horse and ranch conformation. To be eligible for points in the Versatility Ranch competition one riderione horse must enter all five classes. Credits will be applied per class according to the placing received based on the numbers of horses competition in that practicular class. AQHA must enter all twe classes. Credits will be applied per class according to the placing received based on the number of horses competing in that particular class. AQHA points are awarded based on the total earned credits from each class that determine the final placing. There is an open division for horses shown by the recorded owner or by immediate family members or shown by a full-time employee (six months or more). A Youth division also is offered to exhibitors 18 or younger (age as of January 1) as long as they are the recorded owner or exhibit a horse owned by their immediate family members. Youth exhibitors may show horses owned by a ranch where the exhibitor's family is a full-time employee (for six months or more). The Versatility Ranch Horse competition promotes the athletic ability and versatility of the horse.

AQHA Equestrians with Disabilities The Equestrians with Disabilities is for those who wish to compete regardless of their physical or mental abilities. The competition consists of three classes: walk and trot hunt seat equitation on the flat, walk and jog western horsemanship, and walk and jog trail.
