VIP Country Club has long been considered one of Westchester's "Best Kept Secrets", as brides and grooms from far and wide flocked to the New Rochelle country club and event venue for its topnotch service and picturesque views of the Long Island Sound. In early 2018, VIP unveiled its floor to ceiling renovations, that updated both the interior and exterior of the popular wedding destination while introducing new and improved amenities and event facility options. The most exciting of these being the new 600 Lounge, VIP's sleek and modern space that is available for wedding receptions, cocktail hours, after parties and more.

With two separate bars for easy access, 4 televisions to display a photo montage if so desired, a professional DJ booth, LED lighting throughout and capacity for up to 200 guests, 600 provides today's creative bride with unlimited options when creating an out of the box wedding experience on every level. The 600 Lounge continues to wow and impress as it brings the vibe and sophistication of an upscale New York City lounge to Westchester County.

VIP's exquisite ballrooms do little to disappoint as well as they seamlessly transition into a multitude of wedding day options from ceremony, cocktail hour and reception with relative ease, allowing for a one stop nuptials destination venue. This coupled with VIP's amazing outside event areas and everything that the country club has to offer, means that no wedding is ever an ordinary affair.

One look at Cedar Lakes Estate, and you'll understand why celebrity brides like Zosia Mamet and Christina Tosi chose the venue for their weddings. Sisters Stephanie and Lisa Karvellas transformed the property, which was originally a summer camp, into the Hudson Valley's ultimate weekend-wedding retreat, blending stunning landscapes and private seclusion.

Full-weekend weddings are the norm here. Guests can stay on-site in the luxury Pine Cottages or bunk in rustic, shared, cabin-style accommodations. Kick off Friday with welcome drinks, followed by the rehearsal dinner at the farm table in the Chef's Garden. Ceremonies can take place at the amphitheater-style lakefront deck, framed by willowy pines, or at The Mountain Top, a rolling clearing with wildflowers and views of the Shawangunk Mountains (just imagine the fall foliage). Receptions are held in the contemporary barn, with floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking the water and room for more than 300 guests. For the after-party, there's a chic treehouse with a built-in bar and wood-burning fireplace. In between, enjoy relics of the venue's camp past: Play field games on the lawn, ride a zip line down the mountain, hike and bike miles of private trails, build a bonfire to roast pumpkin-spice s'mores, or go for a swim.

For foodie couples, it's the hyper-local culinary program that most appeals at Cedar Lakes. Be advised: The food-and-drink minimum is very hefty, but it can be used for events beyond the wedding day, including a welcome lunch, rehearsal dinner, and next-day breakfast. Dishes like pasta with ramp pesto, fresh ricotta toast with rosemary honey, and grilled pork porterhouse on bacon-braised onions, drizzled with plum mostarda, come from the Cedar Lakes property — produce from the garden, plus cheese, maple syrup, and honey are produced on-site — or from nearby purveyors and farms.

THE DETAILS: Weekend weddings incur a site fee of \$12,500 to \$19,500, depending on season, and require a \$90,000 food-and-drink minimum. From Sunday to Thursday, couples may book the venue for single-day weddings for a \$6,500 to \$9,500 fee and \$65,000 food-and-drink minimum.









Set on 90 acres of woodlands and gardens, this performing arts center in Northern Westchester is a dreamy spot for a summer wedding. "Caramoor offers a one-of-a-kind outdoor venue that combines the natural beauty of our lush gardens [with] timeless structures," says special events assistant Kristina Jahaly. "We have all the elements for a successful event — an idyllic location, delicious food, and attentive service — combined to conjure a magical atmosphere."

The Sunken Garden, a beautifully landscaped three-tier formal garden surrounded by tall trees, is the most popular ceremony location. Tapestry Hedge, a sloping lawn with Grecian-style statues and a rose-covered gazebo, is a top spot for cocktails, as is the Brunelleschi-inspired Italian Pavilion, adjacent to the butterfly garden. The Venetian Theater, with its pink marble columns, arches, and elegant tent, is the favored reception site. In between, there are charming spots to steal a moment — iron gates, sunlit gardens, and cedar-tree-lined paths — perfect for stunning photo ops.

The focus on nature extends to the menu as well. NYC-based catering company Great Performances partners with the venue to create seasonal menus of contemporary farm-sourced dishes — Middle Eastern-spiced rack of lamb, mini beet burgers with goat cheese, and colorful seasonal salads, for example — with much of the produce coming from Kinderhook's Katchkie Farm.

THE DETAILS: Pricing and capacity vary by venue. Use of the Italian Pavilion, reception tent, and gardens runs \$7,500, with space for 250 guests. The Venetian Theater can accommodate up to 800 for dinner and carries a rental fee of \$18,000. Expect catering and rentals to cost about \$325 per guest.





Soaring columns embellished with gold, marble walls, chandeliers, hand-painted vaulted ceilings, and a spacious ballroom lend a sense of capital-appropriate grandeur to The State Room. Designed in 1901 by American architect Marcus T.

Reynolds, the building originally served as Albany's City & County Savings Bank (and the city's first skyscraper). Subsequent restorations have preserved the period architecture and transformed elements of the former

bank into standout features. The vault serves as a lounge area for the wedding party. The former bank president's office is now a private wedding suite where newlyweds can enjoy a private cocktail hour - original mirrored glass allows them to view the festivities below - before making a grand entrance at the reception. A DJ booth was built with reclaimed moldings and materials from the original building, and bank-teller counters were repurposed into the bathroom vanities.

Despite the opulent architecture, you might be surprised to find that you won't have to rob a bank to afford a wedding at The State Room. An array of all-inclusive packages offer great value for your dollar. In addition to covering site fees, catering, and five hours of top-shelf bar service, even the most basic packages include a cake, antique car service from the owner's personal collection, a floral credit, and overnight accommodations for the newlyweds at a downtown Albany hotel. Included planning services sweeten the deal,



A vintage-style circus tent might seem like an odd choice for a wedding venue, but hear us out on why this colorful arts venue on the campus of Bard College is actually one of the Hudson Valley's coolest reception sites. Popular at the turn of the 20th century, traditional spiegeltents were erected by artisans at fairgrounds and events to bring a sense of excitement and joy to local communities. (Pretty analogous, don't you think?) With that tradition in mind, Bard commissions this tent, made of 3,000 interlocking parts, each summer from the Klessens family, who have been building spiegeltents in this traditional style for generations.

With weddings in the round and unique character very much in vogue right now, a spiegeltent might be just what you're looking for. There are plenty of enchanting and quirky details, like colorful stained glass, beveled mirrors, intricate carvings, ornate crystal, and a lush velvet canopy stitched with gold. Receptions are typically set up in concentric circles — the mirror-framed tables built into the tent walls are prime seating — surrounding the parquet dancefloor.

Before you book, keep in mind that the tent is only available from June to August and subject to Bard's concert schedule. Ceremonies cannot take place in the tent. Understandably, all décor requires approval to ensure the structure won't be damaged, but for a venue this unique, it's well worth jumping through a few hoops.

THE DETAILS: Venue fees run from \$3,000 for a weeknight to \$10,000 for a Saturday, with discounts available to Bard alumni. Suggested capacity is 250 guests.

and GM Eric Michael Stewart is an LGBTQ-certified wedding planner. ("We love celebrating love here for all couples," he says.)

Given its location on State Street, many couples budget extra time to take portraits at nearby Albany landmarks, including the New York State Capitol building. If you can swing it, consider having your wedding on a Friday. Not only will you receive a discount on any package, but you'll have access to the Capitol building's Million Dollar Staircase, where the photos come out looking like, well, a million bucks.

THE DETAILS: The State Room can accommodate up to 250 guests, with packages ranging from about \$120 to \$170 per person. On Saturday, a minimum of 120 adult guests is required.





If you're dreaming of a romantic vineyard wedding, you might look to Italy, France, or California. But the Hudson Valley? Turns out you can find Old-World winery charm right here at home. Brotherhood Winery, established in 1839, is often considered the United States' oldest operating winery. Much like a fine wine, the property has only improved with age, and recent renovations have modernized the amenities but kept the original character.

Weddings focus on the Grand Monarque Hall, a restored 19thcentury stone building with exposed brick framing the windows and doorways, which has been converted into nearly 5,000 square feet of event space. Inside, the lofty space feels like a Tuscan farmhouse with more exposed stone and brick, hand-hewn wood floors, rustic wooden rafters, and antique wrought-iron light fixtures and chandeliers. The adjacent English cobblestone patio is typically used for cocktail hour or ceremonies,

which can also be held on the lawn, framed by stone arches. And any photographer's shot list should include a kiss among the vines and a few romantic moments in the underground barrel room.

Of course, there's plenty of wine. The site fee includes a bottle choose from the winery's Champagne-style sparklers, whites, and reds — for every two guests. (No outside wine is permitted; liquor and beer can be provided by outside caterers.) For an extra fee, you can even have a personalized label affixed to bottles, or take home a case to help you celebrate all the landmarks of your first year of marriage.

THE DETAILS: Venue fees range from \$6,500 to \$8,500, depending on the day, with space for up to 224 seated guests. Dates in January, February, and March receive a \$2,000 discount.







The Capitol Theatre is a landmark that has hosted some of the world's most iconic musicians. Bowie performed here — so did

the Stones, Pink Floyd, Janis Joplin, and the Grateful Dead. And while there's certainly a cool factor associated with saying your "I Do's" on that stage, you don't have to be music-obsessed to see the potential in getting married at The Cap.


Simply put, the theater knows how to bring drama to any event. Built in 1926 — it's on the National Register of Historic Places — The Cap has retained its theatricality with intricate gold detailing, crystal chandeliers, and red-velvet curtains.

There's a unique space for every moment of your wedding day. Do you first look under gold ceilings on the lobby staircase. Then, say your vows in front of guests on the famed stage or in the balcony. Garcia's, the theater's adjacent bar with exposed brick walls, tufted black leather couches, and pressed-tin ceilings, is perfect for cocktail hour. Hold the reception under the 65-foot domed ceiling of the main theater. With the room's "elegant theater vibe, event designers have transformed the space using tall floral arrangements, incredible ice sculptures, multi-leveled platforms, and A-list entertainment," says director of special events Emily Schmalholz. (It goes without saying that there's also a killer A/V system.)

As it's still a working theater, Saturday nights are often booked for concerts, not weddings. Summer is your best bet for a weekend wedding, as outdoor-concert season — which coincides with the busy wedding season — allows for the rare desirable date. Even if you can't score a Saturday, it's worth the unconventional timing to add your day to the venue's long list of legendary moments.

THE DETAILS: Venue fees run from \$20,000 to \$35,000, depending on dates and availability. The theater can accommodate up to 300 guests for a seated reception and up to 500 guests for a cocktail-style wedding.

From pastel patisserie to rustic pies and donuts, cake is not the only sweet ending we're craving this year.

On a summer day in July, at Tappan Hill in Tarrytown, Jessica and Andrew joined together to become man and wife, surrounded by 182 of their family members and friends. It may have rained on their special day, but it did not dampen the beauty of their wedding.

"When I first got engaged, I envisioned having a garden or Hudson Valley wedding," says Jessica. "I always envisioned having our ceremony and cocktail hour outdoors, with people being able to relax and celebrate in the open air. I also knew that I wanted our flowers and colors to be classic, timeless, and elegant."

The bride chose green-and-white floral arrangements for a classic look and added gray accents to incorporate "texture and a hint of color that allowed the other details to shine through."

Jessica and Andrew enlisted event planner Lindsey M. Events to help pull all the details together.

"For Andrew and me the most important parts of the wedding were having great food, good music, and an unforgettable view," says Jessica. "We knew if we had the first two in order, everyone would have an undeniably good time, and the view really helped to set the tone of the event."

After touring almost two-dozen venues, they chose Tappan Hill because of the amazing terrace for the ceremony and the indoor/outdoor feel of the atrium and patio for the cocktail hour.

"The hardest thing for us to decide on was the venue," says Jessica. "Surprisingly, the easiest thing to decide on was my dress! I went to Pronovias on a whim and walked out an hour later with my dress because it just felt right."















The bride and groom wanted to incorporate natural elements into their wedding because they love nature and the outdoors. "We only looked at venues where nature and the outdoors were part of the setting," says Jessica.

For the décor, they used succulents as place cards, natural branches in tall centerpieces, and garlands to decorate the bars.

As a special gift, the bride's Aunt Barbara gave Jessica a hairpiece to wear on the day and to serve as her "something new," with the idea that it could be passed down as "something borrowed" to the cousins who marry in the future.

For the bridal party, it was important to Jessica that each attendant felt

comfortable and not "forced to wear something they did not like." She liked the mix-and-match idea of the attendants wearing different shades and styles, so she chose specific colors and designers and then let each girl choose what style worked best.

The couple also displayed wedding photos of their parents and grandparents. "Unfortunately, both my and Andrew's grandparents are no longer with us, so we felt that by having photos of them at our wedding, a part of them would be with us celebrating," says Jessica.

THE RECEPTION

For the reception, they kept the décor modern, romantic, and elegant. "Everything was green [and] white with a touch of romantic blues and accented with gold geometric





shapes," says Jessica. "For our tables, we chose to have a combination of high and low centerpieces to help give the room texture and variation throughout the space, as well as to ensure that the incredible views of the sweeping lawn and Hudson River were not blocked."

Natural greenery was used throughout, especially in the tall centerpieces. The low centerpieces highlighted the flowers used in the bride's bouquet. Displayed in beautiful urns, they were surrounded by smaller vases of flowers and votives. A variety of arrangements, geometric lanterns, and candles were used on the tables, along with table runners and gold cutlery to accent the lanterns.

The bride, who works for Diageo, a global leader in the alcoholic beverage space, wanted to create a









delicious signature cocktail. They chose blood-orangejalapeño margaritas, since the couple's favorite drink is a spicy margarita, "and the blood orange added a nice refreshing twist," says Jessica.

In addition to the traditional cake, the couple chose butlered trays of different desserts. "This was one of the food highlights of the entire evening and one of the things our guests continually talk to us about as their favorite parts of the wedding," says Jessica. Included were deconstructed key lime push-pops, "brookies" (brownies and chocolate chip cookies combined) with milk, and mini ice cream sandwiches.

"My favorite part of the wedding was the end when all of our friends and family gathered together closely in a circle for the last two songs of the night," says Jessica. "While the dance floor was filled all night, at this moment, you could really feel the undeniable love from all of our guests." www

Sarah and Chris, who both work in Norwalk with The Maritime Aquarium's volunteer dive team, met in 2015 when Chris was a volunteer diver and Sarah was the diver coordinator or "his boss." "He had the reputation for being the 'hot diver guy,' but I had not met him yet, so I just happened to schedule myself on a day Chris would be diving too," says Sarah. "When he showed up, I felt like it was something out of a movie. I looked up and there's Chris with a dive bag slung over his shoulder, a weight belt and dry suit bag in the other. He had a cup of coffee and was wearing bright red sunglasses. He had me from the first day."

Since they both love the ocean and maritime history, they are frequent visitors of lighthouses. On Oct. 27, 2017, they packed a picnic dinner and their two dachshunds and headed to the Tarrytown Lighthouse for sunset, where Chris dropped to one knee and proposed.

When they started planning their nuptials, the couple knew they wanted a fall wedding. "We started dating in October, got engaged in October, so we wanted to have our wedding in October," says Sarah. "The colors this time of year in the Hudson Valley can be so beautiful, and we wanted to have our wedding and reception outdoors to really soak in all of the fall foliage."

"Sarah loves the movie The Secret Garden, so we tried to have our guests feel like they were in a magical, beautiful place - which they were!" says Chris. "Also, there was an overall theme of going 'back to our roots,' hence the rustic farm and natural décor."

After looking at dozens of venues online and touring several in person, they chose Blooming Hill Farm. "It is a hidden gem in the Hudson Valley," says the couple. "It has a wonderfully laid-back atmosphere, which is personified by the venue coordinator, Kevin. He was able to put us at ease as he showed us the venue and explained what they offered. We left feeling like we had found our spot."













The Details

The bride tried on several dresses before landing on one from BHLDN. "When I saw my dress, it was love at first sight," says Sarah.

Chris wore a tweed suit with wood buttons and brown shoes that were stylish and practical: "[They] would help hide the mud," he says.

He wore a set of cufflinks made to look like oysters, a wedding gift from Sarah, and a pocket watch, which he borrowed from his bride to be. "It was my 'something borrowed," says Chris. "I'm hoping it becomes a look that will hold up over time as we look back in 10 or 20 years."

The bridal party comprised close family and friends, with a mix of men and women on both sides, including a man of honor standing with Sarah.

Sarah and Chris chose a palette of gray and blue and asked their bridal party to wear whatever they felt most comfortable in within that palette.





THE CEREMONY

The couple was happy to be married under the old oak tree, and the florist added small touches to the altar, including eucalyptus leaves, which were used throughout the wedding. Leading to the altar were two vintage doors that had been found at the venue and propped up against an arbor. "The doors were [the idea of] Sarah's mother Christine, and she was right!" says Chris. Some flowers, lanterns, and candles were added, creating a perfect archway for the bridal party to walk through. "One of the best parts of the venue being a working farm is they had a lot of that kind of décor," says Chris. "Old rustic doors, the barn filled with drying garlic, rustic wooden benches, things like that tend to accumulate on a farm."









THE RECEPTION

For their flowers, Sarah and Chris used a lot of greenery, including eucalyptus leaves, while color was added with blue and silver thistle. "We think that Blooming Hill Farm is so beautiful on its own that we didn't need to add much in the way of colors and flowers," says the couple. "Plus, the eucalyptus gave a lovely herbal scent to the whole reception."

For the seating chart, guests' names were written on paper that looked like barn wood. Personalized signs were made from reclaimed wood and carved table numbers were recycled from other weddings.

The food was all farm to table from Blooming Hill Farm. For dessert, they served apple cider donuts, ice cream from Ferris Acres Creamery in Newtown, CT, where Sarah grew up, and a cake by Flour Power with s'mores filling. And because the couple likes wine, Chris pulled out a special Madeira that he had bought a case of at the age of 26 from Wine Geeks in Armonk. He wanted a wine that he could save for up to a 100 years and that would become an heirloom, perfect for a special occasion. All the details came together beautifully to create the rustic fall fête of the couple's dreams.

Allison and Scott had a very clear idea of what they wanted in their wedding venue: It had to be a private home, removed from New York City, with a view of the Hudson River. They also wanted a place with nearby hotels to accommodate guests, a venue for the rehearsal dinner and brunch, and a home on the property that could be used for family and guests. Their event planner, Claudia Hanlin of The Wedding Library, delivered with the Ankony Carriage House in Rhinebeck.

The venue is a historic Hudson Valley farm, complete with a renovated farmhouse, heritage cattle, and rolling hills.

"The bride and groom were eager that all the details would feel elevated, but not stuffy or too stiff and formal," says Hanlin. "Their touchstone was tradition, and the classic, lush décor was updated by its tailored elegance and the use of modern materials such as the china, fun dance props, neon signs, and bars."

















FASHION

The bride chose a Monique Lhuillier gown and veil for the ceremony and wore lacy Louboutins. The bridesmaids chose their flowing, full-length, slate-blue dresses from the salon at The Wedding Library to accent to the color palette of white, gray, and greige.

The groom wore a classic tux from Michael Andrews Bespoke, and the groomsmen were also dressed in classic tuxes.

Allison chose to change her dress and hair for the reception, and Hanlin says multiple changes of outfits, hair, makeup, and accessories is a growing trend for brides.

CEREMONY

The ceremony, which took place in the green fields on the property with the river as a backdrop, stood out with its natural beauty. Guests sat in whitewashed chairs, and a beautiful, floral ceremony arch stood as the altar, only adding to the majestic views as the couple said their "I do's."

In addition to the white blooms adorning the arch, the aisle was festooned with flower petals, and two large arrangements were set on antiqued Greek pillars (and were later used to decorate the bandstand).



The cocktail hour had a relaxed atmosphere, featuring lounge furniture, lawn games, and bistro lights. A cool jazz trio performed, and guests were able to take in the property.

The couple used marble hexagon tiles as place cards, to ensure they would not blow away, and the bride found the acrylic table numbers on Etsy — both of which are emerging trends.



"We've been seeing a lot of blush and cream, and we wanted to warm it up and give it a fresh pop with apricots and by introducing corals," says Goldman Cooke. "Also, lots of texture with the ceremony pieces and the bridal bouquets. There are little stops in the road in each piece, telling its own story as you go through it."

WHY IT WORKS

"I really love the wearables and the detail work," says Goldman Cooke. "The tiny little parts combine to make a beautiful event. Picking the color scheme, so many girls don't realize to ask the professional for our opinion. If you want a more unique wedding, ask, 'What have you been working on? What would you do to make it more personal for me?' Tell me about you and your future husband so I can help personalize your wedding."

"I was inspired by the bounty in New York state in the summer — flowers, fruits, and berries," says Kate Amato, owner of Viridescent Floral Design. "Almost everything here is locally sourced or foraged from New York State farms."

COLOR PALETTE

Butter yellow, ivory, and peach.

"Taking a different approach to
the typical summer palette, I would
describe our color palette for the summer vignette as a 'late August sunset,'

says Amato. "We used very little green and worked with soft, muted flowers in butter yellow, ivory, and peach and paired it with textural foliage in auburn, deep molasses, and hints of pale sage, all reminiscent of a late summer sunset. We wrapped the bouquet and boutonnière in a deep navy satin ribbon and a textural light periwinkle ribbon to contrast with the soft florals."

WHY IT WORKS

"This is an unique color palette for the summer season," says Amato. "Although all the florals and foliage are currently in season and locally grown, we combined the elements for an unexpected palette of dark tones and muted soft pastels, void of greenery. By exploring a new approach to the summer aesthetic, we challenged ourselves to really curate the florals through design."

"We gathered clusters of acorns and pine cones after a storm we had in the area to get a lot of the fall materials," says Brenda LaManna, founder and co-owner of Damselfly Designs. "We drew inspiration from looking up and looking down and being aware of our surroundings, appreciating the different hues of foliage that were just starting to change. I walk right on North Broadway and who would think in the center of the city there are so many natural elements."

COLOR PALETTE

Amber and cinnamon tones with chocolate and cream.

"We used a consistency of textures and colors," says LaManna. "The words 'chocolate and cream' came out when we were putting it together. Japanese maple has the tips of the brown that connects with the tips of the feathers. The color palette of fall is warm."

WHY IT WORKS

"The industry has shifted. Fashion sets the tone. We're seeing a lot of long trains and full, long veils. Bouquets went from small nosegays to more waterfall bouquets," says LaManna. "Our flowers are becoming larger and lusher and focusing on classic elegance. You have the formal table setting, but it's versatile; it can be broken down into layers. Bigger is better, which is my favorite and what we did here."



"We chose vintage pieces along with ultra-modern pieces for the china and glassware and layered textures to create a look that connected the old and the new," says LaManna about the place settings.
