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Threatened bat, native to **Oklahoma**, facing extinction





The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced Tuesday a proposal to reclassify a bat species that lives in 23 Oklahoma counties as endangered under the Endangered Species Act. The northern long-eared bat, currently listed as threatened, faces extinction due to a deadly disease affecting cave-dwelling bats across the continent.

The population has been decimated since colonies infected with white-nose syndrome were spotted in New York caves in the mid-2000s. Fish and Wildlife reports the disease is spreading more quickly than anticipated and is expected to affect 100% of the northern long-eared bat's U.S. range by 2025.

Named for white, fuzzy spots that appear on infected bats, white-nose syndrome attacks their wings, muzzles and ears as they hibernate in caves and abandoned mines. It causes them to become



active and sometimes fly outside too soon. They burn up their winter fat stores and eventually starve.

Officials estimate the disease has caused declines of 97% to 100% of affected populations. "White-nose syndrome is devastating northern long-eared bats at unprecedented rates, as indicated by this science-based finding," said U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Regional Director Charlie Wooley.

Bats are critical to healthy, functioning ecosystems and contribute at least \$3 billion annually to the U.S. agriculture economy through pest control and pollination, officials said.

The northern long-eared bat is found in 37 states and the District of Columbia. The Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation

House bill would make initiative petitions more difficult

Lawmakers on Tuesday advanced measures that could stymie initiative petitions like the ones that put into place medical marijuana and Medicaid expansion in Oklahoma.

Noting that those measures got onto the statewide ballot by with signatures collected mostly in Oklahoma and Tulsa counties, lawmakers have proposed new rules that would require the support of more voters in rural areas.

The Oklahoma House of Representatives approved a series of measures that would raise thresholds and requirements for initiative petitions. The measures next require the approval of the Senate before being put to a vote of the people. Should the measures be approved by lawmakers and placed on the ballot, a simple majority of Oklahoma voters would then be able to change the Oklahoma Constitution to set the bar higher for future elections.


House Joint Resolution 1002, by Rep. Tommy Hardin, R-Madill, would require an initiative petition to garner a certain percentage of the number of legal voters for each of Oklahoma's 77 counties.

Currently, signatures may come from anywhere in the state, and the number of signatures required is based on a percentage of how many total votes were cast for governor in the last general election.

HJR would require signatures from 8% of legal voters in each county for any legislative measure, 15% of voters for a constitutional amendment and 5% for referendums.

Enough signatures could be collected in just Oklahoma County and Tulsa County to qualify for a statewide vote on a measure - about 100,000 for a state law or 200,000 signatures for a constitutional

Massive new wind center opens operations in Oklahoma

The Traverse Wind Energy Center, billed as one of the largest wind facilities in the world and the largest ever built in a single phase in North America, has commenced commercial operations in Blaine and Custer counties in north central Oklahoma.

The 998-megawatt center, including 356 wind turbines, was developed by Invenergy in partnership with GE Renewable Energy. It is expected to generate 3.8 million megawatt-hours of power annually for AEP Public Service Company of Oklahoma (PSO) and Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO) customers in Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana.

According to a release, Traverse recently joined the already operational 199-megawatt Sundance Wind Energy Center and 287-megawatt Maverick Wind Energy Center as the last of three projects developed by Invenergy on behalf of AEP.

Together, the three operations have 531 GE turbines with a combined capacity of 1,484 megawatts, making them collectively among the largest such operations worldwide.

According to the release, the operations, collectively known as the North Central Energy Facilities, represent a \$2 billion capital investment in Oklahoma, accounting for new tax revenues and

lease payments made to participating landowners.

"This is a moment that Invenergy and our valued partners at AEP, GE Renewable Energy, and the gracious members of our home communities in Oklahoma have been looking forward to," said Jim Shield, senior executive vice president and business development leader at Invenergy. The facilities will generate enough electricity to power 440,000 American homes, Invenergy said.

"Traverse is part of the next chapter in AEP's transition to a clean energy future. The commercial operation of Traverse – the largest single wind farm ever built at once in North America – and the completion of the North Central Energy Facilities is a significant milestone in our efforts to provide clean, reliable power to our customers while saving them money," said Nicholas K. Akins, AEP chairman, president and chief executive officer.

Akins said AEP has committed to investing \$8.2 billion in regulated renewables and nearly \$25 billion in transmission and distribution systems through 2026.

"Including North Central, we plan to add approximately 16,000 MW of wind and solar in our regulated states by 2030 as part of our goal to achieve net zero carbon emissions by 2050," he said.

AEP's subsidiaries SWEPCO and PSO have assumed ownership of the three wind facilities. Under a 10-year contract, Invenergy Services will provide operations, maintenance and other services.

According to the release, Invenergy and its affiliated companies have developed projects capable of producing more than 30,000 megawatts of power, including wind, solar, and natural gas power generation and advanced energy storage projects in the Americas, in Europe and Asia. The company's home office is in Chicago. It has regional offices in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Spain, Japan, Poland, and Scotland.

GE Renewable Energy identifies as a \$16 billion business combining onshore and offshore wind, blades, hydro, storage, utility-scale solar, and grid solutions as well as hybrid renewables and digital services.

Bill would allow for suits if hospital visitation is denied

Health care providers might face prospects of lawsuits if they deny patients the chance to have visitors under legislation advancing in the Oklahoma Legislature.

Rep. Cynthia Roe, R-Lindsay, the chair of the House Public Health Committee who authored House Bill 3313, said it was motivated by stories she heard from constituents who have been denied chances to see loved ones gravely ill in hospitals. One woman, Shannon Horner, wasn't allowed to see her husband, who died in January after being hospitalized for two weeks.

"I've heard dozens of stories over the past two years of families not being allowed to visit their loved ones in the hospital, and it breaks my heart that they are prevented from being there for them or saying goodbye," Roe said. "As a health care worker, I've seen firsthand how encouragement from a loved one can inspire the patient. I hope that House Bill 3313 is signed into law, so no families have to endure the heartache of not being

allowed to visit their hospitalized loved ones."

Roe, a registered nurse for 39 years and a nurse practitioner for 22 years, said HB 3313 would add an "enforcement mechanism" to the No Patient Left Alone Act passed into law in 2021. The Act codified the rights of patients to have a designated visitor, regardless of what they're hospitalized for.

Under HB3313, families or patients could file civil litigation against a hospital if their visitation rights are denied. Its language states that visitors would have to follow safety protocols and hospital policies, but that otherwise a hospital would be required to allow visits.

After the bill passed 33-13 in the House, Roe recognized Horner, who was seated in the House Gallery.

HB3313 may now be heard in the Senate, where it was authored by Sen. Jessica Garvin, R-Duncan. The bill has an emergency clause, which would allow it to take effect immediately upon becoming law.

Oklahoma bill would bring mental health assistance to educators

OKLAHOMA CITY – Legislation meant to extend mental health benefits to Oklahoma teachers has made some progress at the Capitol.

House Bill 4109, authored by Rep. Mark Vancuren, R-Owasso, would make an Employee Assistance Program (EAP) available to school employees, much like a program currently available to other state employees.

"Educators deal with a number of stressful scenarios during the course of

their work, and having better mental health support will not only benefit them personally but also the students and the families they serve," Vancuren said.

If the bill passes to become law, an Education EAP would be created within the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. It would give educators access to numerous mental health programs and services currently available to other state employees. Services would, for example:

- Utilize certified behavioral health case managers to connect and refer clients to in-network health care providers and wellness programs;
- Facilitate short-term interventions for mental health and/or substance use issues, as well as for emotional health, gambling, marital, family relations, financial and work-related issues, stress, grief, loss or other personal problems;
- Provide for education and training on an individual and organizational basis

on topics including mental health in the workplace and suicide prevention;

- Allow for wellness coaching on tobacco cessation, worksite wellness, self-care, etc.;
- Provide critical incident debriefing and efforts to respond to and provide support after a traumatic event; and
- Connect teachers to support and peer groups.

HB4109 advanced for consideration in the Senate, where it was authored by Sen. John Haste, R-Broken Arrow.

Eight to be inducted into Oklahoma Women's Hall of Fame

OKLAHOMA CITY - Eight women to be inducted soon into the Oklahoma Women's Hall of Fame have made wideranging, valuable contributions to the state. They include health care professionals, a storied entertainer, gifted business leaders, a farmer-rancher and, perhaps most importantly, advocates committed to making life better for other people.

The eight will be honored during a ceremony scheduled for April 29 at the Omni Hotel and Resort in Oklahoma City. They'll join 134 other women inducted into the Hall since its inception in 1983.

"We are honored to recognize these women with such a high honor for women of our great state," Oklahoma Commission on the Status of Women Chair Victoria Woods said.

The ceremony also will include a presentation of the Guardian Award to an Oklahoma elected official, and the Kate Barnard Award to a woman who exemplifies excellence in public service, OWHOF Chair Carol Hefner noted.

Hefner added that proceeds from the event will be used to establish a permanent Women's Hall of Fame exhibit.

"It will be a special time to celebrate Oklahomans making a difference in

the lives of women," Hefner said of the ceremony.

This year's OWHOF inductees will include:

• Sue Ann Arnall, an energy industry veteran and founder of the Arnall Family Foundation. Arnall has focused on child welfare, animal welfare, and criminal justice reform and created the



Diversion Hub, a program that helps incarcerated women and men.

• Carleen Burger, a lifelong advocate for women, children, and youth. Burger lobbied for prenatal exams and health care for incarcerated women. She has been a generous supporter and advocate of the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics Foundation (OSSM).

• Janice Dobbs, a former corporate secretary at Chesapeake Energy and Devon Energy. Dobbs played a pivotal role in turning two small, local oil and gas companies into international enterprises recognized as innovative leaders in the exploration of new sources of energy.

• Wanda Jackson, a singer, songwriter, and two-time Grammy nominee who released music in genres of rock, country and gospel. Her series of 1950s singles cemented her status as "The Queen of Rockabilly." Counted among the first female stars in country music, Jackson is a decorated artist with a Fellowship Award from the National Endowment for the Arts, as well as an inductee into the Rockabilly Hall of Fame, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, and the Oklahoma Hall of Fame.

• Betty McElderry, to be inducted posthumously, chaired the Oklahoma Commission on the Status of Women during Gov. George Nigh's administration. She was a director of Girl's State and was recognized by Campaign and Elections Magazine as one of 74 outstanding women who helped change America.

• Roseline Nsikak, a globally recognized psychotherapist, philanthropist, and founder of two mental and behavioral health agencies. Nsikak's career has been dedicated to treating children, adolescents, and adults suffering from mental illness and drug/alcohol dependence. She has also served nonprofits and faith-based organizations by developing modules and curriculum allowing them to meet the greater community's needs.

• Dr. Kayse Shrum, the 19th president of Oklahoma State University and first woman to lead the institution. After earning her doctor of osteopathic medicine degree from the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, Shrum excelled as a faculty member and ultimately as president of OSU-CHS, becoming the youngest and first female president and dean of a medical school in the state. As Oklahoma's first Secretary of Science and Innovation, her leadership helped form Oklahoma's largest COVID diagnostics lab on OSU's Stillwater campus.

Anna Belle Wiedemann, who built a life and career promoting Oklahoma agriculture. Beginning as owner/operator of the Slash C Ranch, Wiedemann, along with her husband, has helped to promote "Made In Oklahoma" food products throughout the world. She also has served as a state representative and county commissioner, and as director of International Trade and Rural Development with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture.

Funding to advance imaging center, research at OU

The University of Oklahoma has received funding from the National Institutes of Health to establish the Oklahoma Center of Medical Imaging for Translational Cancer Research.

Medical imaging is an essential tool to help doctors assess the size and scope of tumors to be targeted by surgery or by chemotherapy or radiation therapy. According to a release, OU researchers are investigating multiple avenues to help improve medical imaging use in cancer detection, diagnosis and treatment.

The award from the Centers of Biomedical Research

Excellence (COBRE) program of the NIH is expected to provide more than \$11.3 million over a five-year Phase 1 period, with opportunity to compete for renewal for up to three phases. The first phase will support the center's establishment to galvanize multidisciplinary biomedical research through equipment and facilities support.

Dr. **Bin Zheng**, a professor and Oklahoma TSET Cancer Research Scholar in the Gallogly College of Engineering's School of Electrical and Computer Engineering, has been tapped to lead the new center. – *PRNewswire*

OKLAHOMA CITY Teacher exit interviews proposed

A bill that would call on school districts to plan exit interviews with teachers leaving jobs has made progress in the Oklahoma Legislature.

The measure, authored by Senate Education Committee Chair **Adam Pugh**, R-Edmond, was approved by the Senate and advanced to the House.

Pugh said Senate Bill 1630 might shed light on ways to deal with chronic shortages of teachers in the state. It would direct school districts to conduct exit interviews when a teacher leaves, just as many private sector companies do with their employees.

"We've passed two historic pay increases, along with several reforms on licensing, professional development, school safety and other critical areas," Pugh said. "This change would let teachers share why they want to move to another district, teach in a different state, or leave this honorable profession altogether."

According to the bill's language, the exit interview would include a standardized form created by the State Department of Education (SDE). SDE would use data collected to inform decisions regarding professional development, and the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability (OEQA) would the information for teacher education programs.

Rep. **Rhonda Baker**, R-Yukon, is carrying the legislation in the House. – Staff report

Six high school girls from Tishomingo died in a headon collision with a semi-truck Tuesday.

We also have space prepared at Tishomingo High School with counselors available through the evening."

Tornadoes, high winds batter homes, businesses

One person died and more than a dozen were injured when tornadoes tore through parts of Texas and Oklahoma Monday, damaging a school, homes and businesses, officials said.

The same storm system was poised to move into Louisiana and Mississippi on Tuesday, carrying the risk of dangerous tornadoes and powerful winds.

In Texas, several tornadoes were reported Monday along the Interstate 35 corridor, particularly in the Austin suburbs of Round Rock and Elgin, and close to Dallas-Fort Worth. Two unconfirmed tornadoes caused damage in the Lake Texoma area of northern Texas and southern Oklahoma.

More than a dozen injuries were reported in Texas, including 10 in Grayson County, about 60 miles north of Dallas, the county's emergency management office said. A 73-year-old woman who lived in the community of Sherwood Shores died in the storm, but officials have not provided any details.

By Tuesday morning, the system was bringing heavy rainfall and thunderstorms to parts of Texas and Arkansas, said **Jeremy Grams**, lead forecaster with the Storm Prediction Center, in Norman, Oklahoma. A tornado watch was in effect for parts of Texas and Louisiana.

The Denver Parks and Recreation (DPR) Department has donated 33 American Bison to Native American Indian tribes, including the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes of Oklahoma, in an ongoing effort to reintroduce wild bison and support conservation efforts on tribal lands.

According to a release,

17 bison were transferred to the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes, 15 were sent to the Northern Arapaho Tribe located in Wyoming, and one animal was sent to the Tall Bull Memorial Council in Colorado.

Bison herds that numbered more than 30 million when the first Europeans set foot on the American continent were nearly wiped out by the 1880s. At the turn of the 20th century, fewer than 1,000 bison remained, and DPR was tasked with caring for managed bison in Colorado to help prevent extinction.

Today it is estimated that there are 31,000 free-range wild bison in North America.

DPR maintains two conservation bison herds in the Denver Mountain Parks system at Genesee Park and Daniels Park.

"For over a century now,

Denver has been the proud caretaker of these Bison herds, and we remain committed to their conservation as an integral part of the ecosystem here in the West," Mayor Michael B. Hancock said. "We're taking that commitment to a new level, and through this effort with our tribal partners, this is an opportunity to help establish, support, and sustain Native American conservation herds across the country."

Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes Governor Reggie Wassana said the donation will help to preserve a vital link to tribal history.

"The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes are pleased to continue the growth of our historical food source. The Denver Mountain Parks Bison are a shot in the arm for our tribal nations," he said.



ESG principles may require compromise

There has been a rush to divest of Russian securities on the grounds of Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) principles. But beyond ESG considerations there is a moral imperative to do so. It likely also makes sense for purely capitalistic reasons.



As a wealth management professional, for clients who want to implement ESG principles in their portfolios, I respect and execute on clients' wishes as is practically

clients' wishes as is practically possible. However, below

I present two (purposely extreme to make the point) contrasting investor profiles that show just how intractable a problem implementing mass marketed ESG principles can be. Inasmuch as all good meaning people have varied value and belief systems and, as we all know, the world presents us with many situations that are shades of grey, what is ESG friendly to one might not be for another.

For example, there may be broad consensus among board members of a health care nonprofit that tobacco stocks should be excluded from the organization's investment portfolio in the name of ESG, but alcohol stocks may not receive the same treatment (No sense in being a hypocrite.) Consider now a mother who lost her child to a drunk driver, and one of the few pleasures in her life is lighting up a couple Marlboros each evening, knowing full well how bad they are for her health. She might hold the opposite view.

My point is that there are things all people of goodwill can agree are bad. The first example that comes to mind is, unprovoked, invading a neighboring country and murdering innocent civilians, including children. However, past the barbaric, disagreement crops up quickly, and one's own opinion of what qualifies under ESG standards can morph over time with changing conditions.

For example, recent events have apparently caused some ESG advocates to consider firearm companies, arguing that it is a societal imperative for nations to quickly upgrade their military capabilities if Putin decides to continue westward. While just a pragmatic minority, the thought of this conservation would be laughable if the situation wasn't so serious.

It's easy to see how the slope could get slipperier. For instance, in addition to sanctions from western governments, there is a parade of companies voluntarily winding up (no doubt, at significant cost from a purely capitalist perspective) operations in Russia, further putting the screws to Putin. Given the type of business conducted in Russia, many of these are oil and gas companies. Should these companies now be considered ESG champions because of their assistance in the international effort to isolate Russia, or should they continue to be excluded based on their role in climate change? Should coal companies continue to be excluded based on their leading role in climate change, or should they now be included because they very literally will help keep the lights on in Europe if the conflict worsens/broadens?

One of the companies I think is a leader on the E, the S and the G is Warren Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway, but the company is regularly excluded from or deemphasized in ESG funds mostly, in my view, because management doesn't think it's worth their time to complete the requisite forms/reports. I strongly suspect their reasoning is like what I've presented above. To this point, please watch this clip (https:// buffett.cnbc.com/video/2018/05/05/ warren-buffett-on-guns-i-dontthink-i-have-any-business-speakingfor-berkshire.html) from the 2018 Berkshire Hathaway Annual Shareholder's Meeting. Charlie Munger's comments in the last part of the clip succinctly describe in a few seconds what took me a few paragraphs above.

Bottom line, it's advisable to avoid too much rigidity in one's thinking.

Key point: Investment firms' ESG funds typically charge more than standard fare.

Investigation begins of Boeing jetliner crash in China

BEIJING (AP) — Monday's crash of a Boeing 737-800 passenger jet in China started a fire big enough to be seen from space and forced rescuers to search a rugged, remote mountainside.

One day after the China Eastern Airlines flight plunged from the sky, there are more questions than answers, officials said. The cause is unknown. Flight 5735 was at 29,000 feet on Monday afternoon when it went into a dive about an hour into its flight, according to flight-tracking website FlightRadar24.com.

The plane plunged to 7,400 feet before regaining about 1,200 feet, then dived again. It crashed into the side of a mountain in a remote, forested area outside the city of Wuzhou.

State media and Chinese regulators gave no indication the pilot reported trouble or other information that might shed light on the cause of the disaster. The plane stopped transmitting data 96 seconds after it started to fall.

Rescue workers planned to use drones in the search for the plane's black boxes, which should contain information from instruments and sound from the cockpit.

Confirming the cause of a plane crash sometimes takes months or years due to the need to gather badly damaged debris and examine specialized technical factors.

The plane was carrying 123 passengers and nine crew members from the city of Kunming in China's southwest to Guangzhou, an export hub in the southeast. There were no survivors.

No foreigners are believed to have been on board. Two Chinese companies said their employees were on the flight, including the CFO of Guangzhou-based Dinglong Culture Co. whose interests range from mining to TV and movie production.

The 737-800 is a twin-engine, single-aisle plane commonly used for short and medium-haul flights. In a typical configuration, it has 178 seats divided between the main and premium cabins. Boeing has delivered more than 5,100 of them over the past 24 years, and China is the biggest market, with nearly 1,200, according

to aviation consultant IBA.

The plane has been flying since 1998 and has an excellent safety record, said Hassan Shahidi, president of the Flight Safety Foundation.

Boeing Chief Executive Dave Calhoun said that the company was deeply saddened by the news and had offered the full support of its technical

experts to assist in the investigation.

"The thoughts of all of us at Boeing are with the passengers and crew members ... as well as their families and loved ones," he wrote in a message to Boeing employees.

The Boeing 737 Max, which entered service in 2017, was grounded by regulators following the two crashes. They were blamed on a computer system that pushed the nose downward in flight and couldn't be overridden by pilots.

Airlines were allowed to resume using the 737 Max after Boeing redesigned the system in a process overseen by regulators from the United States, Europe, China and the Middle East.

Germany to continue buying Russian-provided oil, gas, coal

BERLIN (AP) — German Chancellor Olaf Scholz on Tuesday again dismissed calls to boycott Russian energy supplies in the wake of the attack on Ukraine.

Scholz said sanctions already imposed on Russia were hitting its on Russian oil, coal and gas than economy "and this will only get more Germany "and nobody must be dramatic every day."

At the same time, Scholz said the sanctions were designed to be "tolerable" for those imposing them, including in the long term.

"That is why Germany's position on this question (of an energy boycott) remains unchanged," he said.

He added that other countries in Europe are even more dependent left standing out in the rain in this regard."

Scholz said Germany is working to diversify its energy supply and that, while this will take time, it will eventually have the same effect as a boycott.

European countries pay Russia hundreds of millions of dollars each day for fossil fuels. Ukrainian officials say the trade has effectively financed Russia's war against their country.

Also on Tuesday, the European Union moved toward joint purchase of natural gas and ensuring its storage facilities are nearly full to try to avoid another crisis tied to its dependency on Russian energy.

The 27-nation bloc acknowledges it has been far too reliant on Russia for natural gas and oil and has been struggling to find the right mix of sanctions to punish the Kremlin for invading Ukraine while still requiring Russian fossil fuels.

Low levels of gas storage "brought us to big difficulties in January where we have been kind of scrambling for additional gas for European consumption," EU Commission Vice President Maros Sefcovic said.

CPR 'heroes' need more support, report says

When she arrived at her neighbor's house and found him unconscious and turning blue, Brianna Colquitt knew what to do.

While someone called 911, Colquitt, then a high school senior in Carrollton, Georgia, started CPR. She kept it up until emergency responders arrived. Her training, which she'd received in a high school health class the year before, had prepared her to act, she said. "Everything just clicked."

But it didn't prepare her for everything that followed. First came the news that her neighbor didn't make it. Then came the wondering: Had she done all she could? Even now, more than three years later, "the memories are very vivid, because it was a traumatic experience," Colquitt said.

The need to understand such experiences is part of what inspired a new report from the American Heart Association about lay responders and CPR.

"We've trained people for decades to do bystander CPR, but we've never actually gone back and paid attention to supporting them after we call them to action," said Katie Dainty, who led the writing committee for the scientific statement published Monday in the AHA journal Circulation.

Lay people who perform CPR are "amazing heroes," said Dainty, a research chair in patient-centered outcomes at Toronto's North York General Hospital. The new statement aims to serve those people better by summarizing the latest research on their experience, which could improve training, remove barriers to people taking action and, ultimately, save lives.

An estimated 347,322 adults in the U.S. have a cardiac arrest each year, AHA statistics show. CPR approximately doubles the odds of someone surviving a cardiac arrest, yet bystanders in North America

initiate CPR only 39% to 44% of the time, according to the new report.

There are big challenges to improving that rate that go beyond more training, said Dainty, who also is an associate professor at the Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation at the University of Toronto.

At a basic level, more people need to learn how to recognize a cardiac arrest – the person takes gasping breaths or has a bluish skin color, for example – and the need to respond immediately, she said. Then, people need to be taught that it's okay to act even if they are not sure exactly what to do.

"For a very long time, we made CPR something that you needed to be a cardcarrying member of a club to do," she said. But while training is important, "even if you've never been trained, when you call 911, the dispatcher on the other end will help you. And a lot of people aren't aware of that."

Dainty thinks further research could help explain why some people act and some don't. Research also could inform more realistic training, which she said usually takes place "in an air-conditioned room, with a perfectly clean manikin lying flat on the floor. It's very idyllic. And no cardiac arrest ever happens that way."

Training, she said, also needs to address how people feel after they've performed CPR. For most people, the experience is "quite an incredible rush," but researchers haven't spent a lot of time thinking about the psychological impact afterward.

Responders often describe their experience as traumatic and stressful, the report says, but there are no systems in place to follow up with them.

Some people struggle with problems such as "not being able to sleep,

continuously reviewing the events in your head, wondering if you did the right thing," Dainty said. Health care systems need to let responders know that such feelings are "totally normal, and that we have resources to help them with that."

Colquitt understands the jumble of feelings. Her experiences helped shape the report, which she helped write.

She feels her own CPR training was "the best it could be," even though she found it "a lot harder to do it on a person" than on a manikin.

After an ambulance took her neighbor away, Colquitt followed it to the hospital, where she learned her neighbor had died. She was reassured by paramedics, who told her, "You did everything correctly. We saw you doing CPR when we got there."

That helped, but she still rethought everything she had done. That day was "scary" and emotionally draining, she said, and formal support could have helped.

But she has no regrets. "Even though it was a sad time afterwards, it gave me peace knowing I did everything I could do." The experience even helped lead her to pursue a career in health care. She's now a junior studying nursing at Jacksonville State University in Alabama.

Colquitt's advice to anybody pondering whether they should learn CPR is: "Just go for it."

Dainty echoes that sentiment. Formal training is great, she said, but even watching a reliable YouTube video can help someone prepare to save a life. When someone's heart stops working outside the hospital, she said, a lay responder is their best chance at surviving.

"Without bystander CPR, they will stay dead," Dainty said. "But scientific statements like this one draw attention to the bigger picture and where we need to put our research efforts to ensure we aren't causing unintended harm to these heroes."

South Korea's COVID-19 deaths strain crematories

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Health officials in South Korea have instructed crematories to burn more bodies per day and funeral homes to add more refrigerators to store the dead as families struggle with funeral arrangements amid a rise in COVID-19 deaths.

The country has been dealing with a massive coronavirus outbreak driven by the fast-moving omicron variant, which has compromised a once robust pandemic response and is driving up hospitalizations and fatalities.

Officials have already allowed the 60 crematories across country to burn for longer hours starting last week, which raised their combined capacity from around 1,000 to 1,400 cremations per day.

But that hasn't been enough to meaningfully ease the backlog of bodies waiting to be cremated in the densely populated Seoul metropolitan area, which is home to half of South Korea's 52 million people and the center of its COVID-19 outbreak. The backlog has also trickled down to funeral homes at hospitals and

other facilities, where families have struggled to make funeral arrangements because of the longer wait for cremations.

Senior Health Ministry official Son Youngrae said during a briefing that officials will instruct regional crematories to increase furnace operations from five times to seven times a day, which would match the levels at crematories in the greater capital area. Crematories will also be asked to receive reservations from outside their regions something many facilities don't typically do — to reduce the backlog in the Seoul region, Son said.

The country's 1,136 funeral homes at hospitals and other facilities are currently capable of housing some 8,700 bodies, and officials will ask them to increase their

capacity by adding more refrigerators or rooms with cooling systems.

"There have been regional differences in COVID-19 deaths because of various factors such as the size of the elderly population in each community, and there's also a difference in the capacity of cremations each region can handle," Son said.

The country reported 384 new COVID-19 deaths on Tuesday, the sixth straight day of over 300 including a record 429 on Thursday. The number of virus patients in serious or critical conditions were at 1,104. Nearly 70% of the intensive care units designated for COVID-19 treatment were occupied.

Health workers diagnosed 353,980 new infections in the latest 24 hours, down from Thursday's single-day high of over 621,000, but the country typically reports larger case numbers midweek.

The omicron surge has been significantly bigger than what had been forecast by government health authorities, who continue to express cautious hope that the outbreak is nearing its peak.

Doctors encounter hurdles using pills to treat COVID-19

High-risk COVID-19 patients now have new treatments they can take at home to stay out of the hospital — if doctors get the pills to them fast enough.

Health systems around the country are rushing out same-day prescription deliveries. Some clinics have started testing and treating patients in one visit, an initiative that President Joe Biden's administration recently touted.

The goal is to get patients started on either Pfizer's Paxlovid tablets or Merck's molnupiravir capsules within five days of symptoms appearing. That can prevent people with big health risks from growing sicker and filling up hospitals if another surge develops.

But the tight deadline has highlighted several challenges. Some patients are delaying testing, thinking they just had a cold. Others have been unwilling or unable to try the new drugs.

With vaccines and treatments available, "we can make this much more manageable in the future, if people are willing to take care of themselves," said Dr. Bryan Jarabek, who helps lead CO-VID-19 treatment and vaccination efforts for the Minnesota health system M Health Fairview.

The Food and Drug Administration authorized the drugs last year. Doctors hailed the pills as a huge advance in the fight against COVID-19 partly because of their convenience compared to other treatments that require infusions or injections.

But patients can miss the pills' short window if they dismiss symptoms like a headache or sniffles and wait to see if they go away before seeking help.

Stanford's Dr. Thomas Lew said he's seen high-risk and unvaccinated people who have waited more than a week. Some hospitalized patients on oxygen have told him they thought nothing of their first symptoms.

"They say everyone in the family decided it was a cold or allergy season is coming up, but it was COVID all along," he said.

People delay seeking help for many health problems, not just COVID-19, Lew noted. But when it comes to the virus, the doctor believes patients may not be aware of the tight deadline.

Even those who get tested quickly, how-

ever, sometimes refuse the pills, doctors say.

Jarabek estimates that 30% to half of the patients who qualified for the antiviral pills turned down the treatments in his health system earlier this year.

He said some people didn't consider themselves high risk or didn't think they were sick enough to need the pills, which are free to patients. They also worried about side effects or how the drugs would interact with other medications.

Jeff Carlson couldn't try Paxlovid when COVID-19 hit him in January because it might interfere with his heart medications. The 61-year-old suburban St. Paul, Minnesota, resident has Type 1 diabetes and heart disease.

A doctor asked him to try molnupiravir about three days after he started feeling symptoms. By then, Carlson couldn't get off his couch. His fever had soared and he was struggling to breathe.

His wife picked up the prescription and a few days later, Carlson felt well enough to shovel snow.

Some health care providers have started free delivery services for Paxlovid or molnupiravir.

New York City has established a hotline patients can call if they test positive for the coronavirus. They can talk to a care provider if they don't have a doctor and have pills sent to them if they are a good candidate.

The Mass General Brigham health system in Boston started a similar program that ships pills to some patients via FedEx.

Dr. Scott Dryden-Peterson noted that some COVID-19 patients may not be able to pick up pills, especially since they should be staying off buses and ridesharing services.


"Transportation is not equally distributed in our society," he said.

For patients with transportation, the drugstore chain CVS Health has started "test to treat" programs at its nearly 1,200 stores with MinuteClinic locations. Pharmacists cannot test and treat, so that program won't happen at all stores.

With options for quick care growing, doctors and public health officials say now is the time for people to stock up on at-home tests.

Doctors say people at high risk of developing health problems from COV-ID-19 need to remain vigilant for symptoms and seek help quickly, especially if another surge develops.

reports the species lives throughout portions of both the Ozark highlands and Ouachita Mountains regions in eastern Oklahoma.

During the winter, they hibernate in cracks or crevices in caves, while in the summer they roost in tree cavities or beneath the bark. Northern longeared bats most commonly forage within forest interiors and are adapted for moving through dense wooded areas, wildlife officials said.

Scientists worry new variant may spark COVID cases

With coronavirus cases rising in parts of Europe and Asia, scientists worry that an extra-contagious version of the omicron variant may soon push cases up in the United States too.

Experts are also keeping their eyes on another mutant: a rare deltaomicron hybrid that they say doesn't pose much of a threat right now but shows how wily the coronavirus can be.

The U.S. will likely see an uptick in cases caused by the omicron descendant BA.2 starting in the next few weeks, according to Dr. Eric Topol, head of Scripps Research Translational Institute.

"It's inevitable we will see a BA.2 wave here," he said.

One reason? After about two months of falling COVID-19 cases, pandemic restrictions have been lifted across the U.S. Many people are taking off their masks and returning to indoor spaces like restaurants and theaters.

And the latest data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention shows the share caused by BA.2 is up significantly. The CDC reported Tuesday that the variant accounted for about 35% of new infections last week. In the Northeast, it was about half.

Dr. Anthony Fauci, the U.S. government's top infectious disease expert, told ABC's "This Week" over the weekend that he also thinks the U.S. will likely face an "uptick" similar to what's happening in Europe, particularly the United Kingdom, where BA.2 is the dominant strain. He said he doesn't think it will be a

"surge."

The U.K. has "had the same situation as we've had now," Fauci said. "They have BA.2. They have a

relaxation of some restrictions such as indoor masking and there's a waning of immunity" from vaccines and past infections.
