NAMESAKE

The city derives its name from a rock formation found downtown along the Arkansas River. The formation was named "La Petite Roche"

(the little rock) by the French explorer Bénard de la Harpe, who discovered it in 1722. Visitors can view the rock at La Petite Roche Plaza. The park includes a path that leads to the base of the Junction Bridge Pedestrian & Cycling Walkway where interpretive panels explain the importance of the site.

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

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Early Exploration

Arkansas' history dates back to 1541 when Hernando de Soto reached the state and found thousands of Native Americans living in villages near the Mississippi River, including the Parkin and Nodena tribes who settled across the state.

Almost 200 years later, French explorer Jean-Baptiste Bénard de la Harpe came upon a small rock formation on the south bank of the Arkansas River. He named the rock formation "la Petite Roche"— the little rock. Thus, Little Rock was born.

American Settlement


"The Rock" was included in the Louisiana Purchase of 1803, but a town wasn't established until the spring of 1820 when a group of men permanently settled there. Land speculators, who had Meriwether Lewis' pre-emption claims and New Madrid Certificates from the New Madrid Earthquakes of 1811–1812, soon arrived to stake claims of this land, naming the town "Arkopolis." The name was eventually changed back to Little Rock, and in the fall of 1821, the state's territorial capital was moved there. It was incorporated as a town in 1831 and as a city in 1835.

Construction of the Old Statehouse was underway in 1833 at Markham and Center streets and was completed by 1842. Schools were built by 1853, followed by gas lighting in 1860 and the telegraph in 1861, just in time for the Civil War.

Civil War

During the war, all activity in Little Rock stopped. After the Confederate Army left Arkansas to fight in the war, the state was left undefended, giving Union troops a chance to travel close to Little Rock in Searcy — about 50 miles away. It was then when the state government was temporarily moved to Hot Springs.

By 1863, Union troops occupied Little Rock and set up a provisional government. The Confederate capital was then permanently moved to the town of Washington. By the end of the war, Little Rock, which had a population of 3,727 in 1860, had a cemetery with the remains of more than 2,000 Confederate and 2,000 Union soldiers.

Reconstruction

After the war, Little Rock experienced a war of its own, the Brooks-Baxter War, when Republican Joseph Brooks seized the Old State House as governor after the government declared him the winner over Elisha Baxter. Both sides called the troops. Baxter appealed to President Ulysses S. Grant and U.S. troops were moved from the Little Rock Arsenal to downtown on April 20, 1874.

A special session of the legislature was called, which overturned the original election and confirmed Baxter as the governor. Brooks withdrew from the position.





Early 20th Century

The capital city started in the 1900s with the construction of the Arkansas State Capitol, which was finished in 1914. Some of the town's major staples were established, like City Hall — completed in 1908 — as well as the Little Rock Airport, named Adams Field at the time, and the Little Rock Zoo years later. During the year of the Flood of 1927, Little Rock Senior High School, now Little Rock Central High School, opened just in time for the fall semester.

World War II to Mid-Century

Because of war in Europe, Camp Robinson, located by North Little Rock and called Camp Pike during World War I, was reactivated in 1940 as a cantonment for more than 50,000 soldiers. This resulted in a severe housing shortage in Little Rock, which was rectified by the building of the Cammack Village suburb from 1941 to 1943.

Education took center stage years later in 1957 when the University of Arkansas at Little Rock was created, and the Little Rock School District approved an integration plan at Little Rock Central High School in the fall. There was local opposition, including Gov. Orval Faubus who called Arkansas National Guard units to prevent integration of the school. The federal government ordered the 101st Airborne Division to Little Rock, and under the guard of federal troops, integration at Central proceeded with nine African-American students, who later became known as the "Little Rock Nine."



Modern Era

In 1962, an urban renewal program in Little Rock closed many of the stores on Main Street, and in 1964, the Quapaw Quarter Historic District was formed to save old homes on the east side of town.

The framework for the transportation system was laid in the '60s with an industrial park and railroad, as well as construction of Interstate 630 in 1977 and the present terminal at the Little Rock National Airport in 1972.

The William J. Clinton Presidential Center & Library — named for Bill Clinton, the 42nd president of the United States who was also the governor of Arkansas — opened in 2004.

The Big Dam Bridge opened in 2006, crossing the Arkansas River atop the Murray Lock and Dam west of Little Rock. There have been strong efforts for revitalization across town. With a diverse lineup of restaurants, shops and museums and an influx of farmers markets and new businesses, the downtown area and West Little Rock continue to grow and offer locals an optimal place to live.

WILLIAM J. CLINTON PRESIDENTIAL LIBRARY & MUSEUM

THE HISTORY: The Clinton library serves as a museum and archive of the Hope native's two terms as the 42nd president of the United States. Opened in 2004, the library has since drawn hundreds of thousands of visitors to the city. The main museum tells the story of the Clinton Presidency from the campaign to his policy accomplishments over the years. The museum also houses over 100,000 items given to President Clinton during his presidency from foreign heads of state and beyond.

 $\textbf{BEST WAY TO EXPERIENCE:} \ Self-guided \ tour$

PLAN YOUR VISIT: While it's best experienced at your own pace, the library offers guided tours at 9:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and at 1:30 p.m. on Sundays. The daily tours are free with paid admission and reservations are not required.

TIME TO SPEND: 2-3 hours

ADMISSION: \$10 for adults; \$8 for senior citizens, college students and retired military; \$6 for kids

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 1-5 p.m. on Sunday

LITTLE ROCK CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL

THE HISTORY: One of the most emotional and thought-provoking experiences in the city is had at Little Rock Central High School. The facility is still a fully functioning high school, when over 60 years ago, the famous Little Rock Nine walked through the doors. They were the first African-Americans to attend the previously all-white high school and helped propel the civil rights movement throughout the South.

BEST WAY TO EXPERIENCE: Ranger-led tour

PLAN YOUR VISIT: Reservations are required for the two daily tours held when school is in session. Budget time to explore the visitor center and watch the compelling video presentation.

ADMISSION: Free

PLAN TO SPEND: 2.5 hours

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on weekdays, when school is in session; summer tours also available





ARKANSAS STATE CAPITOL BUILDING

THE HISTORY: Construction began on the capitol in 1899 and was completed in 1915. The most striking details on the building are the 10-foot-tall entrance doors made of bronze that were purchased from Tiffany's in New York for \$10.000.

BEST WAY TO EXPERIENCE: Guided tour

PLAN YOUR VISIT: Free tours are offered weekdays 9 a.m.-3 p.m. However, you can pick up your free copy of "Through These Doors," a self-guided tour brochure, at the visitor center on the first floor to explore for yourself.

TIME TO SPEND: Half an hour

ADMISSION: Free

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: You can explore the grounds anytime and can go inside the capitol from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. weekdays.



OLD STATE HOUSE MUSEUM

THE HISTORY: It's the original state capitol of Arkansas. Since 1833, the grounds have witnessed many of the most important events in Arkansas history, such as hosting the admission of Arkansas to the Union (and later its seceding into the Confederacy), two acceptance speeches by the President of the United States and even pioneering medical research about malaria.

BEST WAY TO EXPERIENCE: Guided tour

PLAN YOUR VISIT: Hourly guided tours are 50 minutes long and are offered every hour on the hour during museum hours. The last tour begins at 4 p.m.

TIME TO SPEND: 1 hour

ADMISSION: Free

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Saturday; 1-5 p.m. Sunday





MACARTHUR MUSEUM OF ARKANSAS MILITARY HISTORY

THE HISTORY: This museum is located in the historic Arsenal Building, a National Historic Landmark and one of Little Rock's oldest surviving structures. The building was constructed in 1840 to protect a frontier state from attack by Native Americans and would later witness pivotal points in the Civil War. The building is also the birthplace of five-star General Douglas MacArthur. Exhibits feature photographs, weapons, documents, uniforms and other military items that portray Arkansas' military history at home and abroad.

HISTORIC ARKANSAS MUSEUM

THE HISTORY: In 1939, Louise Loughborough recognized the historical significance of four shabby structures in a rundown area of Arkansas' capital city. On what was originally Block 32 of the City of Little Rock, some of the state's oldest buildings still stood. Loughborough began a one-woman campaign to save the block and succeeded in opening the museum in 1941. This historic site museum offers a look into Arkansas' frontier days via restored antebellum buildings, including the Hinderliter Grog Shop, Little Rock's oldest surviving structure (c. 1827).

BEST WAY TO EXPERIENCE:

Guided tours

PLAN YOUR VISIT: Guided tours of the grounds are offered on Mondays and Tuesdays, on the hour. Although self-guided tours of the buildings are also offered, you don't want to miss the hidden facts shared by tour guides along the way. You'll meet historic Arkansas figures who lived in the very houses their character did. One such character is Mr. McVicar, a well-to-do bachelor who made it big during the California gold rush and later returned with his winnings to Arkansas.

TIME TO SPEND: 2 hours

ADMISSION: Free admission to museum; admission to historic grounds are \$2.50 for adults, \$1 for children under 18 and \$1.50 for ages 65 and older.

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: Living history performances and period demonstrations take place Wednesday through Sunday during open grounds, from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Guided tours are offered Mondays and Tuesdays, on the hour.



MOUNT HOLLY CEMETERY

THE HISTORY: The cemetery, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, has been dubbed the "Westminster Abbey of Arkansas." This is because of the number of famous Arkansas residents laid to rest at the cemetery, including 11 state governors, 14 Supreme Court justices, five Confederate generals and more.

PLAN YOUR VISIT: For Mount Holly's self-guided walking tour, you'll want to grab a visitor brochure at the Bell House, located on the premises. Guided tours are also available, but reservations are

required and cost \$5 per person.

TIME TO SPEND: Half an hour

ADMISSION: Free

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: 8 a.m.-4 p.m. daily



BEST WAY TO EXPERIENCE: Self-guided tour

PLAN YOUR VISIT: The front desk offers a map to help guide you on your tour while you explore the various exhibits depicting different stages of Arkansas military history.

TIME TO SPEND: 1 hour

ADMISSION: Free

WHEN YOU CAN TOUR: 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday through

Saturday; 1-4 p.m. Sunday





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

DOWNTOWN

The bustling hub of Little Rock is situated along the banks of the Arkansas River. It's home to some of the city's top attractions, restaurants and recreational activities — all just a trolley ride apart. The heart of Little Rock's downtown lies in the River Market. On any given day, the area is teeming with downtown dwellers, employees and tourists who congregate in the Ottenheimer Market Hall. The hall is packed full with food vendors dishing up diverse cuisine — from burgers and Indian food to tacos and vegan fare. A few blocks away is the kid-friendly Museum of Discovery, which has been featured numerous times on "The Tonight Show Starring Jimmy Fallon."

Explore Little Rock's history by touring the Old State House Museum, Arkansas' first state capitol building turned museum. Downtown is also where you'll find the **Clinton Presidential**Center, which features rotating exhibits along with the main library celebrating the country's 42nd president. Nearby, visitors can learn more about the global nonprofit **Heifer International** as they tour the Urban Farm — a three-acre, multi-purpose garden.

South of the River Market on Main Street is the newly minted Creative Corridor. The area is home to many of Little Rock's beloved arts and culture institutions including the Arkansas Repertory Theater and Ballet Arkansas.

Further south, past I-630, visitors will find the MacArthur Park Historic District, Little Rock's oldest park. In addition to a playground, walking trail and a Korean War Veterans Memorial, the park is home to the **Arkansas Arts Center (AAC)** and the MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History. The AAC will be undergoing major renovations and adding 127,000 square feet, which will include expanded studios and education spaces, a black box theater, a family art adventure space and an indoor/outdoor restaurant overlooking the park. The new and improved AAC is set to open in early 2022.

Downtown is also home to a variety of dining and nightlife opportunities. Hot spots include Bruno's Little Italy, Samantha's Tap Room & Wood Grill, One Eleven, Dust Bowl Lanes & Lounge, Sonny Williams' Steak Room, 42 bar and table, Doe's Eat Place and many more.

Stickyz Rock'n'Roll Chicken Shack and the Rev Room are popular concert venues, and the Robinson Performance Hall brings large-scale musicals and plays to Little Rock. Cache Restaurant and the Capital Hotel are popular spots to enjoy a cocktail after a day spent exploring the city.

SOMA & EAST VILLAGE

■ he South Main neighborhood (SoMa, as it's lovingly referred to) is an area that's seen major growth and revitalization in recent years. The area is known for being a hip, artistic hub brimming with eclectic shops and one-ofa-kind dining. Stop by M2 Gallery to shop their artfully curated collection of local art and jewelry. Just up the street is the Electric Ghost where you can pot your own succulent or cacti to take home at their in-house plant lab.

When it comes to dining, SoMa pulls out all the stops. For the true Southern experience, dinner at South on Main is a must. The restaurant features musical performances, literary readings and film screenings that perfectly complements their menu, which puts an unexpected spin on traditional Southern fare. Nearby, The Root Cafe offers a vegan- and vegetarian-friendly farm-to-

table menu, and Dos Rocas Beer & Tacos is a new hotspot with traditional Latin American street food including tacos, empanadas, and pupusas.

If you're in the mood for something sweet, look no further than Loblolly Creamery. The Little Rock-based creamery makes small-batch ice cream, fizzy sodas and other sweet treats at their adorable shop in the heart of SoMa.

When it comes to nightlife, locals flock to Rock Town Distillery — the first legal distillery in the state after prohibition. The location offers tastings as well as an extensive cocktail menu. Further up the street, you'll find Atlas Bar, a new neighborhood bar themed around owner Tony Poe's extensive world travels.

To the east, you'll find East Village. The area is on the rise and is home to two of Little Rock's breweries — Rebel Kettle Brewing and Lost Forty Brewing. There's also a new food truck park called The Rail Yard, with a large yard for dogs and kids to roam. Cathead's Diner is one of the area's most buzzed about restaurants and features a buffet filled with barbecue, classic Southern sides and, of course, biscuits.

NORTH LITTLE ROCK

orth Little Rock is just a short drive (or trolley ride) away from Little Rock and offers its own unique array of attractions, including a charming downtown, a huge city park and unique Arkansas history.

Argenta is North Little Rock's thriving downtown area, located along the Arkansas River across from downtown Little Rock. The area is known for its historic charm and bustling Main Street. Locals enjoy the variety of arts and culture activities Argenta has to offer, including local plays and musicals at Argenta Community Theater and comedy shows at The Joint. The area is also home to the Verizon Arena, which brings in big-time acts like Justin Timberlake, Jimmy Buffet, Carrie Underwood and Bruno Mars.

When it comes to dining and nightlife, North Little Rock delivers. You'll find an intimate atmosphere at Crush Wine Bar, upscale offerings at Riverfront Steakhouse and cozy Italian comfort food at Ristorante Capeo. Things get lively at popular Benihana, Santo Coyote and Flyway Brewing, which recently received Guy Fieri's seal of approval on "Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives." And healthy options abound at local favorite, Taziki's.

History buffs will enjoy touring the **Arkansas National Guard Museum**, as well as the Arkansas Inland Maritime Museum, situated along the shore of the Arkansas River. The museum is the only place in the world where visitors can see two floating Naval vessels that were used in World War II. Further north, film buffs might recognize The Old Mill at T.R. Pugh Memorial Park from the opening scene in "Gone With the Wind."

North Little Rock is also home to Burns Park, Arkansas' largest city park with over 1,700 acres filled with sports complexes, a golf course, tennis center, waterskiing lake, archery range, horseback riding trails and more. The park also has its own amusement park called Fun Land and the One Heart Playground, designed specifically for children and parents with varying degrees of physical and sensory impairments.

The Arkansas Travelers, known locally as "The Travs," are a Minor League Baseball team based in North Little Rock. They play in downtown Argenta at Dickey-Stephens Park (the skyline views are a fan favorite). The stadium features a beer garden for the adults and a Kids Korner for the youngsters, complete with an inflatable obstacle course. Keep an eye out for nighttime fireworks during the season from April-August — that signals a Travs win.



Enjoy late-night live music; comedy from former SNL writers at The Joint Theater; baseball at Dickey-Stephens Park and fantastic dining. Follow Argenta Arts District on Facebook for upcoming events.

For those unable to climb the ladder into the submarine, no

worries: check out the exhibits topside, including a large diorama of Pearl Harbor just before the attack.

RIVERDALE

R iverdale is a vibrant neighborhood with endless recreational activities and celebrated restaurants. What started out as farmland and a major thoroughfare for rail lines, eventually flourished into the Riverdale of today — a hip, artsy area known as the city's "design district." Nestled at the foot of Cantrell Hill and stretching to the banks of the Arkansas River, Riverdale has a little something for everyone.

Some of the area's top attractions include waterfront access, multiple city parks, and of course, the Big Dam Bridge. Biking enthusiasts can hop on the 17-mile long Arkansas River Trail and bike west toward the Big Dam Bridge — one of Little Rock's iconic landmarks. The bridge has been named the longest pedestrian and bicycle bridge (4,226 feet to be exact) in North America built specifically for that purpose. Other recreational activities include golf at Rebsamen Park Golf Course, which offers sweeping views of the river valley.

The area is known for its close proximity to two of Little Rock's city parks — Allsopp Park and Murray Park. Allsopp features multiple trails that wind up into the hills of Little Rock, leading into The Heights and Hillcrest neighborhoods. Murray Park is situated right along the banks of the Arkansas River with a dog park, three soccer fields, two playgrounds and a boat dock.

When it comes to dining, Riverdale boasts a slew of all-star options. In 2018, Guy Fieri of the Food Network's "Diners, Drive-Ins & Dives" stopped by The Fold: Botanas & Bar and featured their delicious tacos (we're big fans, too). Local dining favorites include world-famous barbecue at Whole Hog Cafe, brunch at the Red Door and Creole fare from The Faded Rose. Be sure to try the tapas and mojitos at Riverdale's Southern Living-recommended hot spot Loca Luna.

Being the city's "design district," Riverdale's shops are full of interesting finds including decor, furniture and antiques. Stop by Fabulous Finds for fun antiques and Urban Pad for modern and contemporary decor. Tanarah Luxe Floral also offers a variety of home accents and gifts at the store located off Cantrell Road.

THE HEIGHTS

Once part of the Little Rock suburbs and known as Pulaski Heights, The Heights was incorporated by the city in 1903 and annexed in 1916. Some of the architecture of the period can be seen in the quaint bungalows and cottages that intermingle with stately mansions, and some of the homes offer breathtaking views of the Arkansas River and Little Rock.

Despite the neighborhood's age, it features some of the city's trendiest shopping and restaurants. Wine bars and bistros mingle with shops and boutiques where you can find a selection of the latest high-end fashions in a relaxing atmosphere.

If you're looking for a bite to eat, mainstays like Cheers in The Heights and Cafe Prego continue to satisfy. You can also indulge yourself at Sushi Cafe, Heights Taco & Tamale Co. and Lulu's Crab Boil, while the Prospect Sports Bar & Grill is always a great spot to enjoy a libation and check out a game.

Whether you're seeking art, décor, designer clothing, toys or books, you can find what you need (and then some) in The Heights' selection of upscale shops. Mr. Wicks is a high-end, men's fashion mainstay that has been open since 1960. Tulips, Eggshells Kitchen Co., Tipton & Hurst, Sissy's Log Cabin, WordsWorth Books and Steamroller Blues—the neighborhood is a shopping paradise for locals and visitors alike.

On the monthly Third Thursdays, the stores stay open until 8 p.m. and offer special sales, free wine and hors d'oeuvres. It's an opportunity to roam and experience The Heights in a lively setting.

Located west of downtown along Markham Street and the south leg of Kavanaugh Boulevard, Hillcrest is minutes from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the state's only academic health sciences center. The neighborhood also encompasses Allsopp Park, which features scenic biking and hiking trails, softball fields and tennis courts.

Hillcrest is distinctive for its patios, some of the best in the city, for dining, drinking and peoplewatching during perfect fall and springs nights in Little Rock. U.S. Pizza is a long-standing favorite, but

the versatile lineup of delicious destinations includes The Oyster Bar, Cafe Bossa Nova and La Terraza Rum & Lounge. From crispy fried seafood to new American to Mediterranean style, there is something for any taste.

At Haus Werk, "the boutique for everything," shoppers can find women's and kids' clothing, jewelry, toys, kitchen items, decorative art and more.

Midtown, southwest of Hillcrest, is a bustling mix of nationally known establishments and local flavor. The neighborhood is home to the Little Rock Zoo, War Memorial Stadium and War Memorial golf course, if you're interested in seeing the penguins with the kids, watching some football or getting in 18 holes.


Golf reigns supreme in Hot Springs Village with nine courses. For dinner, try Granada Grill located at Granada Golf Course.
