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Artisanal Soap Making has a Special History in Hot Springs

he process of making soap has been around for hundreds of years, and right here in Hot Springs, history is being made every day. Creator Charlene Simon has turned a centuries-old process into an art form with superior skin benefits. She began making soap in her kitchen as a hobby when she was 17. While her husband was serving on submarines in the U.S. Navy, Charlene began making soap not only to pass the time, but also because she found a unique beauty in the process. Creating something ordinary and turning it into a small treasure has become her life's work. She says "It's like baking a cake for someone, except they can't eat it!".

After years of her children saying "Mom, this milk tastes like lavender!" her husband built a designated space for her to pursue her craft. Over the past 20 years, Charlene has turned her kitchen-table-hobby into a multi-state chain of bath & body stores called Bathhouse Soapery. Ten years ago, she and her husband started Bathhouse Soapery in Hot Springs, right on historic Bathhouse Row. In the beginning, the soap making operation was small and all the soap was made in the back of the Hot Springs store-front. Bathhouse has become a must-see attraction for visitors traveling from all over the globe to the area, and for good reason...

Hundreds of years ago, soap was made efficiently once a year by using rendered hog fat and homemade soda ash. Stirred over an open fire, in a big black cauldron, a chemical reaction would take place. The resulting bar of lye-soap wasn't necessarily skin-loving, but cleansed well enough for the time. Poorly calculated recipes sometimes resulted in "lye heavy" soaps, which explains lye's bad reputation that lingers even today.

While the soap-making process remains in the foundation of Charlene's methods, she says, "the real secret is in the ingredients". Instead of hog fat and stove-top renderings, Bathhouse uses luxurious plant oils such as olive, coconut, and soy to create artisanal soap bars. Charlene's own decade-old recipe has been perfected down to the gram, creating a bar with a copious lather and nourishing benefits, especially

for those with dry, irritated, and/or maturing skin. Customers rave about how Bathhouse's soaps have aided with eczema, psoriasis, and infected skin issues. But the effectiveness is only part of the experience. Picking out a favorite soap scent and texture among the 50 varieties Bathhouse makes is the main reason why Bathhouse has become a jewel in downtown Hot Springs shopping.

Today, Bathhouse makes all of their soap in Hot Springs about two miles from their retail boutique. Charlene and four others, including her daughter, are privy to the exclusive recipe and process. Soap can be made with thousands of ingredient combinations, and Charlene has spent nearly 20 years crafting a recipe that is superior, effective, and indulgent. That kind of dedication to the craft is respected by the individuals honored with the duty of making it.

Charlene shares her knowledge of soap making as the VP of the

Handcrafted Soap & Cosmetic Guild. She also speaks all over the U.S. about her experiences as a soap maker and business owner. Above all, she enjoys living out her passion creating bath luxuries with her family and staff of nearly 50.

From early exploration of its healing waters and the city's infamous mobster past to its Major League appeal and Tri-Lakes reputation — there's a lot to learn about Arkansas' favorite tourist destination.

PARADISE FOUND


Visitors can't help but feel the thousands of years of history surrounding them in Hot Springs — history that continues to bubble up every minute. The hot spring water comes from rainwater that fell more than 4,000 years ago. It percolated 2,000-8,000 feet into the earth where it became superheated by surrounding rock before rising and emerging at 147°F from the area's 47 hot springs.

While no one knows when the first humans came to what is now Hot Springs, experts believe Native Americans were using the springs as a peaceful gathering spot as many as 10,000 years ago. The Native Americans called the area "the valley of the vapors," where tribes could put aside their differences and enjoy the rejuvenation of the springs. Oddly enough, this area became "neutral ground" again in the 1930s when mobsters from Chicago, New York and Los Angeles came to fraternize together and get away from it all.

EUROPEAN EXPLORATION

Spanish explorer Hernando de Soto is believed to be one of the first European visitors to what is now Hot Springs while on his quest for an earthly paradise — a fabled city of gold. Guided by Native Americans, he and his troops arrived in September 1541 to partake in the thermal springs. As far as it's known, de Soto was the last European visitor for more than 100 years, until French explorers Marquette and Joliet arrived in 1673 to claim the area



Over the years, Hot Springs became famous for its therapeutic benefits. The area attracted more visitors and developed into a well-known resort nicknamed "The American Spa" because it attracted not only the wealthy but also health seekers from around the world. It was believed for hundreds of years that the natural thermal waters could cure any number of ailments, including arthritis and polio. The baths faded as a medical treatment with the advent of modern medical science, but people still came by the thousands for relaxation.

Famous visitors who have frequented Hot Springs range from boxing champion Jack Dempsey, to performers Sarah Bernhardt, Liberace, the Smothers Brothers, Bill "Bojangles" Robinson and Presidents Theodore Roosevelt, Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry Truman. It's reputed that Tony Bennett first performed his signature song "I Left My Heart in San Francisco" during a rehearsal at the Black Orchid Club in 1963, and in the 1940s, actor George Raft could often be seen driving his convertible along Central Avenue.

BASEBALL CAPITAL

During the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Hot Springs was the off-season capital for Major League Baseball. The Chicago Cubs, Pittsburgh Pirates, Brooklyn Nationals, Chicago White Stockings and the Boston Red Sox all held spring training in Hot Springs. Babe Ruth first visited the spa city as a young pitcher with the Red Sox, but returned often for baths and rounds of golf.

In celebration of these deep connections to America's pastime, the city recently inaugurated The Historic Baseball Trail. A series of plaques and a smartphone-guided tour mark major moments in Hot Springs' baseball history

— like Babe Ruth's first 500-foot-plus home run achieved while playing ball at Whittington Park.

AMERICAN SETTLEMENT

In 1804, President Thomas Jefferson commissioned an expedition to explore the area. The explorers found a log cabin and a few rudimentary shelters used by people visiting the springs, but no permanent dwellers. In 1807, a man named Prudhomme became the first settler of modern Hot Springs, and John Perciful and Isaac Cates soon joined him.

In 1820, the Arkansas Territorial Legislature requested the springs and the adjoining mountains be deemed a federal reservation. Congress established the Hot Springs Reservation on April 20, 1832, to protect the hot springs area. This makes Hot Springs the oldest park in the National Park System — 40 years older than Yellowstone.

In 1921, Congress changed the name of Hot Springs Reservation to Hot Springs National Park, which now encompasses 5,500 acres. The park includes famous Bathhouse Row, which consists of eight unique, turn-of-the-century bathhouses in the heart of downtown.



THE GANGSTER ERA

From the 1920s through the 1940s, Hot Springs flourished as a place where the famous and infamous came to enjoy the thermal waters, luxury hotels and illegal gambling and bootlegging — especially in the 1930s. Gambling hotspots included The Ohio Club, Hot Springs' oldest bar, and The Southern Club (now the location of the Josephine Tussaud Wax Museum), which was reputed to be owned by mobster Owney Madden. He was one of the founders of the New York mob, was part of Murder, Inc., and owned Harlem's famous Cotton Club.

Illegal gambling was permanently shut down in Hot Springs in 1964, thanks to a federal crackdown on what the government called "the site of the largest illegal gambling operation in the U.S."

The father of modern organized crime, Charles "Lucky" Luciano (above, right) was arrested behind Ozark Bathhouse. Al Capone (right) regularly visited Hot Springs, even taking up part-time residence in Suite 443 at The Arlington Resort Hotel & Spa.





BATHHOUSE ROW

One of the most notable Hot Springs features is Bathhouse Row, which consists of a series of eight historic, architecturally unique bathhouses lining Central Avenue.

The Fordyce Bathhouse, built in 1915, is one of the most recognizable of the eight and serves as the Hot Springs National Park Visitor Center. The Fordyce Bathhouse is the largest and most ornate of all the bathhouses in town.

In 1922, the Quapaw Bathhouse was built in the Spanish Colonial Revival style and boasts a large Moorish-style dome capped with a copper cupola. Possibly the most interesting aspect is the basement grotto containing the Quapaw Spring, which serves as a natural steam room for the bathhouse today.

Buckstaff Bathhouse, built in 1912, is the oldest bathhouse still in operation. It was built in the Neoclassical Revival style, with engaged Tuscan columns that divide the main façade into seven bays flanked by pavilions at the north and south ends.

WATER WONDER

In 1871, pharmacist Peter Greene and his brother John bought Lockett Springs in Hot Springs and began selling mineral water they called Mountain Valley Spring Water. By 1928, the water's popularity and association with the health spa boom allowed the company to expand distribution — making Mountain Valley the first bottled water available coast to coast. Famous fans of the water include Frank Sinatra and Elvis Presley, and it was even the choice of the U.S. Senate in the 1920s. Today, visitors can explore the company's rich history at Mountain Valley's Museum of Bottled Water. The museum showcases nearly 150 years of bottles, barrels, photographs, specialized machinery and more.

AFRICAN AMERICAN LEGACY

Prior to the Civil Rights Movement, Hot Springs' bathhouses were racially segregated, with the best bathhouses catering to whites. Despite the injustices segregation caused, the city saw a flourishing of African-American bathhouses after the turn of the century.

The Crystal Bathhouse, built in 1908, was the first black bathhouse in the city and operated until a fire destroyed it in 1913. The Pythian Bathhouse & Sanitarium opened on the site of the old Crystal Bathhouse the next year and served patrons — including many black celebrities — until 1974.

Perhaps the grandest, the Woodmen of the Union, opened in 1922 with first-class hotel accommodations, a 2,000-seat theater and a steady stream of entertainers and celebrities during its heyday.

This year also marks a new addition to the festivities - the First Ever World's Shortest St. Patrick's Zero K Footrace. Winter brings with it a collection of can'tmiss events to Hot Springs. On JAN. 25, Oaklawn Racing & Gaming hosts an opening day event to kick off its racing season, which runs through May 4.




the Historic Malco Theater. Films under 10 minutes are showcased in genres ranging from music videos and comic sketches to dramatic vignettes and everything in between.

Summer in Hot Springs means plenty of festivals and concerts for all. Beginning in JUNE, Magic Springs begins its **Summer Concert Series.** Summer 2019 acts include the Eli Young Band, For King & Country and Ricky Skaggs.

On **JUNE 1.** behold the 14th annual Steuart Pennington Running of the Tubs, which at the finish line. features costumed teams

Every Independence Day brings the annual 4th of July Fireworks Show. The free fireworks display takes place on Lake Hamilton as soon as the sun goes down. The fireworks are shot from the middle of Lake Hamilton from barges located on the east side of Highway 7. Be sure to turn your radio to 97.5 FM US97 to hear the synchronized show.

As summer draws to a close, the 2019 Blues & Jazz Festival will be serving up steaming hot blues music in Hill Wheatley Plaza in downtown Hot Springs. The fest takes place AUG. 31-SEPT. 1.

When the leaves change, the Hot Springs events calendar heats up. The 14th annual Hot Springs Open Motorcycle Rally from SEPT. 6-8 is the largest motorcycle rally in the region. The three-day rally includes plenty of vendors, two poker runs, bike show, field events, bike games and a parade through downtown.

Also in SEPTEMBER, the Hot Springs International Horror Film Festival is an annual gathering of fright-loving fans and filmmakers from across the country.

Take a step back in time with the **Hot Springs Renaissance Faire** NOV. 2-3. Enjoy the merriment with jousting, one-of-a-kind shows, live action sword fighting, eat a turkey leg and stroll through over 40 shops filled with treasures from the past.

Get your workout on during the annual Spa Running Festival on NOV. 16. The fest features the Spa 10K, a 5K, a 1K Squirt Race for kids and a challenging half marathon that winds through the national park and both the North Mountain and West Mountain.

Wrap up the year with a tour of the Holiday Lights at Garvan Woodland Gardens, featuring 5 million bulbs casting holiday cheer on the 18-acre garden. The lights are up from MID-NOVEMBER through DEC. 31, closing only on Thanksgiving and Christmas days.

Many of the buildings downtown were constructed during a time when Hot Springs rivaled Las Vegas and Atlantic City as a gambling mecca in the South. Now the buildings house shops, art galleries, restaurants, music venues, theaters and museums.

xperience the opulence of an

Study the history of Bathhouse Row and the city's thermal springs at the Hot Springs National Park Visitors Center, housed in the historic Fordyce Bathhouse, or experience it for yourself at Quapaw Baths & Spa and Buckstaff Bathhouse — the only still-operational bathhouses within the park. Many downtown hotels also offer soothing baths and massages.

Wander behind the bathhouses and you will discover the springs themselves, still bubbling to the surface as they have for thousands of years. Stroll the halfmile brick path for a spectacular view of downtown as well as a quiet escape into nature. Several mountain trails begin along the wide Promenade.

You can ride (or hike) to the top of Hot Springs Mountain, where Hot Springs Mountain Tower stands above the National Park and offers a 140-mile view in all directions on a clear day.

Want a closer look at the National Park? Several more hiking trails await you on West Mountain. You can also drive to the top to catch more magnificent views of downtown.

Downtown is home to some of Hot Springs' most beloved eateries. Fuel up for the day at **The Pancake Shop**, a popular spot that tends to have long lines on the weekends (but those flapjacks are worth it). **DeLuca's Pizzeria** is a must. The restaurant makes its pizza dough fresh, by hand, every single day in limited quantities, but folks can call ahead and reserve their dough. Another Hot Springs mainstay is **Rolando's Nuevo Latino Restaurante & Speakeasy**, known for its unique dishes and the gorgeous back patio nestled against Hot Springs' West Mountain.

Downtown's nightlife scene is popular among tourists and locals alike. **Superior Bathhouse Brewery** is the first brewery located inside a national park and the world's first to use thermal spring water as its main ingredient. Or head to **The Lobby Bar at the Arlington Hotel** for a nightcap with a side of jazz music from Willie Davis & Co. on Friday and Saturday nights.

If you want a more comprehensive tour of the area, **Anita Lynn Historic Tours** are just the ticket. Anita's tours have been a staple in Hot Springs tourism for more than 30 years. Tour goers will experience Bathhouse Row, drive through the historic business district, see **President Clinton's former home**, hear about famous and notorious visitors, touch and taste Hot Springs' thermal water and much more.

On the northernmost leg of Central Avenue lies **1** The Arlington Resort Hotel & Spa. This historic hotel was once a home-awayfrom-home for notorious Al Capone.

The Pancake Shop is a must-try breakfast spot. Next door, you'll find a gourmet store called The Savory Pantry. Another nearby store is the Bathhouse Soapery known for its handcrafted soaps and gifts.

Take a tour through the one-of-akind Maxwell Blade's Curiosity Museum. Then, try your hand at an escape room experience at Escape Hot Springs.

Staying on Central Avenue, book a treatment at the historic Buckstaff or Quapaw bathhouses. And Superior Bathhouse Brewery offers craft beer inside a repurposed

bathhouse

For lunch or dinner, consider these local faves found on Central Avenue: Vault, DeLuca's Pizzeria, Rolando's Nuevo Latino Restaurante and Core Public House. And just around the corner on Grand Ave. is 501 Prime, a new dining hotspot with a wide selection of whiskey and bourbon.

Grab a cab or the car, because further down Central Avenue you'll find more can't-miss attractions, including **12** Oaklawn Racing & Gaming. Hopefully, you came during racing season (Jan. 25-May 4).

If not, you can still try your luck inthe newly revamped casino before heading off to enjoy delicious food at **Stubby's Bar-B-Que**, **La Hacienda** or **Bone's Chophouse**. Keep going. Central Avenue has even more to offer as you head toward the lakes. Stop at JavaPrimo Coffee House, Café & More for a gourmet latte (you'll need an energy boost for all this exploring!) or stay for a full meal (breakfast or lunch) at this beloved local establishment.

If you're looking for excitement, make a stop at Oaklawn Racing & Gaming

premier Thoroughbred racetrack since 1904, Oaklawn's live racing season runs from January into May. More than a million visitors every year flock to this Spa City icon, which was recently named one of the top 10 Thoroughbred racetracks on the continent by Horseplayers Association of North America. And with a total purse of just over \$30 million allotted for the 2019 season, Oaklawn is increasingly attractive to world-class competitors — especially for the Arkansas Derby, a stepping stone to the Triple Crown. Aside from the track, Oaklawn boasts live blackjack and poker (as well as electronic card game tables), roulette, craps, a high-limit area and hundreds of slot machines.

HIGH STAKES

The future of Oaklawn is looking bright with the announcement of plans for a huge expansion project costing in excess of \$100 million — making it one of the largest hospitality investments in the history of Arkansas. The project will include a seven-story hotel, multi-purpose event center, a larger gaming area and additional on-site parking.

The yet-to-be-named hotel will have 200 rooms, views of the racetrack on one side and the lakes on the other, an outdoor swimming pool, a luxury spa, fitness center and restaurant. Next to the hotel will be a 14,000 square-foot multi-purpose events center that will be perfect for concerts, meetings, banquets and weddings.

The project also includes the addition of approximately 28,000 square feet of gaming space and significantly expanded parking. Thanks to the casino measure passed in 2018, Oaklawn can bring in slot machines and table games, making it a full-scale casino.

RIGHT ON TRACK

Construction on the project will begin in May, immediately following completion of the racing season. The target completion date for the gaming expansion is January 2020. Oaklawn aims to have the hotel and event center completed in late 2020.

After a particularly rainy season in 2018, Oaklawn announced it will shift its racing season to later in the calendar and for the first time, racing will "Stay Until May." Typically, the season ended after the Arkansas Derby on the second Saturday of April, but now Oaklawn will be open until the beginning of May. It's the biggest change in the traditional Oaklawn racing schedule since World War II.



The new hotel will feature 200 rooms, views of the racetrack and nearby lakes, a luxury spa, a new restaurant, and an adjacent 14,000 square-foot multipurpose events center for concerts, meetings, weddings and more.

The crown jewel of the Oaklawn season has to be the Arkansas Derby. The derby was first held in 1936 and awarded a \$5,000 purse to the winning horse, Holl Image. Today, the Arkansas Derby boasts the highest purse of Oaklawn's races (\$1 million). The derby has been held every year since 1936, with the exception of 1945, when Oaklawn was forced to cancel its entire racing meet because of World War II. Tens of thousands of people from all over the state and beyond flock to Hot Springs for the derby, dressed to the nines in elaborate hats and colorful pastels. This year, you can catch the fun on April 13.

The jewel of this area is **Oaklawn Racing & Gaming**, a Thoroughbred horse track. It has drawn thousands of visitors over the years and has witnessed the rise of many champions, including 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah. In 2018, Oaklawn announced a \$100 million-plus expansion with the construction of a high-rise hotel, event center and expanded gaming area. While horse racing is hosted only from Jan. 25 through May 4, Oaklawn is open yearround (except Christmas Day and Easter) for off-track betting, card and electronic

games like poker and blackjack, and thousands of slot machines.

Further west, just off U.S. Highway 70, is the Mid-America Science Museum, Arkansas' largest hands-on science center. Families can experience a wide range of interactive science exhibits, including a virtual-reality simulator on a roller coaster and the chance to explore an "underground cave." The museum just completed a \$7.8 million renovation and is one of only two Smithsonian Institution affiliates in the state.

Popular restaurants like **La Hacienda** and nationally acclaimed **Stubby's Bar-B-Que**, bustling retailers like those at the **Hot Springs Mall**, and luxurious spas like **Destinations Day Spa**, pepper the Midtown area with even more vacation fun.

LAKE DISTRICT



Lake Ouachita is surrounded by the Ouachita National Forest and has one of Arkansas' most pristine shorelines at some 970 miles. Recreational boating, water skiing, scuba diving and other water sports are very popular on this lake.

Hot Springs' other famous water keeps visitors coming year after year

hermal springs aren't the only famous water in this resort town. The city is also regarded as a recreational hot spot thanks to three lakes on Hot Springs' southern and western edges.

Lake Ouachita, Lake Hamilton and Lake Catherine were created by dams on the Ouachita River primarily for hydroelectric purposes. Today, the lakes attract hundreds of thousands of visitors each year for boating, fishing, camping, hiking and nature watching.

Lake Hamilton is the busiest of the three, with shores that are dotted with lake homes, lodging rentals, marinas and restaurants. One of the most popular lake attractions is the **Belle of Hot Springs Riverboat**, which offers dining, sightseeing and dinner-dance cruises.

Lake Catherine includes **Lake Catherine State Park**, which features

boat rentals, boat tours, guided horseback trail rides and guided hikes, as well as a pavilion, camping area and visitor center.

Completed in the 1950s, **Lake Ouachita** is the newest lake, and at 40,000 acres, it's also the largest man-made lake in Arkansas. Known for its clarity, Lake Ouachita is a great spot for scuba diving. Divers can explore water that now covers valleys and ridges of the Ouachita Mountains. Fishing enthusiasts are fond of Lake Ouachita too; its waters are filled with bream, crappie, catfish, striped bass and largemouth bass.

The lake is connected to **Lake Ouachita State Park**, which offers camping, cabin and boat rentals, and wilderness trails. Several privately owned resorts dot the shoreline, including a visitor favorite, **Mountain Harbor Resort & Spa**.
