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




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Choose Alzheimer's Care



earning that you or a loved one has Alzheimer's or dementia is a devastating, radically life-altering experience, so you'll want to choose the best care available.

According to the Alzheimer's Association, the first step in choosing the right care provider is determining the care needs of the person with dementia. When possible, involve the person with dementia in care decisions.

Deciding how much care a person needs depends on such factors as how independently he or she can walk, eat, use the restroom and bathe. A person with dementia may still live independently early on, but in the middle stages, around-the clock supervision will be needed and becomes more intensive as the disease progresses.

The care facility should conduct evaluations to determine where your loved one falls in the Alzheimer's spectrum — beginning, middle or end stage. The care they give will fit the personal needs of the individual.

After the initial assessment, the facility should be assessed on a regular basis, as individual needs can change according to the symptoms experienced. The center should be able to adapt to the changing needs.

In-patient or home care?

Depending on which stage you or your loved one fall on the spectrum will determine the need for either in-patient or home care. Naturally, the later stages of the disease may require in-patient care at a treatment facility. Here are some factors to consider when choosing a facility:

When choosing a residential facility, tour the entire center. Ask to see a model resident room, and if permitted, ask to speak to some residents or family members.

How is the living environment at the facility?

Are the rooms clean and comfortable? Are there quiet areas for reading?

Do outdoor activities inspire activity?

Does the center have group activities, special outings and other services?

Quality centers provide supervised picnics, fitness and craft classes, religious events and even field trips to enhance the care of the residents. Active people stay healthier longer.





any people today are faced with neck and back pain issues. About 10% of the patients visiting a doctor complain that they are experiencing neck or back pain. The cost of this problem can sum up to \$86 billion each year.

A quarter of these back pain patients will experience the same problem within a year. It is also the leading cause of absences among employees in the US. People who also carried this problem for 6 months or more rarely return to work. This is the reason why it is known as the most expensive cause of work disability in the country.

This problem doesn't only happen to the US but also in other countries like Australia. More than 50% of their work force suffers from it and costs them over \$10 billion every year. This is the reason why back pain is known as a serious problem. Fortunately, treatment options are widely available for this type of condition.

What is spinal decompression?

If your condition can be remedied with the most conservative treatment available, it is best to try that option first. Chiropractic, acupuncture, physical therapy, pain medications, etc. should be the first thing to consider to help with your condition.

Whenever spinal decompression is an option, you should consider that first, but then what is it exactly?

To simply explain it, spinal decompression is a computer-aided technology that gently extends the spine to treat decompressed joints while making the disc bulges or herniations return to their original position. You don't have to worry about this method of treatment because the FDA approves it and it comes with a very high success rate.

There have been several studies conducted already and many of them are still being evaluated with regards to the treatment's success and its improvement on the results. In North America alone, more than 7,000 clinics are providing this treatment and it continues to grow every year. It is considered a great alternative to surgery and it is effective in treating bulging, herniated discs and other conditions like sciatica.

Is the treatment painful?

During the treatment, the patient is fitted with a special harness and is asked to lay down on the machine bed/table. Depending on the clinic, the decompression will be performed either with the use of a specialized machine or simply by the hands of a licensed chiropractor. If your condition is severe. you might experience some mild discomforts during the early treatments but it will start disappearing after several sessions.

You should know that the treatment is completely safe and can even be relaxing. In fact, some patients even fall asleep during their treatment.

What is the normal treatment period?

These drugs have names such as Gabapentin, Lyrica, Cymbalta, and Neurontin, and are primarily antidepressant or anti-seizure drugs. These drugs may cause you to feel uncomfortable and have a variety of harmful side effects.





Figure 2: When these very small blood vessels become diseased they begin to shrivel up and the nerves begin to degenerate.

Peripheral neuropathy is a result of damage to the nerves often causing weakness, pain, numbness, tingling, and the most debilitating balance problems. This damage is commonly caused by a lack of blood flow to the nerves in the hands and feet, which causes the nerves to begin to degenerate due to lack of nutrient flow.

As you can see in Figure 2, as the blood vessels that surround the nerves become diseased they shrivel up which causes the nerves to not get the nutrients to continue to survive. When these nerves begin to "die" they cause you to have balance problems, pain, numbness, tingling, burning, and many additional symptoms.

The main problem is that your doctor has told you to just live with the problem or try the drugs which you don't



like taking because they make you feel uncomfortable. There is now a facility right here in Vacaville that offers you hope without taking those endless drugs with serious side effects. (see the special neuropathy severity examination at the end of this article)

In order to effectively treat your neuropathy three factors must be determined.

- 1) What is the underlying cause?
- 2) How Much Nerve Damage has Been Sustained?

NOTE: Once you have sustained 85% nerve loss, there is likely nothing that we can do for you.

3) How much treatment will your condition require?

The treatment that is provided at Absolute Family Chiropractic has three main goals:

- 1) Increase blood flow




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

our peripheral nervous system is a collection of nerves that connects your brain and spinal cord, or central nervous system, to the other parts of your body. It includes your arms, face, feet, hands, legs, mouth, and internal organs.

These nerves are responsible for delivering signals regarding physical sensations back to your brain.

Peripheral neuropathy is a disorder that happens when your nerves malfunction due to damage. Your nerves will no longer function normally. They may send pain signals even if there is no pain or they won't send pain signals even if something is already harming you. Peripheral neuropathy can be caused by:

- Diabetes
- Chemotherapy
- Alcohol
- An injury
- A systemic illness
- An autoimmune diseasejust to name a few Pain from this condition is awful but natural approaches to help with the pain are available. The important thing is to identify if it's caused by a serious underlying condition, and if so, which one.

1. - 6. Peripheral neuropathy is a serious complication of diabetes — If you have peripheral neuropathy or limb loss, it indicates that your diabetes is becoming more serious. This is the reason why diabetes should be managed as early as possible. You should always take care of your feet and act right away once you notice the signs and symptoms of peripheral neuropathy.

- 7. High dose vitamin therapy is good for peripheral **neuropathy** — Years of study has shown success in the treatment of both the causes and symptoms of peripheral neuropathy through high doses of vitamins. There are also natural remedies which can be used since they are also safe, effective, and won't produce any side effects. You also shouldn't have to worry about drug interactions with the majority of natural supplements but make sure to always consult with your doctor

- 9. Peripheral neuropathy affects more people than diabetics — Peripheral neuropathy is very common in diabetics, but it can also be present in patients with other conditions. It can come from other causes such as chemotherapy and alcohol abuse. It may also be more prevalent in certain populations who have a family history of diabetes or neuropathy.
- **10. Neuropathy won't go away on its own** If you think that letting neuropathy heal on its own, then you're wrong! Your symptoms and condition may even worsen unless you do something about it. Don't pick a shop based on cost; poor repair work will mean higher costs in the long run. You'll also want to ask about the shop's warranty policy. Imagine spending hundreds on a repair only to learn the work isn't quaranteed.

Start Small

- **Joints:** By rolling cannabis in paper, often made from hemp, rice and bamboo, the product can be smoked like it has been for generations.
- **Blunts:** Rolling cannabis in cigar paper made from nicotine-filled tobacco plants gives it a unique flavor, but it adds health and medical risks that deter many healthconscious users.
- Hand pipes: Perhaps the most common smoking device available today, hand pipes are small and easy to use. They trap the smoke from burning cannabis, which the consumer can subsequently inhale.
- Water pipes: Devices such as bongs use liquid to cool the smoke from burning cannabis. Available in all shapes and sizes, water pipes offer a different sensation that some people consider more pleasant.
- Vaping: Health-conscious consumers often turn to products that deliver the chemicals from cannabis in a vaporized form. There are fixed models, which require a power source, and smaller portable versions that can easily be transported.
- Edibles: Foods or drinks containing cannabis are also available. They are known for having a significant psychoactive effect on the entire body. Be aware, though, that they have a longer onset time compared to smoking or vaping, which deliver the cannabis chemicals to the blood stream much faster.
- **Tinctures:** For controlled dosage and fast effects, some consumers buy a liquid cannabis extract that can be placed under the tongue. A few drops of the product can be easily measured. and it offers a quick response as it is absorbed into the body.
- Ingestible Oils: Falling halfway between concentrates and edibles are oils that you can ingest. You can swallow and digest them like food, but they offer consistent dosing like concentrates.

— **Topical creams:** While they don't offer the same "high" as other methods, some consumers buy products that can be applied directly to the skin for localized relief.
