Summer Feeding Program Set to Begin June 18

IN NORTH CAROLINA, 1,565,910 people are struggling with hunger and of them, 479,220 are children.

To put it in better perspective, **that's 1 in 7 people and 1 in 5 children** that struggle with hunger in the state of North Carolina. The Davie County Child Nutrition Department wants to change those statistics through its Summer Feeding Program!

In the summer of 2017, the Davie County Child Nutrition Department served 7,603 breakfast meals and 26,189 lunch meals over the course of 36 days during the months of June, July and August to children throughout the county. This summer, we are hoping that we can eclipse those numbers and reach more children in need. The Summer Feeding Program will begin on June 18 and conclude on August 10 and is FREE to all children ages 1-18. Central feeding sites include Mocksville Elementary, Cooleemee Elementary, Cornatzer Elementary and William R. Davie Elementary. Many mobile sites will also be available throughout the county. What's Your **Purpose**?

Godbey Creek Canine Bescue

WHAT IF YOUR FAMILY decided it was time to add a dog to the household? And, what if, before you took that dog home, you were sure it was the right dog for your family and your home?

That's what the dedicated team at Godbey Creek Canine Rescue (GCCR) work toward every day, and with a less than two percent return rate, it's obvious their techniques are working.





Jessica Vaughn, operations director of the Godbey Road facility, stated **"Our mission statement is to protect, provide, promote, and place each canine companion that enters our rescue program."**

The Godbey Creek "place" philosophy is to match the right pet with the right owner in the right environment; this has been a key component of their success.

Situated on 52 acres in beautiful, scenic Davie County, the donated property displays beautiful hardwoods, a pond with a fountain, a spotless adoption center, 17 kennels, 17 fresh air kennels and 12 doggie pastures for supervised playtime. Founded in 2013, the facility is licensed by the NC Department of Agriculture.

"The dogs at GCCR are pulled from shelters in surrounding counties and are mostly 'urgent rescue dogs' nearing their euthanasia date",

Vaughn said. Volunteers transport them to GCCR, where they are vaccinated and placed in a special quarantine area. Each pet receives at a minimum basic medical which includes a microchip, flea and tick treatment, heartworm prevention, de-worming, vaccines, a heartworm test and are spayed or neutered.

Vaughn said the staff and volunteers work with each dog to make sure they are crate, house and leashtrained. "We could not succeed without our competent and dedicated staff and our wonderful volunteers who do so much to help these animals along their journey."

All the dogs have time outside each day, weather permitting, both in the fenced pastures and in fresh-air kennels. Volunteers also take them on walks, which provides not only exercise but also time for interaction

FOR 16 YEARS, volunteers from across Davie County have come together for a common good, benefiting United Way of Davie County organizations. This year's United Way Day of Caring was held at the Farmington Community Center, and included more than 150 individuals who were eager to help out.

Feeding America reports that 11.7 percent of Davie County residents are food insecure. Of those, at least 35 percent are ineligible for Federal Food Assistance and must rely on local food pantries to meet their needs. That's where United Way stepped in, with the assistance of Outreach, Inc. The mission of The Outreach Program is to provide safe water, food, medical care, and education to individuals both domestically and abroad.

"Although the planning and organizing of this type of event is a massive undertaking, it was incredible to see all these volunteers having such a good time, spending their Saturday morning working for the good of others in our community," said United Way of Davie County's CEO Melinda Beauchamp.

Businesses and organizations from throughout Davie County packed **40,000 meals** that were given to local organizations who feed hungry families in the community. For this project, volunteers packaged fortified apple cinnamon oatmeal to send to A Storehouse for Jesus, Our Daily Bread Food Pantry at Church of the Ascension, Just Hope, Inc., First Baptist Church of Cooleemee Food Pantry, and Backpack Buddies, a program that provides meals for Davie County students on weekends, holidays, and summer break.

"This was an amazing event. The Farmington Community Events Center was rocking — lots of music and energy. The volunteers worked hard, but they also enjoyed talking and laughing with one another," said Beauchamp. "A lot of them have already told us how much they enjoyed helping and can't wait to do it again next year."

Events like Day of Caring could not occur without generous community support, however.

with a person and time to work on leash training. "Socialization is another key component of the formula for placement. Also, there is a volunteer parent/child team associated with GCCR who has been taught the appropriate skills for dog interaction. Dogs who may not have been previously exposed to children are then socialized in a safe environment to gauge their potential for success in a home with children" said Vaughn.

Those interested in adopting can spend time with a dog in the facility's meet-and-greet area and take it on a walk outside. "Another key component of the matching process is to assess how the new pet interacts with the existing pet already in the home. Godbey Creeks asks prospective parents to bring their current pets and walk them on the grounds and play together in the pastures to determine if the interaction is a positive one."

Once the application is approved, the family may take the dog home that day assuming the pet's training is complete. If there are questions about the fit, Vaughn recommends they foster the dog for a two-week period to make sure it's the right fit for their family.

Pets waiting for their forever homes may be viewed at Godbey Creek's Facebook page, Petfinder page or at **GodbeyCreekCanine.org**. The cost to adopt is \$250, which Vaughn said helps cover the cost of veterinary care. Godbey Rescue is always excited to bring in new volunteers and welcomes donations.

A Look Inside **The Dragonfly House**

A little background on why and how the facility was designed to meet the needs of children affected by abuse:

The Upper Level is rear facing and has two designated spaces: Investigative Services and Therapy Services. Each have their own entrances and lobbies in order to maintain client confidentiality and to prevent interference between the nature of the two services. Investigative services are typically in "crisis" and therapy services are in the process of healing. We do not want the two to intermingle. Investigative Services offer "Hope" through the child's disclosure and seeing people come together as a team to help the child and the Therapy Services offer "Healing" through trauma informed mental health treatment for the child and family.

CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER

Our Lower Level entrance faces Valley Road and is used as the Staff and Community Entrance. All staff offices are downstairs and our community meeting room is downstairs so that we can host meetings or trainings that won't interfere with any services offered to children or their privacy. We can also have visitors, volunteers or people dropping off donations and they won't cross paths with our children.

it's not smart to ignore your **WISCOM teeth**

Wisdom teeth, or third molars, are the most common teeth to be impacted. When a tooth is unable to fully erupt into the mouth within its expected time frame, it is said to be "impacted." In general, impacted teeth are unable to break through the jawbones and/or gums because there is not enough room. Nine out of ten people will have, or have had, at least one impacted tooth in their life.

Wisdom teeth may not need to be extracted if they grow in completely and are functional, painless, cavity-free, diseasefree, and in a hygienic environment with healthy gum tissue. However, most wisdom teeth are impacted, or become diseased, and need to be removed at some point in a person's life. Impacted wisdom teeth can sometimes damage or block neighboring teeth if left in place. Because wisdom teeth are in an area that's hard to

clean, they can also invite bacteria that lead to gum disease, dental decay, or facial abscesses. In some cases, a cyst or tumor can form around an impacted tooth or wisdom tooth, which can lead to more serious problems as it hollows out the jaw and damages surrounding nerves, teeth and other parts of your mouth and face. In addition, wisdom teeth may also interfere with orthodontic treatment (braces) if left in place.



A special x-ray (Cone Beam CT) showing a lower impacted wisdom tooth that is blocking the eruption of a normal lower second molar In general, it is ideal to have your wisdom teeth removed during the late teenage years or the early twenties. Removing them at this time is associated with the lowest risk, the least number of complications, and the fastest recovery. Waiting to remove wisdom teeth until you are older can result in more complications, postoperative discomfort, and more time away from work or school.

Wisdom teeth are commonly removed by an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon under IV sedation or general anesthesia ("going to

sleep") in an office setting. Most people return to school or work after 2 to 3 days. Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons are highly trained and skilled in the removal of wisdom teeth and the administration of safe, cost effective, and comfortable anesthesia care. Five Skills **Your Child Needs** to Land a Good Job (that they will never learn in school)

YOUNG PEOPLE ENTERING the workforce today are clearly the most intelligent generation ever. They have access to knowledge and information like none before them. However, many of them are having a hard time finding and keeping jobs they would otherwise love because they lack one critical ingredient – Soft Skills.

Those who possess strong **soft skills can interact with others well** and are far more likely to move up in their careers than those without these skills. Soft skills are so important that businesses have come to value employees with them more than employees who possess a high technical knowledge, but little or no soft skills. Soft skills are much harder to teach on the job than technical skills.

If you want your child to be successful in the workplace, here are five ways to prepare them:

. LET THEM FAIL

In an effort to keep grades high so they can get into a good college, parents hold the hands of their children with the best of intentions. But failing out of a good college because you couldn't do the work on your own is worse than graduating from a decent college. **Let them get zeros for refusing to do their homework.** You will be giving them the best gift, the knowledge their decisions have consequences for which they themselves are responsible.

2. REWARD FOR CHARACTER, NOT ABILITY

Working hard is a trait employers need. They need people who will stay with a project until they figure out the solution, whatever the solution may be. If you praise a child for their ability, anxiety can develop when they fear they have reached their maximum aptitude. **Rewarding hard work will give birth to a strong work ethic.** Working hard is a character trait just like honesty, fairness, and bravery.

3. FORCE THEM TO MAKE EYE CONTACT AND SHAKE HANDS

This is hard. Kids do not want to do things they are not comfortable with (refer to #2), but this is critical for success. Eye contact is the easiest way to convey trust and honesty. When someone doesn't make eye contact our natural assumption is that they are hiding something. Teach your children how to introduce themselves, look others in the eye, and give a firm handshake.

I READ RECENTLY BITING your fingernails is a sign of perfectionism. It helps soothe boredom and frustration. I have been plagued with this socially unacceptable behavior my whole life. But what strikes me as ironic, if I am trying so hard to be perfect, I have mangled my fingers which in turn look so imperfect. I then suffer from the pain of my bleeding fingers, hide them all the while feeling shame and complete embarrassment. Isn't this just a crazy example how perfectionism is such a lie?

I have this overwhelming need to be moving and doing something rather than nothing. This is one of the very reasons it is so hard for me to **be still and wait on God.** I completely identify with Martha and her plight. She struggled with her hostessing duties making sure everything was perfect while Jesus was at her house. She was so annoyed at Mary, her sister, who did nothing to help and sat at his feet only listening to him. And to her dismay, when she complained to Jesus, he told her Mary had chosen what was better. He also told Martha to stop being so upset, distracted by her preparations and to quit worrying about things that didn't matter. (Luke 10:40-42)

How many times have you felt like Martha? Distracted by preparations or worrying about laundry and those closets you never seem to get to? When I think about the time I have wasted just obsessing about the work necessary for my family, I realize just how much I have lost in fellowship with them. That is exactly what happened to Martha. Mary was in the moment with Jesus. She understood few things were needed for his visit other than listening to him and building a closer relationship.

Being perfect is the perfect lie. We can't be perfect no matter how hard we try. Just the struggle of perfectionism can urge us to develop nasty habits or destroy us. But, what I do know, if we ask Jesus to help us when these urges start we can react differently. When that feeling of fear of failure starts to take over, we can turn it over to him to wash us with his strength and peace. In time we will begin to believe through him, we are enough even with all of our imperfections. That driving force to make our surroundings perfect will subside in time. See, we are all broken and imperfect. The only thing that puts us back together is Jesus. If we are never still and busy preparing for him, we will never experience him. (Psalm 46:10)

DAVIE COUNTY HISTORY: The Pearson Family

IN 1800, there was no Davie County and no town of Cooleemee. Our area was called the Forks of the Yadkin and was included in the very large Rowan County. But in the area that we now know as Cooleemee, Davie County, a large family with surname of Pearson lived, farmed, and prospered 200 years ago.

Richmond Pearson was born in Virginia in 1751 and married Sarah Haden in 1772. They had four children: Elizabeth "Betsey" Pearson who married Col. John Stokes, General Jesse A. Pearson who married Ann Steele and later Elizabeth Causey, Honorable Joseph Pearson who married three times, Nancy Anna Maria McLin, Eleanor Brent, and Catherine Worthington, and Richmond Pearson Jr. who married Elizabeth McLin, sister of Joseph's first wife. They possibly had a fifth child, George, who is mentioned in Richmond's will but in no other document.

After Sarah died, Richmond came to North Carolina and married Elizabeth Coit Mumford in 1791. They had six children: Sallie Pearson who married Isaac Croom, Margaret Eliza Pearson who married William Henry Gibbs, Charles R. Pearson who never married and went to Georgia, Richmond Mumford Pearson who married Margaret McClung Williams and later Mary Louise McDowell, Giles William Pearson who married Elizabeth Ellis, and John Stokes Pearson who married Annabella Beattie. Researching families of long ago can be very confusing because of given names being used over and over. There are at least six Richmond Pearsons and many Elizabeths. **Records are scarce for families long ago.** This Pearson family had some heroes and prominent members, so there was some documentation for this family.

The patriarch was active in the Revolutionary War in the militia and gained his title of Colonel. He also served as representative in state government. He owned thousands of acres in what is now Cooleemee and the adjoining areas. He had a grist mill on the South Yadkin River. This spot of land next to the river which descended on rocky shoals was the main attraction for buying this land. A dam was built which is north of the current dam. Falling water was harnessed to create energy. His large home was along the river north of the dam.

All ten of his children (possibly eleven) lived in this area and some were prominent in political and military service. Betsey's husband served in the Revolutionary War. Jesse served many terms in state government and was a Regimental Commander in the War of 1812. Joseph was representative in the federal government. Sallie and her husband moved to Alabama and established a plantation that is now on the National Historic Registry. Richmond Mumford became an attorney, had a law school in Mocksville for about ten years and moved it to Yadkin County, and was Chief Justice in Raleigh. He had a son Richmond Mumford Pearson Jr. who was an attorney in Asheville and served in state and federal congresses and was appointed consul to several foreign countries.

The patriarch, Colonel Pearson, his son Richmond Mumford Pearson, and a grandson, Richmond Mumford Pearson Jr., all named their homes Richmond Hill. The only structure remaining is the one in Yadkin County which is a museum in a park.

There is a family cemetery near Cooleemee where only nine graves have tombstones. This graveyard was overgrown but in 1999, the owner of the Asheville Richmond Hill

paid local men to clear vegetation and debris. A massive rock wall was improved. In 2000, the same benefactor paid Wake Forest University Archaeological Department to make a study of the cemetery and to reposition the broken and scattered tombstones. There is a report of their findings. Their ground penetrating radar determined that there are approximately 30 more graves without markers. In 2009, the Sons of the American Revolution placed a commemorative marker at the grave of Col. Pearson.

The Pearson family gives us an insight into the history of our Davie County 200 years ago.

LET THEM TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR ACTIONS.

Far too often we trade kindness for honesty. A child may do something wrong and parents dismiss it with "It's only a small thing. It's not that big a deal." Owning our issues is healthy. When people make a mistake and own up to it in the workplace, senior leaders are impressed. Those who pass the buck because they are afraid of others knowing they messed up, will be seen as making excuses and will not last. If the behavior is not okay, say so, discipline appropriately, and move on. It is better to have hurt feelings as a child than to be a 30-year-old adult unable to hold down a job for fear their boss will not like them.

S. SPEAK TO ADULTS.

If school work is important, then this is equally as important. Children who can speak to adults will fare much better in life as an adult. Tie their ability to speak to adults to the rewards or consequences you offer for completing schoolwork. Children who can speak with adults will have greater confidence with superiors as adults. Senior leadership will always value confidence over insecurity, no matter how technically intelligent someone is.

Most young adults today who do not possess soft skills were never taught them. They are not lazy, and they can learn them. It begins with intentional parenting to value soft skills at least as much as school subject matter is valued.
