





THE STORY of **LONGMONT** The past, present, and future of the city we love





In 1900, vice presidential candidate Theodore Roosevelt made a campaign appearance in Longmont on a "whistle stop" tour. Two bronze statues at Longs Peak Avenue and Coffman Street commemorate his visit.

earching for a new place to put down roots, a group of prominent, ambitious men from Chicago established the Chicago-Colorado Colony. In 1871, the town became "Longmont" in honor of Longs Peak, the mountain named after explorer Stephen H. Long. The first flour mills were built in 1872, the Empson vegetable cannery was built in 1889, and what became


the Great Western Sugar Company was built in 1903. The area became well-known for the sugar beets that flourished here.

Our roots are in farming, and our farm-to-table heritage is still an integral part of our community today. But when you visit, you'll see that Longmont is also much more diverse now. Technology arrived in the 1950s when the FAA opened an air traffic control center and IBM built a large facility to the west. Things got even higher-tech in the 1990s, with



the arrival of companies like Seagate, Xilinx, and West Safety Services (formerly Intrado), and Smucker's got in on the act in 2019 when they opened a large manufacturing plant. Longmont is home to a dozen of Colorado's more than 400 craft breweries, and our downtown was certified as a Colorado Creative District in 2012.

We've also got some claims to fame that we're pretty proud of, like being the location of J.C. Penney's very first store (a meat market), and we're the hometown of astronaut Vance Brand, who flew on



NASA's Apollo Soyuz mission. Thanks to the city's livability, Money Magazine named us as one of the Best Places to Live in the U.S. twice. And, because of our ongoing commitment to building a vibrant community through civic engagement, collaboration, inclusiveness, and innovations, we were honored with the prestigious All-America City Award in 2006 and again in 2018; this award is given to only 10 cities nationwide.

Despite all the growth and changes since those Chicagoans first arrived to work the land, we still like to think of our town as a small one. You'll see why, as you wander into the shops, galleries, and restaurants in our quaint downtown, explore the bustling areas around it, relax in our parks, and marvel at the grand homes in the Historic Westside and Eastside. In each place, in every neighborhood, and with everyone you meet, you'll feel the warmth and pride of the community that has endured since Longmont was first established.

endured since Longmont was first established. Longmont's history is alive, the present is vibrant, and the future has untold excitement in store. We invite you to explore it all on your next getaway.







LONGMONT: AN ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT HUB

Downtown Longmont is an official Colorado Creative District, a prestigious designation awarded by Colorado Creative Industries. The district includes dynamic public art, art galleries and studios, theaters, venues for taking music or dance lessons, and so much more. And the rest of Longmont is pretty creative, too, with even more arts and cultural opportunities to explore. So sit back and enjoy some live music, take in an inspiring film, make something with your hands, or learn a new creative skill. Here's just a sampling of all that Longmont has to offer. Check the Events Calendar at www.VisitLongmont.org for a list of upcoming performances and other arts-related events.



The nonprofit **Firehouse Art Center** offers rotating exhibits in two galleries and hosts special events like the twice-yearly ArtWalk, the annual Catrina Ball that celebrates Día de los Muertos, poetry nights, and live music. Downtown also has numerous art galleries for browsing and shopping.



The annual Boulder International Film Festival screens several of its films at the Longmont Museum & Cultural Center. The Front Range Film Festival, held each February, visits several area venues. For more films, check the New Trojan Movie House, the Longmont Library's program calendar, and the museum's Views & Brews schedule.

Watch for the brightly painted electrical boxes throughout town those are part of AIPP's Shock Art Program. 

We're also pretty proud of the farm-fresh goodness that can be found all over town, plus down-to-earth activities like cheesemaking and apple-picking. Here are some of our favorite ways to honor and celebrate our important farming heritage.



The Longmont Farmers Market, featuring the longest market season in the state, is held every Saturday from April through November at the Boulder County Fairgrounds. The market brings together farms and artisans from all over the area to sell their veggies, fruits, eggs, natural products, and other farm-fresh bounty. Check out the market's weekly live music and events calendar at www.bcfm.org. There's also a Winter Market, the first weekend in December.

A number of local farms offer farm stands, farm tours, farm dinners, and other farm-related activities for the whole family.

Pick your own apples and enjoy famous apple cider donuts at Ya-Ya Farm & Orchard. The orchard also hosts special events like AppleFest in the fall and hard-cider-making workshops.





A quintessential stop for every visitor to Longmont is **Cheese Importers.** This family-run business, a staple in the community since 1976, offers more than 400 types of natural, organic, and imported cheeses. There's also a retail market and a French-inspired bistro.



For a glimpse into the fascinating agricultural history of Longmont, visit the **Agricultural Heritage Center.** This rural site focuses on the years 1900 to 1925, when families prospered as farmers and witnessed the coming of the Modern Age.

In the summer, drive along Trail Ridge Road, the highest, continuous paved road (more than 12,000 feet) in the U.S. Distance from Longmont: 35 miles.




