



Cowboy risktakers are willing to climb on the back of a bucking bronc or notorious bull for a share of the purse or a silver buckle and the ride of a lifetime. It can take just eight seconds - if you can last that long!

Saddle Bronc riding is rodeo's classic event, both a complement and contrast to the wilder spectacles of bareback riding and bull riding. This event requires strength to be sure, but the event also demands style, grace and precise timing.

Bareback riders endure more abuse, suffer more injuries and carry away more long-term damage than all other rodeo cowboys. Riding without a saddle, bareback riding has been compared to riding a jackhammer with one hand.




The Truck and Tractor Pulls Roar into the Grandstand Saturday Night
