
at sites like Dancing Tree Studios and the Walk-In Art Center. Creating art can help you unplug. We'll even let you take a selfie...don't tell anyone.

This all happens on Penn Avenue, West Reading's main street. #### **TRAVEL INTO YESTERDAY** ON COVERED BRIDGES, **AMID HEX SIGNS**

Take a ride on the road less traveled, and discover these rustic, architectural wonders! Spin your wheels and your imagination as you scare up fun and times gone by with the stories that make these landmarks legendary.

Tours include stops at:

- Dreibelbis Bridge: Built in 1869 by the great grandson of John Jacob Dreibelbis, Simon, a stonemason and carpenter who built several stone-arch and wooden covered bridges.
- Griesemer's Mill Bridge: Thought to be the oldest covered bridge in Berks County.
- Kutz's Mill Bridge: A historic wooden covered bridge in Greenwich Township.
- The Pleasantville Bridge: Built in 1852, it features an unusual truss system with trip arch supports.
- Wertz's Covered Bridge: Also known as the Red Covered Bridge, it stands as the longest single-span covered bridge in Pennsylvania, stretching 220 feet across the Tulpehocken Creek in Bern and Spring Townships.

While you're exploring our covered bridges, look for colorful hex signs on barns and fences across the countryside. A symbol of the Pennsylvania Dutch, this uniquely American art form traces its beginning to our German settlers, who replicated some of the artistry and symbolism of medieval Europe. Inaccurately dubbed superstitious "hexafoos" by Wallace Nutting in his 1924 book "Pennsylvania, the Beautiful," the name caught on and they eventually became "hex signs."

The self-guided tour covers nearly 50 miles, with many stops along the way. For more information and a downloadable tour schedule, go to www.visitpaamericana. com/partner/hex-barn-art-tour.



# Bike, Hike & Paddle Your Way Around

Calling all advenaline junkies!
Treat yourself to outstanding outdoor

Treat yourself to outstanding outdoor adventures in Pennsylvania's Americana Region. Cycle winding roads through our picturesque countryside or challenge yourself on daring mountain trails. Catch breathtaking views from atop Hawk Mountain or trek the Big Woods of French Creek. Swim, paddle and fish your way through our waterways. Great outdoor fun happens here!

#### ← ENDLESS TRAILS MEAN ENDLESS FUN

Earn (or polish) your mountain-biking stripes on the Greater Reading Trails System! Stretching over 125 miles of trails, it's the only Bronze-Level Ride Center designated by the International Mountain Bicycling Association in the Northeast, and one of only 41 ride centers in the world. The Berks Area Mountain Biking Association (BAMBA) maintains our trails, which range in difficulty from beginner level to advanced, highly technical rides. Visit our website for additional cycling and trail information.

#### **BIKERS COMES IN ALL TYPES AND SIZES**

Mountain biking isn't the only game in town. As mountain bikers revel in the region's miles of trails, road bikers celebrate the winding roads and demanding hills of Berks County. Many take advantage of the area's varied terrain and challenge themselves to gravel riding, long distances over unpaved roads and the fast-growing cyclocross biking, which takes riders over any combination of road, including dirt, mud and trails.

#### **HIT THE APPALACHIAN TRAIL**

What's the ultimate challenge for hikers? That's right, the Appalachian Trail! Reaching from Maine to Georgia, it runs straight through Berks County. For some of the trail's most breathtaking views, head to the Pinnacle. It's the county's second-highest point, and a great place to watch hawks soaring above you.

#### ← HAWK MOUNTAIN SANCTUARY

Speaking of hawks, this world-renowned sanctuary is one of the best places in North America to watch the annual raptor migration. You can also trek across miles of trails (including one that's ADA-approved) with astounding views of Berks County.



#### **GONE FISHING!**

The creeks and waterways around Greater Reading have some of the finest fresh-water fishing anywhere. Wonderful locations, ample fish, knowledgeable guides and outfitters make this your new fishing destination.



#### IN THE WATER 1

#### **Tulpehocken Creek**

A favorite place to paddle board, kayak and canoe, the Tulpehocken is also a revered flvfishing site. Considered one of the finest trout streams in southeastern Pennsylvania, the Tully is fished year-round. Other enjoyable spots to fly fish include Blue Marsh Lake, Kaercher's Creek and Lake Ontelaunee.

#### **Blue Marsh Lake**

Located northwest of Reading, Blue Marsh Lake's recreational facilities can't be beat. Enjoy seasonal outdoor fun like swimming and snowshoeing, as well as hiking, biking, boating and equestrian trails year-round.

#### Schuylkill River

Kayak, canoe or tube down this scenic river and let it wash away your cares on a hot summer day. The Schuylkill is not only a great fishing spot, it also boasts the Schuylkill River Heritage trail, along the river's banks. You can hike or bike for hours through Berks County starting in Philadelphia and ending in Hamburg. The Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission designated part of the river in Berks County as a hot spot for catching muskies.

#### **ROCK CLIMBING**


There are few activities that are as exhilarating, courageous and exciting than rock climbing. For those who dare, the Birdsboro Climbing Quarry welcomes climbers with nearly 150 routes. The former quarry has the most sport climbs of any open area in eastern Pennsylvania.

#### **UNDER THE STARS**

Embrace the great outdoors at family-friendly campsites in Pennsylvania's Americana Region. Pitch your tent, park your RV, or rent a cabin (maybe even a yurt) at privately-owned and state parks facilities across the area wonderful options for a weekend escape. Check the amenities at local campsites, then choose the one best suited to your ideal, nature-friendly getaway.

#### IN THE SNOW

Berks County welcomes the arrival of snow and all the cold-weather sports it brings to the region. Snow-covered parks and trails provide ample space to cross-country ski, snoeshoe, and ice skate. For downhill adventures, Bear Creek Mountain Resort is perfect for skiing, snowboarding and snow tubing, catering to all skill levels. If you'd rather stay warm, head for the resort's indoor pool and hot tub.

# **WEST READING**

West Reading has a vibe that makes you want to walk another block, stop in another inviting shop or stay for lunch or dinner - especially along Penn Avenue, its main street. There, thriving shops, restaurants and places to grab a local brew, an ice cream cone or a homemade pastry fill seven bustling blocks.

Just across the Schuylkill River from Reading, this town flaunts its history alongside its contemporary charm, with a full schedule of fun and festivities. Second Fridays on Penn are especially lively, with local musicians performing, and merchants offering specials and themed events for each season.

Even the French fry gets its own festival, and there's a Local Craft Beer Festival in April.

Elsewhere in West Reading, you will find our famous VF Outlet. Cherry Street boasts a collection of street art and murals to walk or drive by. The Mural Corridor on Cherry Street boasts 25 murals and mosaics, many produced by local artists. We honor the memory of our Mural Magician, Dean Rohrbach, who inspired and directed this outdoor gallery.

The Pagoda atop Mount Penn lets you know that you're in Reading, and that's just the start of an interesting and emerging place to visit. Historic districts throughout the city mark its past but the hotels, entertainment venues, arts centers and frequent outdoor events downtown herald its present and future.

> The downtown is a 24-block district, with tree-lined streets of homes, businesses and churches beginning at Penn Square on Penn Street, the main street. There, a beautifully landscaped boulevard divides the traffic lanes and spotlights the vintage

architecture and streetscape. Nearby are the Santander Arena, Santander Performing Arts Center and

the Miller Center for the Arts at Reading Area Community College. Residents and visitors alike can have their pick of entertainment.

Reading offers variety in its restaurant fare, too. Great things are happening in many establishments - brew pubs, American favorites, ethnic restaurants from around the world, and a taste of yesterday at the Peanut Bar, where the peanuts are on the house - and the shells on the floor.

Take time, too, to visit Reading's parks, its riverfront and its art center, GoggleWorks.

Boyertown is a charming small town with a thriving commercial area along Reading and Philadelphia streets, an antique railroad that still operates, and a gathering of bears that turn up in the darnedest places. It's a great place to spend a day or two, on and off the main streets.

The Civil War-era Colebrookdale Railroad Secret Valley Line runs from Boyertown to Pottstown. Enjoy a ride through the pristine valley in beautifully restored coaches. Stop by the Peppermint Stick Candy Store to satisfy that sweet tooth. Or, travel to town during their Oktoberfest, Philadelphia Street Fair or incredible

Artsy life-size bears are on the prowl throughout the historic district, but don't worry, they are harmless and charming. You might stage a scavenger hunt for the many colorful creatures.

While you're hunting bears, riding trains, shopping and taking in the sights, be sure to look up and admire the turrets, gables and peaked roofs that top so many homes and businesses. They'll leave a beautiful impression.

Remember Oley: Nearby is the area's smallest Main Street, Oley. This tiny town on the National Register of Historic Places takes you to a simpler time, with its homes and businesses side by side. The decades-old Oley Valley Community Fair, where you can eat funnel cake and watch a tractor pull, is definitely worth a visit.

# HAMBURG

West Reading has its French Fry Festival and Hamburg hosts — what else? — the Taste of Hamburg-er Festival on Labor Day Weekend. Too bad the towns didn't coordinate their dates.

Whatever the season, you're sure to enjoy this picturesque town with the Appalachian foothills just beyond its Main Street. Many of Hamburg's visitors come for its outdoor attractions — state forests, a county park and miles of hiking trails just outside its town limits. Hamburg welcomes hikers, bikers, birders, hunters and fishermen all year round. The Hawk Mountain Sanctuary is a special stop for birders, too!

There's plenty more to see and do in this cozy little town, home-grown shops to explore, an arts alliance with work from more than 40 area artists, a coffee shop, a drug store with a real lunch counter and ice cream treats, and the nostalgic Strand Theater. Stop by the Reading Railroad Heritage Museum for an authentic taste of the past.

#### **KUT7TOWN**

Kutztown's crown jewel is the annual Kutztown Folk Festival, but there is plenty more to do and see.

This Pennsylvania Dutch borough with its Kutztown University influence offers the best of town and gown, traditional and contemporary. Take a walk along the Main Street with its picturesque buildings from another century. There you'll find independent book stores, galleries, antique shops, homegrown boutiques, brew pubs and Pop's Malt Shoppe, a perfect place to stop for lunch.

Stay a night — or two — in the Main Street

Boutique Hotel, which boasts all the

charm of a Victorian home, paired with the amenities of a 21st-century inn. Within a short walk, you can sample everything from the college town classics — pizza and beer — to fine Italian

cuisine and gastropub fare.

That said, if you visit in summer, the Kutztown Folk Festival can't be missed. The festival celebrates 70

years in 2019, making it the oldest folk-life festival in the country. Immerse yourself in the Pennsylvania Dutch traditions, culture, food and fun. Just up the road, experience our Pennsylvania German Cultural Heritage Center celebrating the folk culture, language and traditions of the Pennsylvania Dutch.
