





Brooks

Stop by the Seka Hills tasting room to enjoy varietal olive oils and delicious wines grown in the Capay Valley. Live music and food, too!

Looking for some rock and roll? The Road Trip Bar and Grill will be jamming all day! Stamp station is at the BZ Bee honey booth.

Esparto

Fill up on early morning pancakes, see local arts and crafts, antique car show, carnival rides, local farms, and learn about the Almond Festival

Hands-on grain grinding (Rumsey), petting zoo, pony rides and farming equipment (Guinda), Almond Blossom Farm Tours (Brooks), Native American Dancing (Capay) carnival rides (Esparto).

For the History Buffs:

"The Rock," Rumsey's origination (Rumsey), Guinda Corner Store, Yolo County's oldest, continuously operating store (Guinda), Almond Blossom Farm Tours at Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation's Seka Hills Olive Mill & Tasting Room (Brooks), Native American dancing at Road Trip Bar & Grill (Capay) vintage car show and Manas Old-Style Meat Market (Esparto).

February is always a fantastic time to view the incredible bloom of the Capay Valley's almond trees. There are many events and activities up and down the Capay Valley to enjoy.



About Esparto

With just over 3,000 residents, Esparto is the largest town in Capay Valley. Established in 1888, it was an important stop on the Vaca Valley Railroad line until 1941 when service ended.

The community is home to the Esparto Regional Chamber of Commerce (espartoregionalchamber.com) and Capay Valley Vision (capayvalleyvision.net).

Manas Ranch Old-Style Custom Meat Market (26797 HWY 16) sells "restaurant-quality" meats and family recipe sausages, plus speciality deli sandwiches and homemade jams. Sunset Magazine has claimed they have the "best peaches in the west" (manasmeats.com).

Esparto's Almond Festival Activities

Start the day at the Future Farmers of America (FFA) breakfast in Esparto High School's cafeteria from 7 to 11 a.m. The Almond Festival Queen and her court will be there at 9 a.m., before heading to Esparto Community Park (17001 Yolo Ave.) to check out the activities at 9:30. The queen and court will be formally introduced on the park's stage at 10:30 a.m, before traversing up the valley to visit Capay, Rumsey and Guinda.

Meanwhile, there will be 70 vendors set up in the park selling all types of wares, plus carnival rides and games for kids. Stop by the Esparto Regional Chamber's tent to get information on the day's events, and get your passport stamped.

The Esparto Regional Library's "Books in Bloom" sale will take place from noon to 4 p.m. (17065 Yolo Ave.), and the Master Gardners will "bee" on hand with pollination workshops.

Food choices will be plentiful. The Esparto Volunteer Fire Department will have tri-tip sandwiches and beverages for purchase. Food trucks will line the street between Esparto Park and El Toro Mercado (16939 Yolo Ave.).

The Almond Festival is a gathering place for various motorcycle groups and car clubs from the surrounding region. The Madison Fire Department will be sponsoring a vintage car show near the Esparto Fire Department, just south of the Scout Cabin on S. Grafton St. Prepare to be treated to a wide-range of tricked-out vehicles.

Esparto Park's main stage will feature live music from Desert Dan and Tim Slaven (desertdanmusic. com), plus a guest guitarist from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., followed by Jessica Malone (jessicamalonemusic.com) from 1:30 to 4:30.

More live music by the "Niteliters" can be found down the road (16867 Yolo Ave.) at The Ravine on Sixteen (theravineon 16.com) from noon to 4 p.m.

The Ravine on Sixteen, El Toro Mercado (16939 Yolo Ave.), Wygold Cafe (wygoldcafe.com) and Hog Canyon (16811 Yolo Ave.) will all be open for business during the festival.

Additionally, the Countryside Community Church's Country Store (26479 Grafton St.) will hold its Annual Giant Quilt raffle and host various food and craft vendors (espartocountrysidechurch.org).

About Capay

Capay has a long and colorful history, according to the Esparto Regional Chamber (espartoregionalchamber.com). Located on the Mexican land grant Rancho Canada de Capay, the town was originally named Munchville after one of the first white settlers, a man named "Munch" who built a house on the Cache Creek in 1857. It wasn't until 1868 that the first post office opened.

In the early 1870s the town was renamed "Langville" after John A. Lang who operated a hotel and owned a brickyard and store. "Langville" grew enough to have a town plat filed and the name of the town changed to Capay on Jan. 1, 1875.

Today, drinks and noshes can be had by visitors at Road Trip Bar & Grill (roadtripbg.com) and The Honey Store.

Farm Fresh To You (farmfreshtoyou.com) offers its CSA box out of nearby Capay Organic Farm (capayorganic.com), which also hosts occasional farm tours and events such as the "Capay Crush" (capayvalleygrown.net).

Weary travelers can find lodging at Capay Valley Bed & Breakfast cottages and farmhouse rooms (capayvalleybedandbreakfast.com).

Capay's Almond Festival Activities



About Brooks

Brooks is home to the Native American tribe Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation. The tribe farms hundreds of acres here and produces wines, olive oils, vinegars, honey and other commodities under its Seka Hills brand (sekahills.com).

The tribe also built the Cache Creek Casino Resort & Spa, Seka Hills Olive Mill & Tasting Room (adjacent to the casino) and Yocha Dehe Golf Club.

Ćapay Valley Vineyards (capayvalleyvineyards.com) also calls Brooks home. The tasting room (13757

HWY 16) is open weekends from noon to 5 p.m.
Both Seka Hills and Capay Valley Vineyards
are members of the Yolo County Vineyard and
Winery Association. Others include Simas Family
Vineyard (simasfamilyvineyard.com), Taber Ranch Vineyard and Event Center (taberranch.com), Great Bear Vineyards (greatbearvineyards.com), Berryessa Gap

Vineyards (berryessagap.com), Grindstone Winery & Vineyard (grindstonewines.com), Matchbook Wine Company (matchbookwines.com), Windmill Vineyards (windmillvineyards.com), and Turkovich Family Wines (turkovichwines.com).

Seka Hills Olive Mill & Tasting Room (19326 CR 78) will be open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Guests may sample the tribe's wines, sangria, olive oils, vinegars, honey, nuts and — wait for it — olive oil ice cream sandwiches. The deli will also have a selection of items for purchase.

Artisan vendors will be on hand during the duration of the festival, and live music by "Whiskey Rock 'n Rollers" will take place on the scenic patio from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Almond Blossom Farm Tours happen from noon to 2 p.m.

Capay Valley Vineyards (13757 HWY 16) will be open from noon to 5 p.m.

When owners Tom Frederick and Pam Welch planted grapes in 1998, there were no wine grapes growing in Capay Valley. Later, when applying for an officially designated American Viticultural Area (AVA or appellation), it was discovered that wine grapes had in fact previously grown in Capay Valley.

Planted by John Gillig, his Capay Valley Winery, under the supervision of Nicola Cadenasso, was awarded a gold medal in 1861 as the finest winery in California.

Today the tradition continues as Capay Valley Vineyards wins awards for its premium, small-lot Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah, Tempranillo, Viognier and Sparkling Viognier — the "champagne" of Yolo County.

The tasting room (13757 HŴY 16) is open weekends from noon to 5 p.m.

About Guinda

Guinda, which is Spanish for "cherry," was named by Southern Pacific Railroad officials after a cherry tree. The town's post office came to be in 1889 (espartoregionalchamber.com).

The Commons Farm Kitchen & Bar (thecommonsfarmkitchenbar.com) is a popular spot for lunch and dinner, and The Guinda Corner Store sells local produce and other necessities.

The Guinda Corner Store is older than the Almond Festival itself. Built in 1891 by Thomas Steele, it's the longest, continuously open store in Yolo County.

The store offers a nice selection of Capay Valley goods including wine from Capay Valley Vineyards (capayvalleyvineyards.com), olive oil soap by Pasture 42 (pasture42.com), Grumpy Goats olive oil (grumpygoatsfarm.com), Blue Heron organic oranges (capayvalleyfarmshop.com), and seasonal produce and eggs from area farms such as Full Belly Farm (fullbellyfarm.com) and Riverdog Farm (riverdogfarm.com).

The 22-acre Vernon A. Nichols County Park with creek swimming, beach areas, playground, picnic tables, baseball field and fishing is nearby. Visitors can also pursue the halfcare Will Baker Memorial Garden (yolocounty.org).

Guinda's Almond Festival Festivities

Live music will waft through Guinda all day, including selections from the Capay Valley Chorus, various instrumentalists and vocalists performing at Guinda's

Western Yolo Grange Community Hall (16787 Forest

New to the Almond Festival is "Group Therapy," a classic rock and R&B band (grouptherapymusic.com) playing tunes from 11 a..m. to 2 p.m., at Guinda Grange Hall and The Commons Farm Kitchen (7624 HWY 16) will feature Jon Emery Dodds & the Unconventionals (jonemerymusic. com) and Mike & the Mooncats from noon to 4 p.m.

Lunch and beverages will be available for purchase with gluten free options.

Guinda's Volunteer Fire Department will be selling their popular barbecue oysters, sausages and other barbecue treats.

For dessert, try Grammy Wyatt's Famous Almond Rocha, Nona's Walnut Rocha or the homemade almond (chocolate, vanilla and almond rocha) ice cream on offer.

A vendor fair will take place from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., with wares including leather crafts and ironworks, jewelry, embroidery, quilts, handmade glass, specialty soaps, bat and bird houses, hand-screened bandanas and lavender goods.

There will be a silent auction and olive oil tasting by nationally award-winning Grumpy Goats Farm as well.

Kids will enjoy the petting zoo, pony rides and various displays of farming equipment and machinery.

The Commons Farm Kitchen and The Corner Store will be open for business from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and the Guinda Park at the Guinda Bridge is always open and has two restrooms.

About Rumsey

Rumsey was originally called "Rock," due to a distinctive landmark, and a post office established the town in 1878. The name is perhaps fitting today as well, being the northern most Capay Valley whistlestop, a starting point from which to explore the area (espartoregionalchamber.com).

The town's present moniker stems from Dewitt Clinton Rumsey, a prominent landowner at the time. The post office was moved 10 years later in 1888, two miles to the north of "Rock," and subsequently the community became known as Rumsey.

Cache Creek Canyon Regional Park (yolocounty. org) is three miles north of Rumsey, with river access, swimming spots, picnic tables and overnight camping. Nearby Camp Haswell is a popular access point for kayakers and rafters. Rumsey-based Cache Canyon River Trips (cachecanyon.com) offers one or two day rafting adventures during warmer months, and Rumsey House B&B (rumseyhouse.com) offers respite for travelers.

Rumsey's Almond Festival Festivities

Fancy some almond petal ice cream? Be sure to put Rumsey on your itinerary.

The day's events include such culinary treats as wood-fired pizza from Full Belly Farm (fullbellyfarm. com), pulled-pork sliders and slaw, home baked goods — notably the aforementioned almond petal ice cream — and locally crafted beers.

Taste various almonds, honey and olive oil at the farmers market, try your hand at grain-grinding and check out lavender products harvested in the area.


