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Many College Choices

Many of the state's public universities, state colleges and private postsecondary schools have received national awards for their commitment to excellence. In 2019, Indian River State College and Miami Dade College won the Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence. The \$1 million Aspen Prize, awarded every two years, is the nation's signature recognition of high achievement and performance among America's community colleges.

Meanwhile, Florida is among the nation's top producers of STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) graduates, and is a global university leader in producing U.S. patents, led by the University of Florida and the University of South Florida.

Florida's public university system includes 12 universities with an enrollment of more than 300,000

students, more than 60,000 faculty and staff, and an annual operating budget of more than \$8.5 billion. Admission is competitive; students can increase their chance of acceptance by completing a rigorous curriculum in high school.

PRIVATE COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

Florida has 54 private, not-for-profit colleges and universities offering

four-year degrees. In addition, there are 11 private, not-for-profit colleges and universities offering certificate and associate degrees. The Independent Colleges & Universities of Florida (ICUF) is a diverse association of 30 private, not-for-profit, higher education institutions serving more than 150,000 degree-seeking students.

STATE COLLEGES

Florida's state colleges are the primary point of access to higher education, with 60% of the state's high school graduates pursuing postsecondary education beginning at a Florida college. More than 80% of freshman and sophomore minority students in public higher education attend one of Florida's 28 state colleges.

What's Trending in Admissions and Graduation

Admissions

For first-time freshmen, the most prevalent factors in admissions decisions made by colleges and universities are overall high school GPA, grades in college preparatory courses, strength of curriculum and admission test scores. Among the next most important factors are the essay, a student's demonstrated interest, counselor and teacher recommendations, class rank and extracurricular activities. That's according to the 2018-2019 Admission Trends Survey. compiled by the National Association for College Admission Counseling.

Between fall 2017 and fall 2018, colleges reported an average increase of 11% in the number of Early Decision applicants and 10% in related admissions. Similarly, the number of Early Action applications increased by 10%, and the number of students accepted through that early process increased by 9%, as revealed in the NACAC's 2018-2019 Admission Trends Survey.

Top factors in admissions decisions for first-time freshmen:

- > Overall high school GPA
- > College prep course grades
- > Curriculum
- > Admission test scores

Students seeking admission to college are applying to more schools than in the past. Acceptance rates are also increasing, according to U.S. Department of Education data. Between the fall 2017 and fall 2018 admission cycles, the number of applications from first-time freshmen increased 6%, and international student applications increased by 7%. Meanwhile. the national average acceptance rate for first-time freshmen across all U.S. four-vear institutions was 66.7% in fall 2017, slightly better than in fall 2012. The average rate at private institutions was 64.9%, compared to 70.3% for public institutions. The "most selective" four-year colleges enrolled 21% of first-time undergraduate students while receiving 37% of all fall 2016 applications. "Most selective" is defined as those accepting less than half of all applicants.

Graduation

The standard six-vear graduation rate for first-time, full-time undergraduate students who began seeking a bachelor's degree at four-vear degree-granting institutions in fall 2011 overall was 60%. That is, by 2017 they completed a bachelor's degree at the same institution where they started in 2011, according to The Condition of Education 2019, a study published by the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics. More specifically, the six-vear graduation rate was 60% at public institutions. 66% at private nonprofit institutions and 21% at private for-profit institutions.

Paving for College

According to How America Pays for College 2019, a national study of college students published by Sallie Mae, 70% of parents and students believe college is worth the investment - considered either appropriately priced, a bargain or worth every penny. Also, 79% of parents and 75% of students are willing to stretch themselves financially to pay for college, while 80% of families feel confident about how they're paying for college, and 44% have a plan to pay for all years of college.

Academically Speaking

Is your student not certain about a major? It's common. As many as half of students enter college undecided about which major to pursue. Plus, an estimated 75% change their major at least once over the course of their studies. As a result, most Florida colleges now allow students to essentially create their own major through an interdisciplinary studies major, which offers course flexibility.

Here are other relatively uncommon study options to keep in mind:

CLEP: The College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) enables students to earn college credit while still in high school. Students don't have to sit through a class to get credit; they only have to pass a subject-matter exam.

DUAL ENROLLMENT: Like CLEP, dual enrollment allows students to earn college credit while they're still in high school, However, unlike CLEP, students must attend class either at their high school or a local state college.

COLLEGE CREDIT CERTIFICATE: a series of college-credit courses that prepares students for entrylevel employment in specific career fields or for career advancement.

CAREER CERTIFICATE: an educational certificate that specifically prepares students to work in a chosen field.

UNDERGRAD CERTIFICATE: provides students with a solid foundation in a chosen area of study, or major, and is designed to facilitate a transfer into a degree program.

ADVANCED TECHNICAL CERTIFICATES: designed for students who have already completed a degree (at least an associate degree) and are seeking advanced, specialized prep in a specific career field.

FIRST PROFESSIONAL DEGREE: prepares students to work in a particular profession, typically meeting the academic requirements for licensure or accreditation.



WORTH THE DEGREE

People with a bachelor's degree make more than twice as much as those without a high school diploma or GED. Men with a graduate degree earn more than \$1.5 million more in lifetime earnings than those with just a high school diploma, while women earn \$1.1 million more, according to statistics from the Social Security Administration.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Common App (commonapp.org) is a way to apply to multiple schools — actually nearly 900 colleges and universities — with one online click. The application's basic information is automatically copied and shared with the member schools selected by the student, eliminating the need for repeated applications. Also, although many schools require supplemental information specific to them, the submission process can take place through the Common App.

Financial Aid

While the average annual in-state tuition at a public fouryear institution in Florida costs approximately \$6,300 - one of the lowest rates nationwide – financial aid typically is a big consideration, especially when higher private-school tuitions are factored. That makes financial aid an option that should be understood.

The most common types of financial aid:

SCHOLARSHIPS: don't have to be repaid. They're based on a variety of factors, including but not limited to financial need, academic standing, the college the student is attending and community service accomplishments.

LOANS: have to be repaid, often with interest. Lower interest rates may be available to those who demonstrate financial need, but everyone may qualify.

GRANTS: don't have to be repaid, but not everyone qualifies. Usually, qualification is based on financial need.

WORK/STUDY: earned money so there's nothing to repay. Work/ study programs provide students who demonstrate financial need with a part-time job where they can earn money while taking classes. The jobs may be located on or off campus, and the work schedules are designed to not interfere with a student's course load.

DID YOU KNOW?

Since 1988, the Florida Lottery has contributed more than \$34 billion to education and has sent more than 800.000 Florida students to college on Bright Futures Scholarships. Depending on a student's grades. test scores and volunteer activity, the scholarship may cover up to 100% of tuition and fees and help with other educational expenses.

Remember This Acronym: FAFSA



To find out what type of financial aid students qualify for, families must have to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly referred to as the FAFSA. Even if a family doesn't demonstrate financial need, filling out the FAFSA still is highly recommended. Some scholarships and programs require the student to have one on file even if their aid is not dependent on family income. According to recent national data, nearly eight in 10 families (77%) complete the FAFSA to get access to more than \$150 billion in financial aid. Funds are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. And there's no charge to apply. (Go to fafsa.ed.gov.)





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MISSION: The mission of the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine (LECOM) is to prepare students to become osteopathic physicians, pharmacy practitioners and dentists through programs of excellence in education, research, clinical care and community service to enhance the quality of life through improved health for all humanity. The school's professional programs are dedicated to serving all students through innovative curriculums and the development of postdoctoral education and interprofessional experiences.

ACADEMICS: Students have options when it comes to earning their degrees at LECOM. The College of Osteopathic Medicine features five unique, student-centered learning pathways, each tailored to accommodate students' preferred learning styles. LECOM's School of Pharmacy allows students to earn their degrees through an accelerated threeyear program; a four-year program, either in the classroom or through an online distance education program, is also available. The School of Dental Medicine, based at LECOM Bradenton, sends fourth-year students to dental practices in Defuniak Springs, Florida, and Erie for hands-on, real-world training. ACADEMICS: As the only legislatively designated Honors College of Florida, New College offers a rigorous curriculum customized to students' academic and career goals. Small classes and frequent interaction with professors contribute to a personalized learning experience where students can develop their own ideas, produce original research, and explore new fields of personal and professional interest. The college offers nearly 40 areas of study in natural sciences, mathematics, arts, humanities, and social sciences. Approximately one-third of our students major in STEM fields. Students receive performance evaluations from faculty that provide more detailed feedback than letter grades. The culmination of every student's education is the senior thesis project, which can be a significant research paper, findings from a scientific study, a body of artwork, or a theatrical production.

UNIQUE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS: All students participate in independent study projects each January and complete a senior thesis project in their final year. Students can also embark on a tutorial, an academic undertaking sponsored by a faculty member that is not offered as a class in the Course Catalog.
