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More job discrimination cases head to court

Job losses in Idaho have not led to an increase in employment discrimination complaints, but some attorneys say the cut backs have facilitated a surge in complaints that end up in court.

Attorneys representing both sides of the disputes disagree on whether there's an uptick in cases that go forward in court. But most say both employers and former employees seem more likely to go to trial rather than settle complaints with state or federal moderators.

"I think you see it across the board ... a lot more cases are going into litigation and going into protracted litigation," said Thomas J. Lloyd III, an attorney with the Greener Burke Shoemaker firm in Boise.

For those who purport higher rates of actual litigation in employment cases, the reason is simple: times are tight. Both sides are working hard to make sure their payouts are more favorable.

Lloyd said corporations are holding tightly to their money due to the bad economy and former employees are finding a tough job market and increasingly relying on a payout.

"So it's conflict, a butting of the heads if you will, of increased expectations on the plaintiff's side and increased reluctance on the corporations side – and I think you'll see a lot of that in the employment context," he said.

In Idaho, employment discrimination complaints are required to go through the Idaho Human Rights Commission before they can be taken to court. The commission seeks to get participants to settle on an outcome, but will make a decision based on the complaint if no settlement is reached. Following the process, the person who filed the complaint can still go to district court whether they were on the winning or losing side of the commission's decision.

Federally, a similar process is filed with

Microloans are a savior for small business, a risk for lenders

Not all business loans need to be in the millions.

While big-budget lending for blockbuster real estate and building projects gets the attention, many small businesses only require a few thousand dollars to buy a piece of equipment or bolster operating capital.

In this arena, the business microloan is one of the only options considered non-predatory in the market. Almost entirely backed by nonprofits, microloan programs try to fill a gap that isn't considered profitable for commercial banks.

But microloans also come with significantly higher risk, as they cater to small business owners that often have little experience and a spotty credit history, if they have a

credit history at all.

In the Treasure Valley, two programs exist to help mostly minority businesses take a small step forward. Officials in both programs say they accept extra risk.

"We try to the best of our ability to make (loan) decisions on other factors than a typical bank, who would say,'No way, this is too risky and the credit score isn't high enough," said Sylvia Rojas, microloan committee chairwoman for the Idaho Hispanic Chamber of Commerce.

The Hispanic Chamber's program has been slow to emerge, giving out four loans since 2008 with the \$50,000 in seed money granted the program by Zion's bank. Rojas said that three of the loans were paid back early, but the fourth backfired.

Ada County district court records show that the Hispanic Chamber in August sued a Nevada man who had taken out a \$10,000 loan to help open a bakery in Idaho.

The man, Juan Gonzalez Jr. of Clark County, Nev., received the money in October 2010, but failed to make even the first scheduled debt payment of \$315 in November, according to the lawsuit. The Hispanic Chamber is suing for

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Tech Council tackles developer shortage

The Idaho Technology Council is taking the first steps toward tackling what local companies say is the biggest challenge in the industry: attracting more software developers.

Details remain thin, but officials with the ITC say they will try to raise about \$100,000 from local technology

companies for a marketing plan and major event, which they hope can lure software developers from all over the country into the valley.

Matt Rissell, CEO of TSheets and chairman of the Software Alliance, which operates under the ITC umbrella, said the "great big recruiting endeavor" will be a the top priority of the organization.

"We hope to be ready by the next

school year to have a fully baked out plan with events, targets, messaging and everything like that. I think if pulled off correctly, it will have an immediate impact on Idaho's ecosystem," Rissell said Sept. 7.

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Plasma donation company to build in Boise

BioLife Plasma Services is planning to open a multimillion dollar facility next summer on Eagle Road in Boise, the company announced Sept. 10.

BioLife, a subsidiary of the health care giant Baxter, pays people for plasma donations used in medical procedures.

The building will be built from scratch on the corner of North Eagle Road and Wainwright in Boise, according to a news release from the Boise Valley Economic Partnership.

Alex Johnson, the regional marketing representative for BioLife, said the company usually spends between \$3 million and \$6 million on new facilities, including the price of land. The Boise location does not have a set estimated price yet, he said.

The company expects to hire several nurses, business management professionals and line workers who not required to have degrees in the medical field, Johnson said.

Jana Jones, BVEP economic develop-

ment services director, said the company had originally approached her agency through a consultant more than three years ago, inquiring about labor force availability in the medical field and other demographic information.

The company had already purchased the land before backing away from the project several years ago to wait until the economy was more stable, she said.

Johnson said it usually takes the company three to five years to develop a new location.

Jennifer Gremmels, a spokeswoman for Baxter, BioLife's parent company, said the company came to Boise due to its demographics.

"In this case, the Boise community de-

mographics are similar to other communities where we have thriving centers," Gremmels said.

Specifically, the company usually builds in places with a high percentage of potential donors living nearby, she said. Their donors are usually between 20 and 35 years old, with an even split amongst men and women. Depending on various locations, college students can make up anywhere from 15 percent to 60 percent of their donor base, she said.

BioLife is eligible for workforce training funds from the Idaho Department of Labor and has been pursuing a contract, Jones said. There are no other incentives directly attached to the company's decision to open a location in Boise, she said.

In addition to the construction costs and eventual hiring of 50 employees, BioLife puts an extra \$1.5 to \$2 million per year into the local economy through payouts to plasma donors, Johnson said. The average payout is about \$200 per month for a donor, he said.

BioLife already has two Idaho facilities in Ammon and Coeur d'Alene.

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Eagle's Woodriver Cellars sold

Woodriver Cellars, a winery and events center in northwest Eagle, has new owners. Ron and Laurie Beckman, who moved to Eagle from southern California two years ago, bought the winery as well as a 38-acre vineyard in Eagle that grows the bulk of the winery's grapes. The Beckmans bought the winery in May and June from former owner Dave Buich, who has stayed on to work for the winery during the transition.

Buich, a real estate developer, said the new owners bring stability and business experience that should improve the fortune of the winery.

"I've had bad financial problems," Buich said. "At one time, I had a lot of projects going on, and I lost most of them. This business suffered because of it." Buich bought the winery in 2007, when it was called the Winery at Eagle Knoll.

"We're here, we're committed and we're stable," said Ron Beckman, a CPA who assisted firms in turnaround projects and mergers and acquisitions. "We lost a lot of business last year and this year because there were a lot of rumors about stability."

Woodriver Cellars markets itself as a venue for weddings and receptions. Bookings were down this summer compared to 2011, but Buich said next year is looking busy. There's also landscaping work being done to open a new event space called The Island.

The new owners are planning on keeping all their staff, including wine-

maker Neil Glancey, and could bring on new staff to help with events. The Beckmans are hoping to expand into corporate events and increase the number of concerts at the winery.

The Beckmans said other deals are in the works. They are considering adding overnight accommodations with up to 25 rooms and converting the large tent used for receptions into a building, though Ron Beckman said he wants to see how the business works for a year

before making more additions.

Laurie Beckman said the winery could also host ballroom dancing competitions inside the tent and book club meetings in the tasting room.

The winery is also close to a deal with a wine distributor to get Woodriver Cellars wines into more stores. Buich said most wine sales occur at the winery or to members of the wine club.

"The distributors are going to take us throughout the state and to neighboring states, and we have the capacity to do it," Buich said. Currently, the wine makes 5,500 cases a year, but Glancey

said they have the capability to double that output.

Financial terms of the deal weren't disclosed. Buich said he wants to get back to his former vocation.

"I'm a real estate developer. I really want to start developing again," Buich said.

Ron Beckman said he and his wife moved to Idaho without intending to get into the state's growing wine industry, but found a good opportunity with the

"We loved the facility and wine product," Beckman said.

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

An action plan on Trader Joe's

dahoans are vigorously courting Trader Joe's, the natural foods retailer with about 400 stores around the country.

The Facebook page dedicated to attracting a Trader Joe's to Boise recently hit 4,000 "likes."

The developers of the 500,000-square-foot CenterCal project in Meridian have been promoting their development to the retailer. They say they'd be honored to have Trader Joe's move in.

But like a shy maiden, Trader Joe's coyly deflects direct questions. Representatives for the company, which is based in Boston and California, won't reveal anything about Trader Joe's take on Boise (if there is one) except to say the Treasure Valley is not in the company's two- to three-year plan.

This hasn't deterred Jared Buff, 35, from trying to find out more. Buff keeps the Facebook campaign strong, stoking the hopes of Treasure Valleyites who share their Trader Joe's stories on the page. An association manager by day, Buff hopes all the love on Facebook will kindle Trader Joe's interest in Boise.

What is it about Trader Joe's, anyway? Why are Boiseans practically begging for a store?

I think it's the air of giddy delight that permeates the company's marketing. Trader Joe's is a large corporation with grocery stores all over the United States, but you wouldn't know it to walk through one. Products come in creative packaging, with fun names like "reduced guilt guacamole." Labels and guides ("for the culinarily curious") are illustrated with lighthearted sketches bearing a Monty-Pythonesque irreverence.

The food itself exotic, imaginative, artisanal, often organic, vegan, kosher, or gluten-free.

But great artisanal food can be found in the



Treasure Valley's ever-growing collection of health food and specialty food stores, such as the Boise Coop, Rosauers, and Natural Grocers by Vitamin Cottage. As most foodies are now aware, Whole Foods is opening a store downtown this year.

What Trader Joe's has, and those stores don't, is a quirky

air of fun. Sure, the air of fun is carefully calculated – the kind of fun that has been tested in front of focus in a corporate office, but it still makes rolling a cart through the aisles something of an adventure. The food is also affordable.

But it's time to face the fact that Trader Joe's isn't interested in Boise. Perhaps we just don't have the critical mass of foodies they need – or the critical mass, period.

So forget Trader Joe's. Someone else needs to start a quirky market that offers intelligent and humane nutritional and cooking narratives on its website

It's time for someone else to introduce a substitute for the famed Two Buck Chuck, a perfectly respectable wine beloved by many Trader Joe's fans. It's time for someone else to create a food store with labels and prose that appear to have been written by humans, not an office full of corporate communicators.

And it's time to stop talking about Trader Joe's on Facebook and bring that talk into the real world.

Find those Trader Joe's Facebook friends. Find out what they want that they're not getting at the other Boise-area food stores. And then start planning your store.

Future Boise store developer, wherever you are, you know you have your critical mass. Trader Joe's has organized that part for you.

For progress, think locally

s a commercial real estate broker who represents tenants in evaluating and securing office and industrial space, I am often asked what new companies are moving to the Boise area. It seems many people think the only way our business community will grow is if new companies move in.

I have worked in commercial real estate for 36 years. I spent my first 15 years in the business in Southern California. Back then I noticed the subtle change of that economy.

It went from being dependent on new companies moving in to spur growth, to generating its own growth internally through companies that were already established. It was a slow process that many missed, but it is worth noting, because a similar trend is happening in Boise.

In the late seventies and early eighties, Orange County was just starting to take off. Labor costs were lower than in Los Angeles, and the housing opportunities were generally more attractive due to the Irvine Ranch Company and their large master plan residential tracts.

Los Angeles was a much more expensive place to do business, and at that time, LA County itself was considered to be more antibusiness than its southern neigh-



bor. Orange County also had large tracts of undeveloped land (the original orange groves from which Orange County got its name), and both county and city officials welcomed growth and were easy to work with.

Added to that was quality of life. Los Angles' gangs, drug traffic, turf violence and the like, played in Orange County's favor.

Consequently, there was a steady migration of companies and people out of LA and into Orange County. This went on for years. It became the expected course of events.

Something started to change in the mid- to late-1980s. It was very subtle. By the late 1980s, most of the growth in Orange County was internally generated.

Companies that were established in Orange County were maturing and growing. They were using more space, and hiring more people.

Orange County's growth began to be generated from within its

own business community, not by new companies moving in. And finally, as Orange County grew, it eventually adopted the same antibusiness attitude as LA County.

Fortunately for Orange County, it has retained its business base, as there aren't many places for businesses to flee within California.

Does any of this sound familiar? Substitute Orange County for Boise, and LA County for so many other large cities and regions in the rest of the U.S., not to mention the entire state of California, and you start to recognize a similar scenario.

Boise, Meridian, Eagle, Nampa and Caldwell all have that same "come on in" attitude today that Orange County had so many years ago. And here in Idaho and Boise, we do see the occasional California-based company moving to our area. Our economy has definitely been the beneficiary of California's anti-business attitude.

Based on my experience and the history of Orange County, Boise and its surrounding areas are beginning to experience the same switch from looking at companies relocating here as a source of growth, to watching our local companies expand and grow.

I would be remiss if I didn't add

Employers: You're in the 'red zone'

ost employers don't even realize that they are smack-dab in the middle of the most dangerous time of year – the so-called "red zone." It refers to the months of August and September, the last two months in the federal government's fiscal year.

All of the federal agencies handle the close of the year differently, but the one that should be observed most closely is the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. That's because, just as the proverbial traffic cop seems to get more aggressive in handing out tickets at the end of the month to meet his quota, the employment watchdog agency usually files most of its discrimination lawsuits against employers at the close of its fiscal year.

In other words, if a company is going to get hit with an EEOC lawsuit this year, odds are good that it will happen any day now.

First things first. There are many ways that an adversarial situation with a disgruntled former or present employee could arise – a company could get hit with a union grievance, a wage-and-hour demand, a state agency discrimination charge, an attorney demand letter, an OSHA complaint, an NLRB unfair labor practice charge, or a tried-and-true civil lawsuit filed in court by a private attorney.

But the "red zone" can lead to a special type of challenge that may be the most fearsome of all – a lawsuit filed in federal court by the EEOC on behalf of one or more current or former employees. They are somewhat rare, at least in comparison to discrimination charges filed with the EEOC by employees. Whereas employees have filed more than 90,000 charges alleging workplace wrongdoings in each of the past four years, the EEOC itself has initiated litigation between 250 and 300 times each year during the same period.

However, the reason they are so rare is the reason they are so alarming. When a company is called to defend one of these claims, it is defending against the



full force of the federal government's aggressive corps of litigators whose sole purpose is to pursue such claims, champion the aggrieved employee, and receive some form of justice.

The EEOC usually doesn't stop at simply aiming for a monetary payout; it also consistently demands that the employer enter into a formal agreement called a "con-

sent decree" that requires it to jump through certain compliance hoops for a period of several years after the lawsuit is completed. When these pit-bull litigators get their teeth locked into a case, shaking them is not an easy task.

Last year, of the 261 lawsuits the EEOC filed against employers, 175 of them were filed in August and September – more than 67 percent of the total. It should come as no surprise that the busiest day of the year was Friday, Sept. 30, when 18 separate lawsuits were filed in one day.

Most legal analysts are predicting that this year, Friday, Sept. 28 (the last business day of the month) will be D-Day, with plenty of other lawsuits being filed in the preceding weeks. A quick search of records shows that August 2012 was a busy month for the agency, including several lawsuits filed against employers in the Pacific Northwest. In other words, 2012 is shaping up to be just as formidable as years past.

So, what can employers do to survive this difficult period? Unfortunately, there isn't much one can do at this point to avoid a lawsuit if one is in the pipeline. The good news is that EEOC lawsuits don't come out of nowhere – before any litigation is filed, an employer will have faced and defended an administrative charge. Also, it likely will have been invited to a "conciliation," which is a negotiation meeting or process to try to settle the matter before a lawsuit is filed.

However, an employer that is dealing with an EEOC claim right now should be aware that the odds of it

Dat Vuong and Kim Li, who had owned the popular restaurant on Franklin and Curtis, had sued Travelers Insurance after the company had alleged it cancelled the restaurant's fire insurance policy just months before the fire.

Kim and Li had alleged that they had assurances from their independent agent, Robert Schmidt, that the policy was still active. The court case revolved around whether Schmidt was an acting representative of Travelers during the process. Schmidt has since had his license to sell insurance revoked in Idaho.

Vuong and Li's attorney, Guy Hallam, confirmed that the case had been settled shortly before the jury had a chance to deliberate. He said the settlement amount was confidential, however.

The Vietnamese Restaurant was never reopened. Hallam has said that Vuong and Li did not have the insurance payout to rebuild or make repairs on the property.

Fruit farm putting refugees to work

Faced with persistent labor shortages, Symms Fruit Ranch in Canyon County tapped into a new source of workers, the region's refugee population.

Partnering with local refugee resettlement agencies, the fruit farm hired 135 refugees to work during its labor-intensive cherry picking season, making up 10 percent of its labor force.

More than 50 workers are still on the job picking pears, with harvest work picking fruit and vegetables likely to continue until the first week of November.

Jamie Mertz, one of the owners of Symms Fruit Ranch in the Sunny Slope area near Caldwell, said he hasn't had enough workers for years when cherries need to be picked.

In the past, due to a dip in available migrant workers, he's brought on workers from the Canyon County Sheriff's Office work release program.

"That's when I have a real big crunch," he said. "A lot of people just won't do it. I don't know if they think it's beneath them or what, but a lot of people won't do it."

Workers at the farm earn at least minimum wage, with piecemeal wages bringing more productive workers up to \$15 an hour or more, according to Mertz

He said he started reaching out to

southwestern Idaho's refugee community, including the Idaho Office for Refugees, last winter, telling potential workers about the jobs they could have during the summer.

Refugees can legally work in the U.S. as soon as they arrive. They are people coming to America from their home country due to fear of persecution.

The Symms Fruit Ranch work force was made up primarily of people from

Somalia, Burma, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Bhutan, Iraq, Rwanda and Afghanistan.

"Refugees come from all different backgrounds. Some were lawyers, teachers or doctors, all the way down to some were subsistence farmers," said Tara Wolfson, regional employment coordinator for the Idaho Office of Refugees.

She said other refugees are getting ingjobs.

janitorial or sewing work, and others are becoming certified nurse assistants.

"It's everything from entry level jobs to higher-level jobs," Wolfson said.

The office works with three resettlement groups in the region, World Relief, Agency for New Americans and International Rescue Committee, to help refugees relocate, which includes finding jobs

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Brew store selling White House recipe kit

If you want to drink what President Barack Obama drinks, Home Brew Stuff in Garden City has a kit for you. The White House on Sept. 1 released two recipes for beer brewed at the presidential residence. Home Brew Stuff co-owner Marcus Bezuhly said after a few requests, he put together a kit of all the ingredients.

The president mentioned the White House brews, a honey ale and honey porter, in 2011 and again on the campaign trail this year. Curious home brewers started petitions and sent requests for the recipes in August.

White House Chef Sam Kass said it may be the first instance of beer brewed at the White House, though President George Washington made beer and whiskey at his Mount Vernon estate and President Thomas Jefferson had vineyards at his estate, Monticello.

"You haven't heard much about beer in the White House since Jimmy Carter and Billy Beer," Bezuhly said.

The beer recipes include honey from the White House bee hive, which Home Brew Stuff hasn't been able to acquire. Otherwise, most of the ingredients, including hop pellets, malted barley and yeast, are available at most brewing supply stores. In addition to Home Brew Shop, Idaho has Brewer's Haven and Brew Connoisseurs in Boise, Nampa's Brewer's Center, Make Wine Make Beer in Coeur

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d'Alene, and L&D Brewshop in Idaho Falls.

"We have kits for every other kind of beer, so why not put one together?" Bezuhly said. He announced the kit in a newsletter on Sept. 5, and said he had seven orders in the first day, which is a good rate of interest for a beer-making kit. In addition to the ingredients, home brewers need equipment and containers to boil and ferment their beer, which Bezuhly said can cost \$150.

Bezuhly hasn't made either of the president's beer recipes yet.

"Looking at the recipe, I can surmise that the porter's going to be relatively light body, moderate alcohol, pretty roasty, but nothing too extreme," he said.

Idaho, a state with a strong Republican Party majority, may not have many fans of Obama's beer. But Bezuhly said online orders make up 85 percent of his business, so he could have customers in other states. He's gotten some customer emails from naysayers, though he said perhaps brewing beer is one area of common ground between the president and some Idahoans.

Bezuhly moved his shop from Oregon 18 months ago. He said that home brewing, as well as craft brewing, have seen increasing sales in recent years. The publicity from Obama only helps.

"It's great for our industry. While everything else has been tanking, the homebrew and specialty beer industry has been up, up, up," Bezuhly said.

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NLRB looks closely at at-will agreements

In most American workplaces, at-will employment clauses in employee handbooks and agreements are as common as break room water coolers.

But recent cases brought by the National Labor Relations Board alleging that some at-will policy agreements violate federal law have employers and their attorneys on alert.

They claim that the decisions demonstrate an effort by the NLRB to flex its enforcement muscle by expanding into an area that affects both unionized and non-unionized workplaces.

"They have gotten much more aggressive," said Margaret A. McCausland, a lawyer in Pennsylvania. "We are seeing much more of a spillover into non-union workforces with some of these rulings that we have not seen in the past."

McCausland is advising her clients to review their employment handbooks, particularly the at-will acknowledgments, which companies typically require employees to sign upon hiring or adoption of new employee agreements.

In such acknowledgments, employees affirm that the employment relationship can be ended by either party at any time.

But recent cases brought by the NLRB have challenged language that broadly restricts the situations under which that relationship could be changed. Those rulings have employers and their attorneys concerned that they could be open to unanticipated liability.

"It's very common to have that kind

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of language" in an at-will acknowledgement, said attorney Stephen W. Lyman of Indianapolis. "Because it's so common, the recent flurry of activity by the NLRB attacking or challenging this kind of language really seems to be an attempt to change the playing field."

At-will pacts chilling employee rights?

Two recent NLRB cases have drawn widespread attention from the employment defense bar.

American Red Cross Blood Services and Lois Hampton stemmed from an unlawful termination claim brought by an employee and the NLRB. The worker alleged that she crossed out an at-will provision in the employment handbook, which required workers to "agree that the at-will employment relationship cannot be amended, modified or altered in any way," before signing it. Later, after several altercations with her supervisor, she was terminated.

An administrative law judge found that the policy in question violated the worker's right to engage in concerted activity for the purpose of changing her at-will employment status, which is protected under the National Labor Relations Act.

"It is axiomatic that Section 7 of the Act gives employees the right to communicate with each other regarding their wages, hours, and working conditions," the judge wrote in the ruling. "Further, the Board has consistently held that the communication between employees 'for non-organizational protected activities

are entitled to the same protection and privileges as organizational activities."

In a second case, Hyatt Hotels Group and Unite Here International Union, the union and the NLRB challenged an atwill acknowledgment that read in part:

"I understand my employment is 'at will.' ... I acknowledge that no oral or written statements or representations regarding my employment can alter my at-will status, except for a written statement signed by me and either Hyatt's Executive Vice-President/Chief Operating Officer or Hyatt's President."

The NLRB asserted that a policy violates the NLRA if an employee could reasonably interpret it as prohibiting or chilling the exercise of his or her rights under Section 7 of the act.

The case was resolved in a settlement between the parties, so it has no direct precedential effect. But the complaint demonstrated a new focus by NLRB officials on at-will policies they consider to be overly broad.

Meanwhile, in June the board launched a new page on its website focused on informing employees of their right to engage in protected concerted activity under the act, leading some employment attorneys to believe the recent rulings are part of a policy shift within

Overbroad policies and 'self preservation'

While attorneys say that the recent NLRB actions do not suggest that at-will employment relationships are in peril, they do show that written policies and agreements that are drafted in a way that can be interpreted as overbroad could be the subject of a challenge.

But it is unclear just what the board and its regional officials consider overbroad.

"It's hard for me to follow what the NLRB is going after," Lyman said. "It seems to me that [the board] can pick and choose phrases out of the contract and decide that it chills employees' right to engage in concerted activity."

The NLRB took a similar approach with its recent actions involving the use of social media policies, he said. But despite the flurry of cases in that area, lawyers and employers were left in the dark about what kind of policy could run afoul of the NLRA in the board's view until the board issued three lengthy reports on social media policies to give some guidance.

With at-will policies, no such guidance yet exists.

One reason for the new focus could be the changing face of America's unionized workforce.

"Intuitively, it's not hard to figure out that union membership is on the decline," said Michael Anderton, who practices in Cleveland. "So potentially, the things that might be handled and processed by the board and its employees might also be on the decline. This new focus might be a little bit of selfpreservation on the part of the NLRB."

Whatever the reason behind the shift, the best defense is prevention, attorneys say. Employers who make a practice of reviewing employment handbook policies every couple of years to ensure compliance with federal law may want to consider doing so more frequently.

But even employers who do not take that step should avoid the low-maintenance approach to employee handbooks: downloading an exemplar from the Internet and simply plugging in the com-

"I've always counseled my clients against that," McCausland said. "While it has always been a bad idea, it's especially a bad idea now."

New coach, and soon a new logo, for D-League Stampede

The Idaho Stampede, Boise's minor league professional basketball team, tapped one of the most successful high school programs for its new head coach.

Michael Peck, the coach for the Findlay College Prep Program in Henderson. Nev., replaces Randy Livingston, who had coached the Stampede since 2010 and previously played for the National Basketball Association D-League franchise.

The coaching pick, like all other onthe-court decisions, was made by the NBA's Portland Trail Blazers, which have a single affiliate relationship with the Stampede. The Stampede's local staff controls non-basketball operations, including a new logo for the team that will be unveiled Sept. 17.

Peck coached at Findlay Prep for five seasons, amassing a 157-8 record, which included no home losses and several national number one rankings. Peck and Findlay Prep produced four NBA draft picks in 2010 and 2011, including Tristan Thompson, the fourth overall pick in the 2011 draft. The team's games have been shown on ESPN, including winning the cable network's National High School Invitational three out of the past four years.

Stampede games are broadcast online.

"This is a great opportunity with a wonderful organization," Peck said in a news release. "I'm looking forward to the opportunity ahead of me."

"Obviously, his record speaks for itself. In addition, he has proven he can develop players of NBA caliber and we look forward to him bringing future success to the Idaho Stampede," said Stampede Managing Investor Bill Ilett.

The Stampede coaching decision comes after the Blazers hired Terry Stotts as their new head coach last month.

Stampede spokesman Travis Tate said Livingston does not currently have a coaching job, though there are other D-League and NBA coaching spots open. The Stampede retired Livingston's number as a player. He played on the team's championship-winning team in 2008.

The Stampede will start their search for players soon, holding open tryouts in Portland and Boise at the end of September. The D-League is expected to hold its draft in early November, after which coaches and management will set a roster. The team could pick up players cut by the Blazers during their training camp. The D-League season opens in late November, with the Stampede's first home game at CenturyLink Arena set for Dec. 7.



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A cyclical business rolls into Meridian

Go Epic Indoor Cycling will open the first exercise studio in the Treasure Valley dedicated solely to indoor cycling, offering classes on stationary bikes for cyclists who want to get out of bad weather or non-cyclists who want some exercise.

While most of the area's gyms offer cycling class, with some under the trademarked term Spinning, owner Shauna Brookshier hopes her Meridian studio's use of technology and focused training appeals to hardcore cyclists as well as people looking for a short, social workout.

The studio will open Sept. 25 with 20 stationary bikes, with room to expand to 36 bikes. Brookshier,who has taught classes and cycled in the region for years,said she hopes to have 20 classes per week by January.

The studio will use new bikes that track users' workouts and has a setup to offer simulated rides of outdoor trips, using videos. The studio will also offer yoga classes geared specifically for cyclists, targeting areas of the body where cyclists can tighten up or lose flexibility.

Brookshier said Go Epic should appeal to cyclists who can't easily train during wet and snowy weather in Boise, as well as infrequent outdoor riders who want a low-impact workout.

"A lot of people that do indoor cycle don't use the rest of the components of a gym," she said. The studio, located on Fairview Avenue near Eagle Road, will charge for individual lessons but offer bulk discounts and monthly passes, much like a yoga studio.

Brookshier said the studio could be a cyclical business, with more riders during bad weather months and fewer in the dry season.


"They can cycle all winter and train," she said. "Then come summer, there's no commitment to stay."

Meridian Cycles owner Paul McKenna said the sophisticated bikes and shelter from winter weather could be an enticing pairing for enthusiast riders.

"Around here, it gets to a point where you just can't ride in January and most of February," McKenna said. "Most avid cyclists will switch to something indoors just because it's easier than trying to ride outdoors when it's 20 to 30 degrees outside."

Steve Stuebner, the author of guide books on cycling and outdoor activities, said opening the studio outside Boise was smart.

"There's quite a few places where you can go spin in Boise, including some of the fitness clubs and the YMCA," he said. "Meridian really is a hard place to ride anyway. They don't have that much bike-friendly area. Especially in the winter, that would be a great thing."



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Idaho tax revenues short for second straight month



Idaho has started its fiscal year on a slightly down note, with state tax revenues below projections for both July and August. August tax collections were \$2.3 million short of projections. Two months in, the state is \$5.7 million below projections, which is 1.3 percent off the pace of the \$426 million expected in tax money. State officials say it's early in the budget year, with plenty of time for revenues to rebound.

All areas of tax collections were above expectations, except individual income taxes, which were \$6.9 million below.

Sales tax collections, were \$2.5 million above the forecast in August after being down in July. Corporate income taxes were \$1.7 million above projections and are also positive for the first two months of the fiscal year.

"We're still in somewhat of a slow and soft recovery," said Jon Hanian, spokesman for Gov. C.L. "Butch" Otter.

The \$197.6 million in taxes Idaho collected in August is 3.7 percent higher than the amount collected last

Real estate claims top Bar Association malpractice list

For the first time since the American Bar Association began conducting surveys of legal malpractice



insurance claims in 1985, insurers have reported a higher percentage of claims involving real estate than any other area of law.

Personal injury-plaintiff and family law round out the top three areas in the "Profile of Legal Malpractice Claims: 2008-2011," released Sept. 7 by the ABA Standing Committee on Lawyers' Professional Liability. In all five previous versions of the survey, personal injury-plaintiff matters had been No. 1 in generating lawyer malpractice claims.

Eleven member insurers of the National Association of Bar-Related Insurance Companies from the U.S. and nine from Canada contributed data to the study, along with eight commercial insurance companies. Insurers provided data on 53,000 claims for the 2011 study, the most ever.

The type of activity most likely to generate claims was "preparation, filing, and transmittal of documents."

Boise Chamber sets preliminary priorities for 2013 Legislature

Unfinished business from years past and carryover business top a draft of priorities for the Boise Metro Chamber of Commerce for the 2013 legislative session. Creating for a state-run health insurance exchange and repealing Idaho's personal property tax, two issues that received a lot of discussion in 2012 but no formal legislation, are on the list, as is support for a new \$5 million to \$10 million deal-closing fund that the state could spend to encourage businesses to expand or move to Idaho.

The Chamber released its priorities at a legislative summit on Sept. 6. The Idaho Chamber Alliance, which represents 22 chambers across the state, is holding meetings across the state to form its priorities.

The Boise Chamber also supports ongoing funding for the Idaho Global Entrepreneurial Mission, created this year with \$5 million in initial funding for universities and business grants, and maintaining the state's urban renewal legislation.

The chamber supports the Central Valley Expressway, a proposed extension to connect Highway 16 in western Ada County to Interstate 84. There isn't funding for the road project, though bonding and taxing district models are being circulated.

Ray Stark, senior vice president for government and community relations for the chamber, said the draft of priorities was largely past top issues that lawmakers didn't address. The chamber will review other potential legislative issues before releasing its final list of priorities.

No discrimination for transgendered employees

Employers and insurers may no longer deny health plans to transgendered individuals, according to the Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Civil Rights.

The Affordable Care Act prohibits such discrimination, the agency said in a recent letter.

The letter, sent to Maya Rupert, the national policy director for the National Center for Lesbian Rights, was in response to a request clarifying whether sex-based discrimination was covered under Section 1557 of the Act.

"We agree that Section 1557's sex discrimination prohibition extends to claims of discrimination based on gender identity or failure to conform to stereotypical notions of masculinity or femininity," according to the letter.

The agency said it is accepting – and investigating – complaints filed under Section 1557.

The letter follows an April ruling from the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, when the agency held that transgendered workers can bring employment bias claims under Title VII.

Some courts – including the 3rd Circuit – have reached similar conclusions.

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
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

Finally done After sitting unfinished for several years, Idaho Falls' newest hotel welcomes visitors

Nearly six years after the original developers broke ground, Idaho Falls' Marriott Residence Inn has opened in a changed market.

The five-story, extended-stay hotel is the first major lodging development in Idaho Falls since the economic slowdown of 2008. Situated by the Snake River, not far from the stagecoach crossing where Idaho Falls was born in 1865, the project is estimated to have cost more than \$20 million.

"We think it's a good bet for the market," said John Brunt of Woodbury Corp., the Salt Lake City development company that took over the project last year.

The project was begun in 2006 by Rollie and Lorin Walker, who had seen it as a key piece of their Taylor Crossing on the River project, a mixed-use development on 40 acres of land on the river's western bank. The Walkers' company, McNeil Development, ran into trouble in 2008 after the collapse of Arkansas National Bank, from which it had borrowed money.

With the financial trouble came liens from subcontractors and legal action from creditors. Work on the hotel only began again this year, after Woodbury took on all the project's obligations. This is the company's 10th hotel.

"It's well located; there was a lot of value that had been created. It made sense financially to come in and finish it," Brunt said.

At the same time the Marriott Residence Inn was being built, Ball Ventures was building its \$14 million, 119-room Hilton Garden Inn on Lindsay Boulevard. That hotel opened in March 2008. Another company, Ball Management, had begun an 82-unit Candlewood Suites hotel, also on the Snake River but on Idaho Falls' south side.

After the economy started going downhill in 2007, lodging sales slowed from a high of \$29.5 million in 2008.

Lodging sales in Bonneville County dropped to \$26.5 million in 2009 and \$28 million in 2010, the years the Residence Inn stood vacant and unfinished. Between July 1, 2010, and June 30, 2011, lodging sales came back to more than \$32

million, giving hope to operators in the market.

Brunt said that when the Residence Inn project was empty, it was enclosed and secure, keeping it safe from weather damage and vandals. Nevertheless, between 2008 and 2012 Marriott's design standards for rooms and common areas changed, which meant they couldn't pick up exactly where things left off.

It's not clear what effect the new hotel will have on the local lodging market. The hotel has five floors with 108 suites, and one meeting room. What the new hotel is likely to do to the lodging market is anyone's guess.

Because of Idaho Falls' proximity to Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks, summer is a strong season for lodging. During the recession, people have tended to travel close to home, said Robb Chiles, executive director of the Greater Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce. More people from surrounding states have been visiting, which may account for the stable if not stellar numbers in 2009 and 2010.

Given its newness and its location, Chiles (whose wife, Aubyn, is general

manager of the Hotel on the Falls, formerly the Red Lion) said he expects the new Marriott Residence Inn to do well.

"It will be interesting to see whether it brings in new revenue or just takes away from other hotels in the area," he said.

Chuck Everett, operations manager for Ameritel Inn, which owns the recently rebranded Hampton Inn on Lindsay Boulevard, said he sees the new Residence Inn as "a definite game changer."

"It's a beautiful hotel in a prime location. I anticipate it will get a lot of attention," he said.

Scott George, Woodbury's director of lodging operations, said the tourist trade is important, but Woodbury is also looking for businesspeople who might stay three or four months at a time. He said the company would like to see the Residence Inn's extended stay population exceed 40 percent.

The Residence Inn offers services such as complimentary grocery shopping.

"Our staff really gets to interact," George said. "If you have someone who stays for six months, everybody gets to know each other pretty well."

New Simplot headquarters planned next to JUMP

The J.R. Simplot Co. will move its headquarters to a new 10-story building on the same downtown Boise site as the Simplot family's Jack's Urban Meeting Place.

More than 900 employees for the food and agribusiness company, most of whom work in Boise, will move to the new 300,000-square-foot tower, which could open as early as late 2015.

The JUMP project, located between Ninth, Myrtle, Front and 11th streets in Boise, includes a 65,000-square-foot building, a park, outdoor amphitheatre and an underground parking garage.

The four-block site has additional space for buildings, including the new Simplot headquarters, Simplot spokesman David Cuoio, said Sept. 7.

The JUMP project is set to open in the summer of 2014. Simplot will start construction on the new Simplot office tower in late 2013 at the earliest.

Cuoio said there aren't full details yet for the new Simplot building, and that while Boise city officials are aware of the project, no formal steps have been taken, including submitting plans or seeking permits.

"The decision had been made to move forward," Cuoio said. "We've learned that trying to keep something like this under wraps is difficult."

The new building will be the work home for Simplot's Treasure Valley employees,

who now use leased space at One Capital Center on Main Street in downtown Boise and the company's Food Group headquarters on Federal Way.

Employees will use the 500-space underground parking garage on the JUMP site, which will be open to the public during non-business hours.

Cuoio said the company had been talking about consolidating its headquarters, and the JUMP site made sense for a new location.

"When the JUMP property started to take shape, someone here at corporate thought that it could be an option for a headquarter site," he said.

Simplot President and CEO Bill Whitacre said in a news release that the company hopes to benefit by bringing many of its employees under one roof.

"This consolidation will strengthen our culture of innovation and offer better opportunities for our personnel to leverage their wide range of talents and expertise in a more collaborative work space," Whitacre said.

The companies working on JUMP, builder Hoffman Construction and design company Adamson Associates, will take the same roles on the new Simplot head-quarters.

Whitacre said the company is planning to find new tenants to occupy its 75,000-square-foot Food Group building and will help the owners of One Capital Center find a new tenant.

fill available positions. In the past three months, there have been 1,200 software jobs available in the Treasure Valley, said Jay Larsen, ITC president.

Rissell said the marketing strategy is still up in the air until the ITC can gather more data about available jobs and other industry-specific information it can sell to prospective engineers.

"We have some of it, but it's loose. We have soft data and we need hard data," Rissell said. "We don't have a clear idea of what (developers) would be doing, so we can't sell it if we don't know what 'it' is."

Larsen said that until this initiative, there had been no concerted effort by any group to lure more developers to the region. Companies, however, have been spending tens of thousands of dollars per year to try to attract talent to fill the void

Jason Crawforth, an investor and former CEO of Treetop Technologies, said his former company has spent more than \$100,000 trying to bring software engineers in from other, more established, technology-friendly cities.

Crawforth, who has been advocating a marketing approach to lure people to the Treasure Valley for years, called the early plan a step in the right direction, but warned that any efforts need to be sustained over time to be effective.

Larsen said the initial spending of the program will be evaluated and tweaked to make sure any marketing strategies garner the best returns, but he said the plan is to make it a "longterm initiative."

He argues that the third-party approach to recruitment, as opposed to individual companies doing the legwork, will have better results. Larsen said one company can't give the same pitch as the ITC, which will focus on Idaho's broad foundation of companies and jobs for software engineers.

The goal is to create the perception that Idaho can support software engineers indefinitely, even if the job that initially brought them to Idaho isn't what they want long-term.

"If something happens where it doesn't work out, where can they land? ... If you look at Idaho right now, the perception would be that we have a very narrow pyramid," Larsen said.

Rissell said putting together an event to fly out as many developers to Idaho as possible will help with one of the Treasure Valley's biggest selling points: the community itself.

Larsen said the perception that Idaho has software development jobs to suit everyone's tastes, coupled with the traditional selling points of the Treasure Valley's low crime rate, high sunshine rate and numerous recreational activities, will make the difference in the way the rest of the country views the area's technology industry.

The hold of the area was evident this year after Microsoft, one of the most prestigious and highest-paying companies for software engineers, relocated its Boise developers to company headquarters in Redmond, Wash.

Lou Gellos, a Microsoft spokesman, confirmed that of the 24 people whose jobs were relocated, only 12 decided to move and stay with the company. The remaining 12 decided to stay in Boise, many of them taking pay cuts to work for other local companies, a former Microsoft software engineer told the *Idaho Business Review*.

Larsen expects the typical recruit to be someone who appreciates Idaho's landscapes, bike-friendly city and greenbelt culture.

"You aren't trying to attract somebody specifically that has this great idea of living in the inner city of San Francisco or New York, you want to get somebody that loves the outdoors," he said.

Hawks extend deal with Chicago Cubs to 2014

The Chicago Cubs will keep sending prospects to the Boise Hawks for another two years. The two teams announced Sept. 12 that they extended their player development contract through 2014.

There had been concerns that inadequate facilities, including the small, aging Memorial Stadium in Garden City, could lead the Cubs to leave, though Hawks' President and General Manager Todd Rahr said that idea was sensationalized.

"I think it was overblown, but I think what they've shown us is they believe in the progress we're making," Rahr said.

Rahr said the new player development agreement doesn't include any required renovations, though Memorial Stadium could use an improved locker room, dugout and training facilities, and better amenities for fans. The team is planning some improvements to the stadium during the off-season, though Rahr wouldn't reveal specifics.

"We can't rule out doing some things that would raise revenue," Rahr said. He said the team is also working on efforts to build a new stadium.

Rahr said that while Memorial Stadium could be improved, Boise has many advantages for the Cubs, including the Hawks' host family program and direct flights between Boise and Phoenix, near the Cubs' training facility.

The Hawks ended their season Sept. 9, losing in the Northwest League Championship series to the Vancouver Canadians.

all the principal, legal fees, interest and court costs – more than \$13,000.

Rojas, who does commercial lending at Capital Matrix in Boise, said she steps outside the training used for her day job to apply a different kind of due diligence for microloans. The three-member committee that approves loans often has to go out and see the business operation, rather than rely solely on credit scores and tax returns – although those still play a part in approval.

"A lot of it is based on a little bit of risk and a little bit of faith," she said.

Samir Busuladzic, loan coordinator for Mountain States Group's MicroEnterprise Training and Assistance – or META – microloan program, said his program is very careful with its lending practices. The program's primary goal is to help people start businesses, not make money.

He said the loans often either establish an important credit history for a business, or re-establish credit after a foreclosure or other blemish. Setting up a business to go into default defeats the entire purpose, he said.

"The last thing we want is to lend money to someone who cannot afford the loan," Busuladzic said. "In that respect, we are trying to be very careful."

The META program, which is more established than the Hispanic Chamber's program, makes about one loan a week with money collected from various federal agencies to help refugees, women, minorities and "green" businesses.

To alleviate some risk, the META program requires people who have been operating their business for less than a year to take a training course on business plans. The program also offers technical assistance for any

Big boost for small biz

The most common use of microloans is to buy a small amount of equipment for a burgeoning business, loan officials said.

Common examples included vehicles, steam cleaners for carpet, restaurant supplies and software to streamline business organization.

But other uses abound, such paying for business-related classes like accounting, inventory expansion and even just for more day-to-day operating capital.

Any business, regardless of industry, is eligible, including those with spotty credit histories. However, companies can be denied if they can't show an ability to pay back the loan or have major credit issues like tax liens.

business owner who would like to learn, Busuladzic said. META also takes clients who would likely not be eli-

META also takes clients who would likely not be eligible for a bank loan. Busuladzic said the program's default rate is about 5 percent.

Kevin Learned, a counselor with the Small Business Development Center at Boise State University, said that access to capital, even in low amounts like the microloan programs, is essential for small businesses. If that access isn't accompanied by strong business knowledge or experience, however, it's worthless, he said.

Good microloan programs are hands-on affairs that

help business owners with more than money, he said.

"What makes them really work is that they are accompanied by very significant assistance and training," said Learned, whose company helped finance a microloan program in Ecuador.

The Hispanic Chamber's program requires consultant training and business plans to go along with its loan evaluations. And Rojas said she believes the program will have an acceptable default rate, if it can attract more businesses to apply for a loan.

Typical Hispanic Chamber clientele don't usually hear about the loans available, Rojas said.

"They don't go out and do a lot of borrowing. They may not know what is out there or maybe they have always paid cash," Rojas said. Yet access to just a few thousand dollars can sometimes mean the difference between keeping the doors of a business open and having it close.

Subuladzic said the META program is also underused. He said microloans offer significant advantages to other options small business owners have traditionally used, but owners don't know about their options.

He said a small business owner not eligible for a traditional bank loan will often take a personal credit card instead.

Credit cards usually have a higher interest rate, as microloans in Idaho are about 4 percent above the prime rate – or generally between 7.25 and 9.25 percent.

Business owners also have a harder time writing off business expenses on their tax returns if paid for with a personal credit card, he said. Finally, he said, a credit card does not establish the same type of credit history for a business as a microloan does. the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

Nationally, the effects of the recession and a high unemployment rate show up in statistics. The EEOC jumped from about 75,000 complaints in 2006 to 95,000 in 2008. In 2011, there were more than 99,000 complaints, according to EEOC data. Since 1997, the complaints had held generally steady between 75,000 and 80,000 complaints per year, with a jump to 85,000 in 2002, a year in which the economy faltered following the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attack.

In Idaho, however, complaints to the Human Rights Commission have remained steady. Human Rights Commission administrator Pamela Parks said Idaho only has records back to fiscal year 2008, which would include half of 2007. In fiscal year 2012, there were 491 complaints, down from 524 the year before. Other fiscal years have hovered around 500, with the lowest in 2010 at 480 complaints.

Still, attorneys are reporting that the employment cases are requiring more work and going farther into the court system than before, although there is no mechanism to measure that.

"There can be an impression, there can be a feeling, there can even be a reality that the activity is increasing; you just can't track it," Lloyd said.

Guy Hallam, an attorney with the law firm Kormanik Hallam & Sneed, said despite the increase in layoffs around Idaho in recent years, his firm has not seen more complaints.

"I don't think it has really gone up that much," he said. "I think you would expect it. I just don't know that our practice has confirmed it." Jason Monteleone, an employment attorney at Johnson & Monteleone in Boise, said he has seen employment cases heading to court more often than not. He said a big reason is the downturn in the economy and another is that employers are steering clear of mediation through groups like EEOC and the Human Rights Commission.

He said that in hard times, it can be beneficial to drag out the process in court, even if the administrative agencies have ruled against a company. He said there isn't anything unethical about going to court and having a full-throated defense, but that process doesn't help former employees becoming more desperate for relief.

"To offer an educated guess, it's that the longer a large corporation can have an aggrieved employee wait for any financial recovery, the less they have to pay," he said.

Lloyd said that Idaho may not be seeing as many complaints as other parts of the country because it has not altered its employment laws in many years. Some local governments in other states have started adding protections for gay and lesbian workers, as well as gender-identity discrimination.

"We haven't seen much of that in Idaho, which can be one explanation why you don't see an uptick in Idaho numbers, whereas you are seeing that elsewhere throughout the country," Lloyd said.

Monteleone said Idaho has been seeing more cases of military discrimination, especially as more soldiers return from duty in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Other than military discrimination, most companies in Idaho have not had to make any adjustments to newer laws that have affected other parts of the country, he said.

Idaho companies should tread carefully

Employers have a large amount of leeway in Idaho when choosing their workforce, but there are still some basic mistakes companies should watch out for when terminating an employee.

No reason is needed to fire an employee in Idaho – a popular saying is that an employer can fire someone for not liking the color of his tie. Still, federal and state statutes do forbid firing people for certain reasons, including gender, race, disability and military service discrimination.

It is up to the employees to prove that they lost their jobs for those reasons. Juries can and will side with an employee fired under suspicious circumstances.

Thomas J. Lloyd III, an attorney who practices employment law, said the biggest mistake companies often make is freewheeling internal communications that can harm them in court. He said that emails, memos and other written communications are often not written effectively enough to properly clarify why an employee is being fired and can be construed as prejudicial toward the employee.

"People tend to have a sense of invisibility or invincibility when it comes to the quick methods of communication, the quick ways of sentiment that we have with modern technology," he said. "Before the case even starts you may have sunk your own ship."

Age can be another issue. Many companies, especially those in creativity and technology fields, will automatically favor their younger employees when looking at layoffs. A pattern of firing older employees over the younger can get companies in trouble.

To prevent mistakes, companies should follow changes in state and federal employment laws, he said. Upticks in complaints for discrimination often follow changes to those laws that companies are unaware of.

For example, in the past few years Congress clarified definitions to the Americans with Disabilities Act, a piece of legislation that made it easier to prove that an illness like bipolar disorder is a disability that is protected when terminating an employee.

Lloyd said new laws often are followed by an increase in lawsuits because companies are "trying to adjust to a new landscape and it always takes time doing that and there will always be mistakes made along the way."

a comment from Brenda Sherwood, economic development administrator for the Meridian Mayor's Office, "Statistics have shown companies already located in a city usually account for nearly 80 percent of all job growth."

So who are they now? Which Boise-based companies are expanding? Who will be our new Albertsons, Morrison Knudson and Ore-Ida? Here's my short list of growing local companies.

At the top is BodyBuilding.com, Boise's online retailer and manufacturer of sports supplements and nutritional products. This company had been expanding 20 percent to 30 percent for the last five years. Bodybuilding.com is now part of Liberty Interactive, which was split off from Liberty Media last September.

Scentsy is another company to keep an eye on. All you need to do is visit their corporate campus in Meridian to see growth in its purest form. Started less than ten years ago, Scentsy has become one of the fastest-growing companies in the United States, recently landing on *Forbes Magazine*'s list of America's Most Promising Companies.

In the last five years, Clearwater Analytics has added staff and increased their office footprint downtown. Clearwater is a foundational example of an Idaho success story, starting with its launch in Boise in 2004. Today, the company reports on more than \$650 billion in assets (from clients such as Google, Ora-

cle, Cisco, Yahoo and others).

Keynetics is a quiet, but not little, company whose website boasts annual revenues over \$300 million per year. This makes them the largest (by revenue), privately held tech company in Idaho. Keynetics had its start in a San Diego garage in 1998. Based on the recommendation of a founding board member, Keynetics soon relocated to Boise. Today the company has two operating subsidiaries, ClickBank and Kount, and is headquartered in downtown Boise.

United Financial Group is headquartered in Meridian. According to their website they do business in 36 states, with plans to add ten more states over the next several years. Their last annual report stated that their combined premiums (United Heritage Life Insurance Co., United Heritage Property & Casualty Co. and Sublimity Insurance Co.) were a record \$101 million, and their combined operating income was a record \$10.9 million.

Balihoo is another Boise-based information technology company expected to double in size over the next several years. Founded in 2004 in Boise, and averaging nearly 300 percent revenue growth for two consecutive years, Balihoo employs over 50 people in downtown Boise, and counts Geico, Kohler and Aflac among their clients.

One more is Inovus Solar, a lighting manufacturer that provides solar-LED lighting and solar

streetlights worldwide. This impressive company has filed 22 patents, installed systems in 11 countries, and created an industry, solely designing and manufacturing its products in Idaho. Inovus has grown approximately 300 percent over the past year and is projected to continue at that rapid rate.

What about education and health care? They, too, are growing segments of our economy.

According to Jana Jones, director of economic development services for the Boise Valley Economic Partnership, the College of Western Idaho is the fastest-growing community college in the country and is anticipating its 2012-2013 enrollment to exceed 10,000 students.

Look for the college to open its 170, 000-square-foot technology training center soon.

In healthcare, St. Luke's Health System is the state's largest employer, and Saint Alphonsus is one of the largest employers in the Boise area. Both are growing.

I'm sure I've missed a few. I welcome your comments. We have some world class entrepreneurs in our midst; the Treasure Valley's innovative, hard-working business leaders are our biggest asset.

blooming into a full-fledged lawsuit are greatest in the coming weeks. If an EEOC claim is pending, but a labor attorney has not been consulted yet, get him or her on the phone right now to discuss the matter.

There's no reason to think that 2013 will be any different, so to avoid being in the EEOC firing line, start planning now. The best way to cover all the bases is to have a comprehensive workplace audit conducted by a labor attorney to ensure that best practices are being employed in all areas. Short of that, there are common weaknesses that can be shored up in a relatively painless way.

Employers should have their hand-books reviewed and updated to capture the most up-to-date trends and regulations. Managers should receive annual training on employment law compliance, and freshen up their documentation and management skills. All employees should receive thoughtful and thorough performance reviews in order to apprise them of any weaknesses and to document trouble spots.

And most importantly, if any complaints are received from employees, immediately investigate the situation, document efforts accordingly and discipline any offending employees.

How to fail as a boss

You may think you're the smartest person in the room, but it's almost guaranteed you're not. And holding the title of "boss" doesn't mean you have the right to act like a dictator. Besides, a bully mentality might impress a few people for a while, but when the dust settles, people see the truth.

I've heard a few too many horror stories lately about people in management positions displaying overbearing attitudes of superiority.

Their employees (and former employees) describe them as snarky bullies, aloof or condescending jerks.

Regardless of the moniker, employee morale under such bosses is usually in the toilet and people are quitting (or being fired) in droves. Not exactly a model of workplace excellence.

There are several ways to view such bosses. First is that they're genuine jerks who've managed to manipulate the system and climb on the backs of people to get to the top. I wrote about this in the first chapter of Creating Passion-Driven Teams, because if people insist on being this way, there's no way they're going to build a passion-driven team.

Another way to view such people is that they're trying to succeed, but they've never learned any other method of managing.

In interviews with overbearing bosses, it's commonly discovered that their own bosses displayed similar styles, and upon receiving a promotion to management, these people simply adopted the style that was modeled for them early in their

Although some bosses consciously choose to be overbearing and don't care about being seen as a jerk, some are unaware of the wake they leave behind them.

In either case, let's consider how you might be failing as a boss, and what you might do to reverse that

Humiliation

You are failing as a boss when you humiliate employees in front of other employees.

Whether it's done behind their back or with the target employee standing right there, publicly humil-

Health reform a 'moving target' for employers

Since the Supreme Court upheld the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act in June, businesses across Idaho have been adapting to a changed health care landscape and preparing for even bigger transformations.

A few major changes are in store for 2014. Among them is a mandate that employers with more than 50 full-time equivalent employees offer health insurance benefits.

The Arc of Boise, a nonprofit that helps people who have intellectual and developmental disabilities, is right on the edge of 50 FTE employees and is preparing for the ACA requirements. If The Arc does have more than 50, it has a choice: Meet the requirements or pay a penalty.

"It does present a lot of challenges for us ... just the administrative piece of calculating (the number of FTE employees) out every single year," said Jennifer Beck, human resources coordinator for The Arc.

Under the ACA, employers will no longer be able to offer plans with deductibles higher than \$2,000 for individuals and \$4,000 for families. Employer-sponsored plans also will have to include "essential health benefits," which the government is still in the process of defining.

The Arc offered a comprehensive benefits plan in the past, but "the prices really started to spike up a couple years ago," Beck said. They cut back to a supplemental plan, and the employees share the cost with the organization.

If the organization does end up required to provide insurance benefits, it may be among those who opt to pay the penalty instead, Beck said.

Employers who choose to offer nothing will be penalized if any of their employees turn to the government-operated

A health insurance exchange for each state

By Jan. 1, 2014, the federal government requires every state to implement some form of Affordable Health Exchange – a "one-stop" online marketplace where businesses and individuals can shop for private health insurance plans.

Idaho has not yet decided what form its exchange will take. The Idaho Health Exchange Working Group has been reviewing the state's options, meeting twice in August.

Idaho Department of Insurance public information specialist Tricia Carney said the group will meet again in September and October, but it does not have a date set for making a recommendation on what type of exchange the state should pursue.

Idaho has three basic options for its exchange, according to a presentation from the Aug. 29 meeting:

- State-based exchange: The state operates the insurance exchange, but can use federal services for determining premium tax credits and cost-sharing reductions, exemptions, risk-adjustment programs and reinsurance programs.
- State partnership exchange: The state operates the day-to-day plan management and/or consumer assistance aspects of the exchange, but can choose to use federal services for reinsurance pro-

insurance exchanges for coverage, explained Kelly Madison, a Boise-based consultant who advises businesses on benefits options.

Employers also will be penalized if they offer a plan but any of their employees elect to use the exchange because their portion of the premium on their employer-offered plans is deemed unaffordable, or if the coverage does not meet the ACA's minimum requirements.

The penalties vary based on individual circumstances, Madison said, but start at \$2,000 per employee per year for employers that do not offer coverage, and \$3,000 per employee per year for those that offer coverage ruled unaffordable.

But, according to StateHealthFacts. org, the average employer contribution to individual employee premiums in Idaho was \$3,669 in 2011.

Beck said deciding to pay for a penalty instead of an insurance plan may end up being more cost-effective for The Arc, and having employees buy insurance through a government-run insurance exchange could provide better coverage than they're offered now.

"I think (the employees) would just be happier to get a better plan," Beck said. "I don't think they'd care where it came from."

She said The Arc could use money that has been going to health insurance to pay for other benefits, such as 401K matching and employer-paid life insurance – items the organization had to cut in recent years because of the rising cost of insurance.

Beck said she does not think The Arc,

which employs about 70 people, should be lumped in with companies that employ hundreds or more. But the work to figure out if it might be is already costing the organization time and money. And it has taken time to calculate how The Arc could be affected by other aspects of the ACA.

Beck has been researching and attending presentations to stay current on the ACA, but delays, repeals and changes make it difficult.

"It's a moving target at this point, so you've just got to keep yourself informed," she said.

Path ahead is unclear

Studies offer conflicting predictions of how employer-sponsored benefits may change as the ACA is implemented. The Congressional Budget Office estimates 7 percent of employees now receiving insurance through their employers will have to switch over to government-subsidized plans. However, a McKinsey & Company survey of 1,329 employers found that 30 percent said they would "definitely or probably" stop offering health insurance in 2014 or after

Madison, who is affiliated with Myriad Benefits, is among those who say employers may simply stop offering benefits altogether as more ACA requirements are implemented.

She said the companies she works with have been trying to rein in costs while still offering benefits in recent years. One way they do this is by increasing their plan's deductible.

"I have clients who are often having

deductibles of \$2,000, \$3,000, even up to \$5,000, just so they can even be able to provide something to their employees," she said.

Those high deductibles will not be an option under the new rules, however.

"These employers who have been struggling to provide insurance ... I think they're going to throw up their hands in the air and say, 'We're not going to do it anymore,'" Madison said.

Proponents of the ACA say it ultimately will reduce the price of premiums for employers. According to the White House website's page on the ACA, the law will make insurance more affordable for businesses "by bringing the uninsured into the system and tackling the drivers of health care costs."

But Madison predicted the cost savings will not be enough for some employers.

"They'll just say, 'Here I am trying to do what I should do, but I'm penalized because it's not enough,'" she said.

Adjusted requirements for small businesses

Small businesses will not have the same requirements as those with more than 50 employees, but they still have new options to contend with because of the ACA.

The ACA offers the Small Business Health Care Tax Credit to employers who have fewer than 25 FTE employees, pay an average wage of less than \$50,000 and meet certain other criteria.

For tax year 2010, just 228,000 taxpayers claimed the credit, according to a

Treasury Department press release.

Some employers have run into restrictions on the credit. For example, certain family businesses do not qualify.

Jim and Joan Stephens, who own Boise-based Stronghold Remodeling and Sandler Training, a consulting business, employ three of their four children. Because more than half the employees at Sandler are related, Joan Stephens said, they are not eligible for the credits.

Joan Stephens said she was excited when she first heard about the tax credits, and disappointed to find out she couldn't receive them.

"It's like they're out to get you if you're a family business," she said.

Madison said she thinks smaller employers may also stop offering insurance benefits because the ACA's requirements may cause insurance companies to charge more.

"Many of the small employers that I talk to ... are saying that as these costs continue to go up, that it's very likely that they will be dropping coverage," Madison said.

She added that competitive businesses such as technology companies are likely to offer benefits to attract the best employees, but struggling industries such as construction and momand-pop stores are more likely to drop coverage.

On the other hand, the Congressional Budget Office estimates the credit will save small businesses \$40 billion by 2019, according to the White House health reform website.

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

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Employee discounts can be taxable income

I have a small dental practice in Twin Falls. One of my dentist friends was recently audited by the IRS, and she and her employees had to pay addi-

had to pay additional tax because the employees and their families paid less than the normal rates for dental services. Why would they have to pay more tax when she charged less? I do the same for my employees and am concerned I may have the same problem.

There are very specific rules on providing discounts to employees under the fringe benefit provisions of the Tax Code. While these rules certainly apply to your business as a dentist, they actually apply to any business that offers employee discounts on either goods or services.

Generally we are taxed on all income we receive from any source unless there is a specific exclusion in the law. And income is very broadly defined, so it includes money as well as other economic benefits we receive. Employees who are given a discount off the regular price of a service are actually receiving an economic benefit by way of not having to pay the full price for the service they are receiving. As an example, if the normal cost of a dental procedure is \$100, but the employee is only charged \$90,



the employee has received an economic benefit of \$10. Absent a specific exclusion in the Tax Code, this \$10 benefit would be considered taxable income to the employee.

Fortunately, the law does provide for certain exclusions from this harsh treatment. The first of these rules pertains to the "no-additional-cost service." This is a service that is normally offered to a company's customers in the ordinary course of business, and where the company incurs no substantial additional costs in providing the service to the employee.

While this might seem to apply to a dental practice, there is a catch. This rule will only apply to "excess capacity services." These are services such as a seat on an airplane, train or bus that would otherwise go empty if not given to an employee. But professional services such as medical, legal or accounting services are not eligible for this exemption.

Employee discounts on services not falling under the "no-additional-cost service" exemption can still be treated as non-taxable fringe benefits, but only to the extent that the discount is no more than 20 percent of the normal price of the service (the 20 percent discount rule also applies to the purchase of goods by an employee). So in my example above, the \$10 discount would

not be taxable since it is only a 10 percent discount off the regular price.

However, if the employee only paid \$75 for a service that normally costs the general public \$100, there would be taxable income triggered. Of the total discount of \$25, the first 20 percent (\$20) would be excluded, but the remaining \$5 would be taxable income to the employee.

So your dentist friend was most likely providing services to employees at a more than 20 percent discount. As a result, the IRS examiner would want to include any discount more than 20 percent in the employees' taxable wages and also assess additional payroll taxes (Social Security and Medicare tax).

But for health care businesses such as a dental practice, there is another aspect that the IRS apparently overlooked in the audit you described. Employer-provided health care benefits are a tax-free fringe benefit under other Tax Code provisions. Our firm encountered an IRS exam of a dentist who was providing gratis dental work to his employees. The IRS initially asserted that most of these services (other than the 20 percent portion) were a taxable benefit. But the issue evaporated when we reminded the examiner of the special tax-free fringe rules for health care benefits.

These fringe benefit rules can be complex, so be sure to check with your tax adviser to see what applies to your business and how to avoid problems in Have a question for Robbins?

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

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

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

iating people earns zero respect.

When someone told me how her boss belittled her as "worthless" in front of her co-workers, she said she lost all motivation to show up for work.

treated if their ideas don't match vours. You can also humiliate people by forwarding to others email that is meant only for you.

If you're a humiliator, it will take a long time for you to rebuild trust.

But you can make headway by adhering to the principle of praising in public and reprimanding in private.

Trap Setting

You are failing as a boss if you set

people up for failure, and then punish them when they fail. This happens when you don't provide instruction or training for a specific task, and then dole out discipline when employees don't do what you expect.

One service repairman I know got fired because he answered the phone when it rang. The owner of the company would call every few hours, and if the same person answered the phone too often, the boss figured the guy was trying to get out of doing re-

A little instruction to "let the phone ring if you're busy" would have communicated the owner's wishes, but no such statement or instruction was ever made. Instead, the repairman was fired for doing what he thought was an appropriate, customer-focused

If you're a trap setter, get your head out of playing such games. Be straightforward with what you expect and equip people with the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to perform to your expectations.

Isolationism

You are failing as a boss if you ignore everyone except a small clique of cohorts and yes-men. Your employees working in the trenches have excellent insights into how things can be better, so you're asking for trouble if you think that only a handful of people deserve your attention.

One woman describes her boss's clique as "the top three managers who regularly go out together after work,

decorate each other's office on their birthdays and take a lot of credit for work done by others." They spend a lot of time chatting among themselves, they never give compliments to other people and they never seek input from anyone but each other.

If you're an isolationist, realize that you were once a frontline employee who had a lot of ideas on how to make things better. You can turn things around by seeking other people's input and by treating all your employees like they're part of your winning team.

Bottom line: Life is not a continuation of how you acted in high school. You're in a real world of real people who want to contribute. Your job is to put off childish ways and start treating people with respect.



The credit now offers a maximum of 35 percent of a small business's premiums, but the maximum increases to 50 percent in January 2014.

Idaho physicians support a state-based insurance exchange

Many Idaho physicians also are employers, so they too must consider how the benefits they offer could be affected by the ACA.

Susie Pouliot, CEO of the Idaho Medical Association, said she does not believe most physicians' offices will have any trouble meeting the ACA requirements for employee benefits. She said she could not name an IMA member who runs a small business and doesn't provide coverage.

"Those of us who work in the health care field hold health care benefits for our employees at a high value," she said.

While the IMA does not have an established policy regarding employer-sponsored health insurance, Pouliot said research shows that workers who have access to health benefits are better employees.

"Healthy folks are happy folks and productive folks," she said

Pouliot said the IMA has been helping Idaho doctors get the information they need to know how the ACA will affect them. The group also has taken positions on the elements of the ACA that Idaho gets a say in implementing.

She said the IMA supports a state-based insurance exchange.

"We think Idaho can do a better job regulating insurance companies and plans that are operating in the exchange based on our knowledge of our own state," she said.

The IMA also supports expanding Medicaid to people who make less than 133 percent of the federal poverty level. Pouliot said people in that group often turn to the state or county catastrophic health care funds because they do not get the preventive and consistent care they need.

"It's better care for patients that they have regular ac-

cess to medical care and they don't wait until a medical problem has become out of control," she said.

According to a recent analysis by the Spokesman-Review, Idaho taxpayers stand to save \$380 million over six years if the state Legislature agrees to expand Medicaid. The federal government will pay for the program entirely until 2016, then gradually cut back its support to 90 percent after 2020.

Pouliot said the IMA would like to see the federal government better address other health care issues – most importantly Medicare reimbursement problems and medical liability reform – but it supports the ACA's goal of ensuring all people have health insurance.

"All Idahoans should have access to some sort of health care coverage." she said.

Preparations under way at insurance companies

Insurers also are preparing for the way they do business with employers and individuals to change as the ACA requirements come into effect.

Karen Early, director of corporate communications for Blue Cross of Idaho, said if more employers opt out of sponsoring insurance for their employees, Blue Cross will have plans to offer the increased number of individuals looking for insurance coverage.

"We plan to be very competitive on the (government) insurance exchange," Early said. "Everybody knows that the individual marketplace is going to grow."

Early declined to discuss Blue Cross' plans for enticing employers to continue sponsoring coverage for their employees.

She said Blue Cross has had to develop all new products to offer as the ACA is implemented. Complicating the matter are the continued unknowns, such as how "essential benefits" will be defined and how the insurance exchange in Idaho will be structured.

"There's a lot of work that has to be done in the background to prepare for what is going to be a very changed health insurance marketplace," Early said.

grams and determining eligibility for Medicaid and the State Children's Health Insurance Program.

• Federally facilitated exchange: The federal department of Health and Human Services operates the exchange. The state can choose whether to use federal services for reinsurance programs and determining eligibility for Medicaid and the State Children's Health Insurance Program.

States that wish to create their own exchange or a partnership exchange must submit a blueprint application to the federal government by Nov. 16. HHS will issue approvals and conditional approvals Jan. 1, 2013.

If Idaho does not meet the blueprint deadline, a federal exchange will be implemented. The state also can choose to default to the federal exchange and submit a plan for a state-based exchange at a later date.

At an Aug. 2 meeting, Idaho Department of Insurance Director Bill Deal estimated implementing an exchange would cost about \$40 million, noting that the state would reduce costs by piggybacking the exchange on the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare's computer system.

The federal government awarded Idaho a \$20.3 million, one-year grant in November 2011 that was to be used to plan and set up an exchange. However, the Idaho Legislature turned down the money in the hopes that the Supreme Court would overturn the Affordable Care Act.

Idaho will be able to apply for more federal grant money in November.



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
