

#### Sunsets, Sunrises, Dark Sky Spots

There's nothing like an ESVA sunset. If you've come for a beach day, weekend getaway, or week-long relaxation sesh, you know this is true! It is rare to find a place on the East Coast where you can watch the sunset over the beautiful Chesapeake Bay. We don't take the view for granted, which is why we always talk about it!

On this trail, we focus on the best places to watch the sunset, sunrises for you early birders, and areas where the night sky shines so bright, it feels like you could reach out and grab a star. If you love landscape photography or night sky photography, this is the trail for you. If you want to snap a shot of the kids that they will one day look back on, this is a great trail for that too.

No matter if you merely want to watch the sunrise over the Atlantic bundled up with friends, look for shooting stars, or watch the sky turn into cotton candy above the bay, this trail has all of the information you need.

#### Bike & Hike

The Eastern Shore of Virginia is known for its nature for more than one reason, but a big reason is the gorgeous nature trails on both sides of Route 13. 

# Love and Learning Trail

With the kids at home, having some outdoor, educational destinations makes the difference between a fun, engaging day exploring or another day virtually learning from home. This trail has been designed with you and your family in mind to bring you to some sites where you can learn a thing or two about history and science and have fun while you're doing it.

The Eastern Shore of Virginia is rich in American history and natural conservation efforts. Want to spend an afternoon immersing yourself in biodiversity? Walk the butterfly trail in the spring or fall to see the monarch butterflies during their biannual migration and spot the other critters you see along the way. Want to know more about the battles of the Revolutionary War? Head to Scott Hall Cemetery and discover Commodore Whaley's heroic naval movement at Onancock Creek. Want to discover the railroad system? Head to the Eastern Shore Railway Museum in Parksley to tour historical rail cars, artifacts, buildings, and more.





#### Beaches

The Eastern Shore of Virginia is the definition of coastal. With the Chesapeake Bay to the west and Atlantic Ocean to the east, beach days can vary in quiet days on the calm waters of the bay or exciting days full of boogie boarding and surfing on the ocean. While there are some popular beaches, like Cape Charles Beach or Assateague, there are also some more off the beaten path like Tangier Island, the Barrier Islands, Savage Neck Dunes, and Kiptopeke State Park.

Make dribble castles with family on the edge of the earth while the waves roll in on Assateague Island or play volleyball with friends on Cape Charles Beach. Bring your chair into the shallows of Kiptopeke State Park's beach to cool off and enjoy the view of the eerie concrete ships. Boat out to the wild barrier islands for an adventurous ride that leads into a calm day of watching the sea birds fly overhead as the waves crash into the shoreline. Head to Tangier for a unique experience where the locals will treat you like family. Or hike the trails of Savage Neck Dunes to get to the beautiful beach there, and make sure you check out the dunes while you are there.

# Lovin' on the Water Trail

#### Watersports/Activities

Exploring both the Chesapeake Bay and the Atlantic Ocean are unique experiences you can't get anywhere else in Virginia. If you want to launch the kayak out onto a serene creek, hire a tour guide for a run down on the ecosystem and historical significance of the area, captain your own ship (or Carolina Skiff) for a barrier island beach day, find the best fishing spots, or hit the water bright and early for some waterfowl hunting, this list is for you.

This list is broken down to guide you to local ecotour guides, kayaking guides, kayaking & SUP board rentals, guided fishing trips, guided hunting trips, and launch points for your own watercrafts. Enjoy sunny days full of dolphin sightings, watching ospreys wade through marshes, and water lapping peaceful shorelines.



# **HISTORY**





#### LAST CENTURY

This is a land of farmers and of seafaring creatures who enjoy the grit of sand between the toes and the sweet aroma of a seaside tidal flat at low water. The process of growing crops and delivering them to market created waterfront communities like Onancock, Chincoteague, Cape Charles, Willis Wharf and Wachapreague. In 1884, when the railroad came through, it brought about a great change in how farmers got their food to market, and so it shaped history just as the sailing ships did, and the steamships that came after them. Thanks to the railroad, the Eastern Shore of Virginia was among the

most prosperous rural regions in the United States in the earliest part of the 1900s.

In more recent years, the boxcar has given way to the 18-wheeler. Our clams are spawned in laboratories and shipped to market in jets. Sail gave way to steam, which gave way to rail, which gave way to highway. The things that endure are the land and the sea.

# **LOWER SHORE**



#### THE GATEWAY TO THE EASTERN SHORE

is the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, an architectural wonder, where drivers cross some 18 miles of open water.

Those who travel the famed bridge deserve a reward, and the Lower Shore delivers. Relaxing on wild beaches are matched by bike rides along maritime forests and every night brings the bounty of the sea to the table. Cape Charles is the perfect small town for shopping, beach days, golfing and outdoor adventure. Dock the boat at the Cape Charles Harbor or the Oyster Farm at Kings Creek Marina. Spot an enormous mega yacht docked at the Cape Charles Yacht Center or bring your own. Experience bayfront golf courses at Bay Creek Resort & Club. Put around town on a golf cart like a local to have the authentic Cape Charles experience.

Park the camper at one of our family camping resorts and try the famed Cherrystone littlenecks roasted over the campfire for a completely unique experience.

Fish at any hour of the day at Kiptopeke State Park, where the fishing pier lights stay on 24 hours a day. Explore the park by foot during the autumn months to discover a plethora of migrating birds. Join the anchored boats offshore from the Chesapeake Bay KOA Resort with stunning views of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, food and drinks are a hop, skip, and a jump away at the Jackspot at Sunset Beach.

#### THE CHESAPEAKE BAY BRIDGE-TUNNEL: AN ENGINEERING MARVEL

The Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel (CBBT) is an engineering marvel built in the early 1960s to link mainland Virginia with the Eastern Shore which, at the time, was accessible only by a long ferry ride.

Measuring 17.6 miles from shore to shore, this facility includes more than 12 miles of low-level trestle, two mile-long tunnels, two bridges, four man-made islands, two miles of causeway and five and a half miles of approach roads, totaling 23 miles.

Construction of the original two-lane facility was completed in 1964. In 1999, parallel bridges and trestles opened. Construction of the parallel Thimble Shoal Tunnel began in the fall of 2017.



# LOWER SHORE



#### **MACHIPONGO**

Stop for a healthy and delicious lunch at Machipongo Trading Company and pick up local Eastern Shore Coastal Roasting coffee. Visit the Barrier Islands Center to learn the rich history and culture of those who lived along the remote sand islands that buffer Virginia's Atlantic coastline.

Drive scenic backroads to Chatham Winery or launch the kayak on a guided tour to the secluded, historic property. The winery's French vinifera grapes are turned into Merlots, Chardonnays, Cabernets and blends that have earned medals and accolades nationwide. Later in the evening, sip their Church Creek Steel Chardonnay at sunset overlooking the Chesapeake Bay.

#### **EXMORE**

Like many towns on Virginia's Eastern Shore, the town of Exmore came to be because of the railroad that extends down the entire peninsula. The story goes that Exmore got its name because it was the 10th station south of the Delaware state line so there were "X" more stations to go. However, some believe the town's name is a tribute to Exmoor, now a National Park, in Southwestern England.

Today the town has a quaint downtown area with eclectic restaurants, antique stores, consignment shops, a classic diner, and a park. Eat lunch at the Exmore Diner for some delicious Shore-cuisine. Take the kids to the park and let them run free as you relax on the benches or head down Main Street for some window shopping. Pop over to nearby Willis Wharf to launch the boat out and explore Virginia's Barrier Islands for the day.



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
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
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
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

# MIDDLE SHORE



#### WACHAPREAGUE

Venture off Route 13 for just four miles to charming Wachapreague, "The Little City by the Sea." Dine on delicious. local seafood at The Island House or catch your own on a charter fishing or clam-digging trip, gather supplies for a boat day at the Wachapreague market. ride the Wachapreague Inn's boat taxi to a relaxing day on a sandbar, or travel just outside of town to soar the skies with Virginia Hang Gliding. P.S. the shores off Wachapreague are home to large nesting sites where migratory birds are often spotted. Local eco-tour guides can get you there and tell you everything you need to know. Shop fine art at Current Reflections, the towns gorgeous art gallery. Ride the Ferris Wheel at the Fireman's Carnival. You must get a clam fritter and funnel cake while you're there too, trust us! Challenge your friends to a game of pickle ball or play a round of tennis at the Herbert Powell Memorial Park. Play bocce ball at the Seaside Park or wander the native plant garden.


#### **TANGIER**

Catch the Tangier Ferry from spring through fall for a 12-mile journey to discover a tiny watermen's community separated from the mainland, surrounded by the vast Chesapeake Bay, Famous for its isolation, location, and lifestyle. Tangier is the muse of Earl Swift's. "Chesapeake Requiem: A Year with the Watermen of Vanishing Tangier Island." Spend the day walking the island's narrow lanes, take a golf cart tour and sample the softshell crabs this island is best known for. You'll no doubt get an earful of the local Tangier dialect, related to the Elizabethan English spoke by the island's first settlers.

Enjoy the quiet and serene Tangier beach for a relaxing and unique way to experience the bay. Head into town for lunch at Lorraine's Snack Bar or Fisherman's Corner. Grab a delicious frozen treat at Four Brothers Crab House & Ice Cream Deck. Take a tour of the elusive crab shanties where the watermen work year-round.

#### **ONANCOCK**

A town steeped in history; Onancock charts its founding back to 1680. Its centuries-old homes evoke an era of prosperity on the Shore, especially Ker Place, a historic house turned museum. Today, artist studios, restaurants, inns, and a beautiful wharf capture the vitality of current day. Meet artists in their studios and local farmers at the Onancock Farmers and Artisans market on Saturday mornings. Walk to dinner, a movie, or a live show at the North Street Playhouse. Dining ranges from an Irish pub to sophisticated cafes to a dockside eatery where the chef plays guitar. Shop well-curated boutiques, wander the Native Plant Trail at Historic Onancock School, or hang out at the newly renovated playground. Play disc golf with the whole family at the soccer fields or launch the kayak and SUP board from the town's kayak launch. Buy that special someone a Chesapeake Bay bracelet at C.D. Marsh Jewelers or show them you care with an early morning donut run to the Corner Bakery.



#### **ONANCOCK WHARF**

MAIN STREET

Boat up to the Onancock Wharf where there are slips for rent, or drive to town with your Skiff in tow to launch into Onancock Creek. Rent kayaks, bikes and paddle boards from Burnham Guides to explore the creek or take a guided tour. Meet the lovely folks who sail Gratitude for your own Onancock Sailing Adventure. Learn about the history, flora, and fauna of the area. Spot ospreys nesting along the markers of the channel. Ride out the mouth of the creek into the Chesapeake Bay to explore tiny islands and experience vast wildlife.

When the day dwindles down and the sun begins to set, cruise back to the wharf, tie up the boat, and grab a bite to eat at any of the mouthwatering restaurants in town. 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
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# **UPPER SHORE**



Daily life hums briskly as a summer day dawns on Chincoteague Island. Scooters zip along Maddox Boulevard and bike riders pedal toward Assateague Island. By afternoon, lines form at the ice cream parlors. In late July, thousands flock to the world-famous Pony Swim and Penning, celebrating its 95th year in 2020.

Over at Tom's Cove they're stacking bushels of blue crabs, bagging clams, and culling oysters. All of this is just one step removed from the tables of town restaurants where you can slurp down "Chincoteague Salt" oysters or bite into a crispy soft-shell crab. This is the gateway to the world-famous Assateague Island National Seashore, renowned Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, a birder's paradise, and NASA Wallops Flight Facility where rockets are launched to both the moon and international space station. Yet it is just the beginning of exploring the Eastern Shore of Virginia. A few miles north near the Maryland border find the little fishing village of

Greenbackville, with the Crusty Crab Seafood Shack and the Bay Watch Inn. Nearby Captain's Cove has a 9-hole golf course that plays 18, marina and restaurant on the Chincoteague Bay. Across Route 13, in the village of Saxis, you can nod hello to the watermen at work at the wharf. In the town of Parksley, a collection of rail cars and engines at the Eastern Shore Railway Museum harkens back half a century to when rail eclipsed ships and sent Shoregrown vegetables and fruit nationwide.



#### **SAXIS**

Drive off Route 13 to Saxis, perched right on the Chesapeake Bay, and explore a tiny corner of America that hasn't changed much over the centuries. Stop in at the Saxis Museum and learn about a time gone by. Catch a bite to eat at either of two tiny restaurants, Captain E's Hurricane Grill and Tiki Bar or Martha's Kitchen, then wander the beach- it's a perfect spot to find treasures washed up by the tide.



#### PARKSLEY


Relive the golden age of train travel in this Victorian era railroad town. Climb aboard the preserved dining, sleeping. and caboose cars at the Fastern Shore Railway Museum. Step back in time with lunch at the Club Car Café and browse Jaxon's old-fashioned "five and dime." where you can still get penny candy. Shop local produce and artisanal crafts at the Taste of Eden Produce stand open from 10am-5pm Fridays and Saturdays. Drive to the Mutton Hunk Fen Natural Area Preserve for birding. hiking, and exploring. Bike around town to view the gorgeous Victorian era homes throughout this historic town. Soon, the Eastern Shore Public Library's new library will be open, complete with a research room all about Virginia's Eastern Shore. Stop by for some good reads and relax in the outdoor seating area. Enjoy free Wi-Fi for any last-minute emails on the go!



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
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

# **BIRDING**

#### On VIRGINIA'S EASTERN SHORE

The Eastern Shore of Virginia is a hotspot for birds and birding; an area where birds naturally congregate and numerous nature preserves, parks and refuges provide ample opportunities for people to get outside and go birding. Here are some tips to get you started!



1. Learn about the birds. Learning to identify the common species and becoming familiar with all the different bird species vou might encounter can make birding a lot more fun. "A Field Guide to the Birds" can be purchased from any bookstore. Mobile apps include Merlin by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, Sibley, National Audubon Society, and Peterson, These Apps provide location maps and recordings to identify the songs and calls of various species. The website www.allaboutbirds.org provides the same information. With the diversity of habitats on the Eastern Shore of Virginia, one can expect to find bird species from every category: shorebirds, hawks, owls, warblers. woodpeckers, herons, ducks, flycatchers, sparrows and more.

2. Find the best location for the time of **vear.** There are so many different habitats here on the Shore – from marshes, to open water, to maritime forest – and these differing habitats provide home to a diverse variety of bird species. The spectrum of bird life varies greatly from winter, when northern birds arrive to escape the frigid north, to summer, when many of the neotropical migrants are carrying out breeding activities. The Spring and Fall migration seasons on the Eastern Shore are a time when just about any of the 439 species recorded here might show up. To find the best places to see birds on the Eastern Shore of Virginia and for detailed information on what species can be found at various locations and different times of year, check out the Birding Eastern Shore website at birdingeasternshore.org.

3. **Go Explore!** The Birding Eastern Shore website features local public lands that are open to all, for birding, hiking, kayaking and biking. Once you've ventured out for a birding walk, be sure to bring binoculars, your field guide or app, and appropriate attire. Prepare for the possibility of mud and bugs. The best time to see bird activity is early in the morning, and it is best to walk slowly and speak quietly. For those with mobility limitations, check out easy access locations like the hawk watch platform at Kiptopeke State Park or the marsh overlook at the Willis Wharf boat ramp. For wheelchair accessible trails, the paved bike trail that begins at the Eastern Shore of Virginia National Wildlife Refuge traverses excellent bird habitat areas including shrubs and fields.

If you have only one long weekend to plan a birding trip to the Eastern Shore of Virginia, the best time to visit is surely fall migration, which is a time with the greatest variety and number of birds. The geography of the Eastern Shore as a peninsula creates a funnel effect which concentrates southbound migrating birds into lower Northampton County. Unlike Spring migration, Fall migration spans a long period, from mid-July through December, depending on the species.

As the migration of most songbirds wanes in mid-morning, the raptors rise in migration, and many days produce counts of 1,000 or more, sometimes up to 5,000. The season starts in August, with American Kestrels and Sharp-shinned Hawks and





Ospreys dotting the clouds, followed soon by Cooper's Hawks, Northern Harriers, Bald Eagles, Merlins, and Peregrine Falcons. In September and October, Broad-winged, then Red-tailed and Red-shouldered Hawks put in appearances, with an occasional Golden Eagle or Northern Goshawk. Ever vigilant hawkwatchers regularly observe non-raptors passing overhead, including occasional flocks of Sandhill Cranes and American White Pelicans.

The hawkwatch platform at Kiptopeke State Park, operated by the Coastal Virginia Wildlife Observatory, is an excellent place to watch cuckoos, tangers, warblers, vireos, catbird, thrasher, flycatchers, wrens, orioles, and woodpeckers. Pack a folding chair, lunch, and plenty of drinks, and plan to spend the morning walking through the many trails at the State Park and the rest of the day scanning the skies from the hawkwatching platform. Observers standing on the platform have kept a list of all species recorded there, which stands at 279 species.

To make the most of your weekend, plan to spend extensive time on the seaside of the peninsula. While there are many vantage points for viewing the mudflats and marshes by land, it is best to charter a boat with one of the birding tour guides who can take you out to the remote areas where birds are known to congregate. The best locations depart from Wachapreague in Accomack County or Oyster in Northampton County. Go to visitesva.com for a complete list of guides.
