

Firm gives homebuyers all-cash option

OKLAHOMA CITY – Homeownership company Ribbon announced Thursday its expansion to Oklahoma, where it will give everyday homebuyers an opportunity to pay cash and compete with investors who are gobbling up the limited single-family inventory. High prices, low inventory and growing investor interest have combined to impose a significant hurdle for buyers, pushing homeownership further out of reach for many, the company said.

The average sales price for a single-family house here is \$289,542, or 12.8% higher than in 2021, said Steve Reese, president of the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Association of Realtors. At the same time, the inventory of homes for sale has declined by 27.5%.

“A well-priced house sometimes is gone within hours of going on the market,” Reese said. “House sellers want the path of least resistance. Cash offers are an easy and quick way to close the deal.”

Ribbon offers to purchase a house on behalf of an average buyer in cash – for a fee – to level the playing field with investors and wealthy buyers.

“By expanding our all-cash solutions and best-in-class software and home financing solutions to Oklahoma City residents and real estate professionals, we’re empowering the ecosystem and ensuring buyers win their dream homes while building equity in the process,” Shaival Shah, CEO and co-founder of Ribbon, said in the announcement. Buyers, sellers and agents are given added predictability and certainty in their deals with RibbonCash Offers, Shah said, and homebuyers can waive mortgage, appraisal and home sale contingencies through the power of an all cash-offer.

Cash-offer companies provide a different business model to buyers who may be locked out at this point, Reese said. “Oklahoma City Metropolitan Association of Realtors supports

Tribes add billions to state’s economy

OKLAHOMA CITY – With an economic impact of nearly \$15.6 billion a year on Oklahoma’s economy, Native American tribes are the best friends the state could have, tribal leaders said Wednesday. The Oklahoma Tribal Finance Consortium released a study that makes clear the extent of the tribes’ contributions for state leaders who may be unaware of how the state’s and the tribes’ economies are intertwined.

The report was released at an event held at the First Americans Museum in Oklahoma City.

The study showed that the 38 federally-recognized tribes in Oklahoma directly employ more than 54,000 and support a total of 113,442 jobs, providing \$5.4 billion in wages and benefits for both Native and non-Native people in 2019. The tribes also contributed hundreds of millions of dollars to education, healthcare and infrastructure projects that benefit the state as a whole, the study notes.

“There’s just a lot of confusion; I think there’s a misunderstanding in regards to how the tribes and we as the Choctaw Nation are trying to impact and help all of our tribal members and help Oklahoma as a whole,” said Gary Batton, Chief of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, the third largest Indian tribe in the United States.

“All these things are critical to the success of Oklahoma, and I don’t think sometimes that our governor understands that significant impact,” Batton said.

“Two years ago, we invested \$600 million that created 1,200 jobs in southeastern Oklahoma,” Batton said. The Choctaw Casino & Resort in Durant held its grand opening in Aug. 2021, featuring a 1,000-room luxury resort expansion. “There was no mention, there was no discussion. But there was an Amazon plant coming to Tulsa, \$350 million, that was the boast of the state.”

Antique gas signs, pumps, other memorabilia to be sold at auction

People with a passion for antique service station signs, rare old gas pumps and globes and other collectibles linked to the U.S. oil and gas industry's rich and colorful history may want to circle March 29 and 30 on their calendars.

On those days, an online "Automobilia, Petroliana & Railroadiana" auction has been scheduled by Denver, Pennsylvania-based Morphy Auctions.

According to a release, hundreds of items will be offered for sale – with some directly related to Oklahoma and its place as a mecca for early energy industry pioneers.

As an example, Morphy Auctions said it expects a rare 13.5-inch globe lens, circa 1930, from the Marland Oil Company of Ponca City to fetch in the neighborhood of \$10,000 to \$18,000. The lens advertised an aviation brand of super premium grade fuel.

"This graphic lens is highly sought after and looks incredible when placed onto a Ripple Gill Body. (It) shows an outstanding and bright airplane graphic as well as unique 'Aviation Gasoline' script throughout the outer field... Overall a very nice example of this beautiful and highly sought after lens from Marland Aviation Gasoline."

The company said it would accept a minimum bid of \$5,000 for the item.

"Ever since the first Model A car rolled off Ford's assembly line in 1903, America has had a fascination with cars. Now, nearly 120 years later, that attraction has become a pleasant obsession for the legion of collectors who regard Morphy Auctions as the No. 1 source for signage, gas pumps, globes, and other service station equipment from motoring's golden

era," the release stated.

Absentee, phone and online bidding will be allowed.

Nearly 1,500 lots will be offered, with day one primarily to focus on "Railroadiana" and items from a major central Ohio private collection and two other collections from California and Montana. The auction lineup will include signs from historic rail lines, stations and depots; signals, whistles, fire alarms, bells, antique railroad lanterns and more.

As auctioneers turn to "Automobilia," items offered will range from rare automotive emblems and advertising pins to an antique but mint-condition

42-inch-diameter Cadillac dealership sign, originally from Mississippi, expected to sell for \$12,000 to \$22,000.

Morphy's Automobilia & Petroliana department head John Mihovetz said he expects "bidding wars" over an original circa-1930s Western Motor Gasoline globe lens with the image of cowboys riding horses across a Southwestern landscape. Also poised to grab attention will be 15-inch Gilmore Red Lion Gasoline single-globe lens issued in the 1930s by Gilmore Oil Company of Los Angeles. It could command anywhere from \$15,000 to \$25,000.

"The centerpiece of any gas and oil

advertising collection is, of course, a vintage gas pump, and they don't get any better than the Wesco Model 212 in Morphy's sale," the release notes. "It's a large-bodied pump finished in Hancock livery, with a clock face, brass nozzle and bevels, and three different Visiglas lenses at the top."

"You just never see one of these pumps. In fact, I can't recall ever seeing one at auction," Mihovetz said.

The pump may be sold for as much as \$30,000.

The auction is scheduled to begin each day at 9 a.m. Eastern. Collectors are encouraged to check out the auction catalog online.

Founders Tower restaurant, other areas to be auctioned

Commercial space available at Founders Tower in Oklahoma City, including the landmark building's round penthouse restaurant, is scheduled to be auctioned on April 14, according to a release issued by Williams & Williams Auctioneers.

During a similar auction held last fall, more than 20 residential condo units were sold to new owners.

The auction will be held on site beginning at 5 p.m., with simultaneous online bidding available through AuctionNetwork.com.

"This auction will be a little different because we are selling three important commercial spaces," said Fontana Fitzwilson, executive vice president for sales at Williams & Williams.

The three parcels will include the building's iconic restaurant, the second floor including approximately 4,340 square feet, and the attached ground floor annex with approximately 12,230 square feet.

"The restaurant is a one-of-a-kind opportunity for a chef entrepreneur. It was closed just prior to the pandemic and most of the fixtures and furnishings are still on site," Fitzwilson said.

The restaurant is known as one of the first in the country to rotate 360 degrees.

Though it does not rotate anymore, it has sentimental value to people who have held special events and celebration dinners there in the past, Fitzwilson said.

"The second floor could be used in a variety of ways – office, boutique retail,

or day spa, to name a few," she said. The annex is vacant and could be used for any type of office or business service.

Inspection dates are March 25 and April 1 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. For full terms, photos and links to request due diligence information, online

According to the website, Founders Tower, located at 5900 Mosteller Drive, was built in 1964. It underwent a \$50 million remodel and was converted from office spaces to luxury residential condos in 2007-08.

Survey finds businesses relaxing hiring standards

Hard-pressed to find dependable, qualified people to fill jobs, many companies are relaxing standards and hiring applicants they would not have considered in the past.

That's according to findings of a recent national survey of business hiring managers commissioned by Oklahoma City-based Express Employment Professionals.

The survey, conducted by The Harris Poll on behalf of the staffing company with more than 850 franchise locations worldwide, found that larger companies especially have been willing to overlook at least some weaknesses of job applicants.

While eliminating barriers to employment may be helpful in pulling some workers off the sidelines in an extremely tight labor market, Express Employment International CEO Bill Stoller said caution should be advised.

"Careful considerations for the safety and health of colleagues must be taken into account (for example) when waiving employment requirements," Stoller said.

The survey of more than 1,000 hiring decision makers was conducted online within the United States late last year. It revealed that 39% of respondents had hired someone they probably would not have previously considered. Larger companies were more likely to relax standards: 47% of companies with more than 500 employees reported hiring someone who previously would not have made the cut, while 46% of companies with 100-499 employees and 47% of companies with 50-99 employees did so. Some

29% of companies with 10-49 employees reported hiring an individual they previously would not have, and 25% of companies with 2-9 employees reported doing so.

Nearly two-thirds of companies that did such hiring — 63% — reported that they overlooked an applicant's lack of either soft or hard skills, while 45% overlooked an applicant's ability to pass a

background check or drug screening.

Nancy Reed, an Express franchise owner in Texas, said problem solving and critical thinking skills, ability to be a team player, adaptability, flexibility and dependability are highly prized by employers, along with technical skills, but many hirers lately have opted to overlook at least some weaknesses in applicants.

"Businesses are willing and have been

overlooking traditional hiring requirements," she said. "They are having to make critical hiring decisions due to the lack of available workers and growing demands."

Rather than making hires they normally wouldn't make, companies might benefit more from making additional investments in their existing staffs, training workers to take on new responsibilities and more rewarding leadership roles, Stoller said.

"With the right investments in training and education, companies can create their qualified workers ready to mentor the next generation," he said.

Reed agreed.

"Companies are constantly battling high turnover due to market conditions," she said. "It makes more sense to give an opportunity to a loyal employee and invest in them directly versus hiring someone experienced who will leave for another job. We are seeing businesses investing more in training and are going back to the concept of 'building your own' to create a strong workforce from within."

A potential silver lining in the survey was that two-thirds of hiring decision-makers said they thought pools of qualified applicants would likely increase through 2023.

"(People who were) waiting to return are now searching for new professional opportunities," Reed said. "I see it in our offices and applicant tracking every day. Job seekers are now accepting positions more frequently and starting to get back to work."

Six teens piled into four seats before deadly crash

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Six teenage girls on a high school lunch break were killed when their small car with only four seats collided with a large truck hauling rocks, the Oklahoma Highway Patrol said Wednesday.

Only the 16-year-old car's driver and front-seat passenger were wearing seat belts when the 2015 Chevrolet Spark collided with the truck Tuesday afternoon, according to the OHP.

The crash occurred in Tishomingo, a rural city of about 3,000 located about 100 miles southeast of Oklahoma City. Those killed included the 16-year-old driver, three 15-year-olds, and two 17-year-old passengers, the highway patrol said.

Tishomingo Public School Superintendent Bobby Waitman told The Associated Press that the six were on a break for lunch at the time of the crash, which occurred about a mile from Tishomingo High School.

Students in the district of about 850 students were in class Wednesday, Waitman said.

"Academics are secondary, frankly, at this point to the students knowing that they belong, that they have a safe place," Waitman said.

"You'll never fully understand, I don't think we'll ever fully understand a loss like this," Waitman added.

The girls' names weren't released be-

cause they are juveniles.

The highway patrol identified the driver of the truck as Valendon Burton, 51, of Burneyville, Oklahoma. The report said Burton was not injured in the crash.

The crash report, released Wednesday morning, said the circumstances of the wreck remained under investigation. But OHP Trooper Shelby Humphrey said Tuesday night that the girls' car was making a right turn when it collided with the truck, KXII-TV reported.

A National Transportation Safety Board team of investigators, including people specializing in highway factors, motor carrier operations and crash reconstruction, was going to the scene, according to NTSB spokesman Peter Knudson, as well as a liaison between investigators and surviving families.

Waitman said funeral services for the students were not yet scheduled and that the district would work with their families to potentially schedule a memorial

service on campus.

The crash happened one week after nine people were killed — including six members of a New Mexico college's golf team and their coach — in a crash in West Texas. In that crash, the National Transportation Safety Board determined that a 13-year-old boy was behind the wheel of a truck when it crossed the centerline and collided with a van carrying students from the University of the Southwest golf team.

Houses passes Texas-style abortion ban

The Oklahoma House late Tuesday passed a bill that would prohibit doctors from performing abortions in the state, one of several anti-abortion bills working its way to the Republican governor — who has indicated he'll sign it.

The ban on abortions would be enforced through private civil actions, similar to a new Texas law that has led to a dramatic reduction in the number of abortions performed in that state.

Under the law, any private citizen is entitled to collect at least \$10,000 if they bring a successful lawsuit against someone who performed or helped a woman obtain an abortion — which opponents have condemned as a bounty.

“People who need abortion will be forced to flee their home state, attempt to end their pregnancies without medical support and face state-created bounty hunters here at home,” said **Emily Wales**, interim president and CEO of Planned Parenthood Great Plains Votes.

The House author of the bill, Republican Rep. **Wendi Stearman** of Collinsville, said her goal is to outlaw all abortions in Oklahoma.

The measure now heads to the Senate, which passed a similar ban earlier this month. Republican Gov. **Kevin Stitt** has said he'll sign any anti-abortion bill the Legislature sends to his desk.

Pharmacy choice bill advances

A bill intended to strengthen the rights of Oklahomans to use pharmacies of their choice has made headway at the Capitol.

Senate Bill 1860 was crafted by Sen. Greg McCortney, R-Ada, who also authored the Patient's Right to Pharmacy Choice Act in 2019. The lawmaker said goals are to protect rights of patients and their relationships with favored pharmacists.

“The customer should have the right to choose where they buy their prescriptions. They shouldn't have to drive several miles to use the pharmacy their insurance company designated,” McCortney said. “I want to make sure it's the patient's choice about whether to use their local pharmacy, a chain or a mail-order company.”

SB 1860 passed in the upper chamber and advanced to the House, where it will be carried by House principal author, Rep. **Marcus McEntire**, R-Duncan.

Free Guard tuition proposed

Legislation intended to make higher education more

attainable for members of the Oklahoma National Guard earned a salute in the Senate.

Senate Bill 1418 by Sen. **Kim David**, R-Porter, proposes to cover resident tuition and fee charges at Oklahoma colleges and universities for qualifying Guard members.

David said she filed the bill after an interim study held in last fall on ways to improve recruitment and retention of Guard members.

“This bill will provide the same educational opportunities to our National Guardsmen that members in surrounding states receive, helping boost recruitment and retention,” she said.

Guard members could enroll in up to 18 credit hours per semester, subject to funding availability. The amount of assistance would be capped at 120 credit hours for an associate's or baccalaureate degree. Up to 40 credit hours would be covered for a graduate program.

The bill would also create a revolving fund to pay for the program.

SB 1418 will next be considered in the House, where it was authored by Rep. **Nicole Miller**, R-Edmond.

Pandemic: Two years and counting

Two years ago, the COVID-19 virus turned our worlds upside down.

During that time, the virus' impacts have been staggering. In our state, more than one million COVID-19 cases were confirmed, which averages about one case for every four Oklahomans. In some rural areas, the ratio climbed to more than one case for every three residents.

These numbers are high, but they undercount the actual number of cases due

to lack of reporting for at-home test results, Oklahomans who couldn't access testing during peak periods, or sick workers who were afraid of losing hours — or their jobs — with a positive diagnosis.

During the biggest surges to date,

Oklahomans found themselves waiting hours or days in the emergency room and hospital hallways before they could be admitted. Most tragically, more than 15,000 Oklahomans have lost their lives due to the virus.

To mark the pandemic's two-year anniversary, our team at the Oklahoma Policy Institute is releasing a series of policy analyses and reflections that use a variety of lenses to examine the pandemic's impact and challenges facing our state. Our team has looked at how the pandemic:

- worsened economic disparities especially for low-wage workers and our communities of color;
- exposed Oklahoma's ongoing childcare shortages and how that limits caregivers from returning to the workforce;
- deepened the state's already significant problem with evictions and housing insecurity;
- struck our immigrant communities who experienced inequitable support from pandemic relief efforts;
- brought about reductions for Oklahoma prison and jail populations, which did not change Oklahoma's recent downward trend for overall crime rates;
- led tribal nations to take larger leadership roles that ensured the health and safety both of its citizens and the communities they serve; and
- highlighted the wise health care investment Oklahomans made when they approved Medicaid expansion, which has brought life-changing health care to more than 260,000 Oklahomans and lowered the state's uninsured rates.

Oklahoma is currently enjoying a period of relatively low case counts and spring's promise of more time outdoors enjoying warmer weather. However, we should not be seduced into thinking this is all behind us. The effects from this pandemic echo in our communities today and will continue for many years to come. Our elected officials and policymakers must continue to make decisions and long-term investments that can help create a more equitable recovery for all Oklahomans.

The argument for return to work

As you probably know by now, I'm a supporter of working from home. I believe that when it's possible, it can provide an increased quality of life for the employee — and a cost savings for the employer. But,

it's starting to become more common for employers to require workers to come back anyway. And, the reasoning is surprising.

I recently learned that some employers are claiming that

those who prefer work from home are hiding something. In particular, they are hiding mental health and addiction issues. In other words, the only reason you might want to work from home is if you have a problem you don't want your boss to know about.

This news is disheartening at best. Through the pandemic, it has been proven that many office workers can work effectively at home. On top of being more efficient at work, many employees

have seen their stress levels drop and their personal time increase.

There are many logical reasons leaders may want their people to be back in the physical office. For example, not every job can be performed in a work from home setting. And, if you're leading an organization where only a portion of the jobs can be remote, you may want everyone to come back together. It may increase the feeling of community and equity across various parts of the organization.

There are also some workers who genuinely prefer working from the office. They appreciate the structure that it creates. They like the separation of home and work that going to the office provides. They enjoy the casual moments of community with coworkers.

There are many legitimate reasons an employer may prefer for their employees to come back in person to a centralized office location. But, to shift blame to employees is wrong. The vast majority of those who enjoy working from home enjoy it for reasons that are no secret. It's not because there is something wrong with them. It's not because

they're using substances during the workday, or are shielding the employer from their mental health struggles.

Don't get me wrong. Many employees did in fact experience mental health challenges during the COVID-19 pandemic. Truly, what did anyone expect from a pandemic? It's a pandemic. It's possible that working from home may have helped bridge the gap for some people during a tough patch. But, the idea that all work from home supporters are hiding something is just not true.

If you need your employees to go back to a physical office, be honest. Explain the real reasons that the company believes it makes sense. Then, listen to your employees. Hear their concerns. Work together to come up with a solution that works for both sides of the equation.

Don't turn on your employees. Don't pressure them to come back out of fear or shame. As a leader, your role is to inspire others to want to follow your vision.

landowners' desperate fights to bollix up the government's plans by claiming required studies weren't done or permits obtained. Occasionally, property owners can show decision-makers another route will better fit their transportation needs or that their parcel is more expensive than what the experts first thought, making other land a more economical choice. We observe the intimate drama, glad that we're not the ones involved.

But the gathering eminent domain conflict we've read about this month, the first skirmish of which took place in a crowded, emotionally charged town hall meeting in Norman, is far different than the usual fights over a highway extension or building

a new public park. The Norman rhetorical shouting match was only the opening round in what will be a determined effort to both implement and resist the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority's recently announced \$5 billion, 15 years long ACCESS plan to, among other major projects, significantly expand the network of turnpikes surrounding the Oklahoma City metropolitan area.

What makes the OTA's plan far different than the usual highway expansion is not just its widespread scope, involving multiple projects in multiple areas. This plan is more than the infrastructure map for moving Oklahomans and their cars around the state—it's a design for our way of life. This blueprint, backed by billions of dollars, commits Oklahoma, and the Oklahoma City metro region in particular, to sprawling suburban development as the foundation of both its land use planning and its economic development strategy. As we have seen with the building, and then successive expansion, of the Kirkpatrick and the fledgling Kickapoo Turnpikes in Oklahoma City, the development of new housing, retail and even office space will rapidly follow the construction of new highway corridors.

This stimulation of economic development wasn't just seen by plan supporters as a positive consequence of dissolving our transportation blockages. Gov.

Kevin Stitt, for example, a leading ACCESS proponent, supports the plan precisely because he thinks it is an excellent strategic foundation for our state's next decades of growth.

What's disturbing is not that the governor's economic vision is wrong—it's that it's possible our lives would be better if we discouraged sprawl and encouraged denser growth instead. We should seriously and publicly deliberate and debate these questions before we commit to a way of life. But this plan isn't only in the works—the OTA has already approved it. The wheels of bond selling, land buying and road designing have begun to turn. None of these decisions were made by elected officials—all the voting members of the OTA board are appointed officers. Of the next and last set of officials to pass on finance plans, the Council on Bond Oversight, all but one are unelected. The most likely result of this process is that Oklahomans will soon begin driving down a long road without ever having discussed if this destination is one we really prefer.

Powell: Digital currencies will require new regulations

WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell said new forms of digital money such as cryptocurrencies and stablecoins present risks to the U.S. financial system and will require new rules to protect consumers.

Powell, speaking Wednesday on a panel organized by the Bank for International Settlements, a global organization of central bankers, also said that new technologies will likely make electronic payments cheaper and faster. But they could also destabilize existing financial institutions, he said.

“Our existing regulatory frameworks were not built with a digital world in mind,” he said. “Stablecoins, central bank digital currencies, and digital finance more generally, will require changes to existing laws and regulation or even entirely new rules and frameworks.”

Stablecoins are a type of cryptocurrency usually tied to the dollar or a commodity such as gold. Central bank digital currencies are digital forms of dollars or other currencies, issued by governments. The Fed is researching digital dollars but has not yet made a decision on whether to issue one. It released a study on

stablecoins in January.

In his remarks, Powell outlined several risks that stem from the growth of digital finance, including to consumers and the broader financial system.

Americans who buy stablecoins or crypto “may not fully understand the

extent of their potential losses, or that these investments generally lack the government protections that accompany many of the traditional financial instruments and services that they’re used to,” Powell said.

The Fed is also trying to figure out how

digital assets like Bitcoin might impact financial markets, particularly during downturns or market crashes.

“We don’t know how some digital products will behave in times of market stress, which could lead to large destabilizing flows, nor do we know how stresses in crypto markets could potentially spill over into the traditional financial system,” Powell said.

One concern regarding stablecoins is that, while many promise to maintain a value of \$1, it’s not always clear if stablecoin issuers have sufficient cash to redeem each stablecoin they issue for \$1.

Powell also noted that crypto assets have been used for “illicit activity,” such as money laundering, and “we need to prevent this so that the innovations that do survive and do attract broad adoption are those that provide value over time” for legal uses.

Powell said the Fed has “long supported responsible innovation,” though he added that it is difficult to tell which innovations “will have lasting effects and those that will turn out mostly to be hype.”

“And it’s never possible in real time to be sure which is which,” he said.

California governor signs law making abortions cheaper

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — California Gov. Gavin Newsom signed a new law on Tuesday that will make abortions cheaper for people on private insurance plans, the first of more than a dozen bills the state’s Democratic leaders plan to pass this year to prepare for a potential U.S. Supreme Court ruling that could overturn Roe v. Wade.

The new conservative majority on the U.S. Supreme Court is weighing whether to overturn Roe v. Wade, the landmark 1973 ruling that banned states from outlawing abortion. If they do, at least 26 states are likely to either ban abortion outright or severely limit access, according to the Guttmacher Institute, a research and policy organization that supports abortion rights.

That would force lots of women to travel to other states to get abortions, prompting Democratic-led states like California to propose and pass new laws to prepare for them. Last week, Washington Gov. Jay Inslee signed a law aimed at banning legal action against people who aid or receive an abortion, a measure responding to a law in Texas that lets people sue abortion providers or those who assist them.

Oregon lawmakers included \$15 million in their state budget to help pay for people to travel to the state to get abortions. California has a similar bill, one of 14 proposals aimed at expanding and protecting access to abortion in the nation’s most populous state. The bills were inspired by a report from the Future of Abortion Council, a group Newsom convened last year to advise him on how to respond should Roe v. Wade be overturned.

“We’re looking at 26 states that will in-

roduce some sort of ban and restriction on abortion, so you have the other half of the country that will need to prepare for how we take care of those patients,” said Jodi Hicks, CEO and President of Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California. “We’re all imagining and trying to prepare correctly for what that impact will be.”

California already requires health insurance companies to cover abortions. But insurers often charge things like co-pays and deductibles that can add an average of \$543 to the cost of a medication abortion and \$887 to the cost of a procedural abortion, according to an analysis by the California Health Benefits Review Program.

The law Newsom signed on Tuesday eliminates those fees. While the law will make abortions cheaper, it will also

slightly increase monthly premiums for patients and their employers. But the savings from eliminating the fees will be greater than the increased premiums, according to an analysis by the California Health Benefits Review Program.

The law, authored by state Sen. Lena Gonzalez, makes California the fourth state to ban these fees — joining Illinois, New York and Oregon.

“As states across the country attempt to move us backwards by restricting fundamental reproductive rights, California continues to protect and advance reproductive freedom for all,” Newsom said.

The U.S. Supreme Court is expected to decide this summer whether to uphold a law in Mississippi that bans abortions after 15 weeks of pregnancy. During a public hearing on the case last year, a majority of justices indicated they were

willing to uphold the law and even overturn Roe v. Wade.

That case has prompted swift action in state Legislatures across the country. Last week, lawmakers in Idaho sent a bill to the governor that would ban abortions after six weeks of pregnancy. In Missouri, lawmakers introduced a bill that would make it illegal for the state’s residents to get abortions in other states.

States like California, however, are drafting proposals to counter those measures. They include bills to ban disclosing abortion medical records to police or other out-of-state entities and protect patients and providers from civil liability. They would expand California’s abortion workforce, allowing some nurse practitioners to perform the procedure without the supervision of a doctor and setting up a scholarship program for people studying reproductive health who agree to work in underserved areas.

And they would set up funds that would help pay for people to get abortions, including compensating providers who provide free care to low-income patients and assisting with things like travel, lodging and child care for women seeking the procedure in California.

“This legislative package is robust, it’s bold, it’s responsive and it’s innovative, and that’s exactly what we need right now,” said Amy Moy, chief external affairs officer for Essential Access Health and a member of the steering committee for the Future of Abortion Council. “We have a unique opportunity and a pressing responsibility to make sure that anyone seeking time sensitive and potentially life changing abortion care within our state’s borders can do so with dignity and respect and safety.”

Firings may have been illegal

LONDON— The British government said Wednesday that a Dubai government-owned ferry operator at the center of a bitter U.K. labor dispute likely broke the law when it fired 786 crew members without notice to replace them with cheaper contract staff.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson condemned the “callous” behavior of P&O Ferries and said the company appeared to have broken British labor laws.

“We will be taking action,” Johnson said, adding that the company could “face fines running into millions of pounds” if it is found guilty.

P&O Ferries claimed the move was legal because the staff worked on ships registered outside the U.K. The ferry operator acknowledged that the way the dismissals were carried out caused distress for workers and said it had offered “generous compensation” to those involved.

But the company also said it couldn’t have survived without “fundamentally changed crewing arrangements” and that it took the action to save 2,200 other jobs. The dismissed seafarers are being replaced by cheaper workers employed by a third-party crew provider.

The staff cuts — which came after P&O received millions in British government aid during the COVID-19 pandemic — have caused outrage and sparked protests by trade unions at U.K. ports. P&O canceled all its ferry crossings between Britain, Ireland and continental Europe after the announcement last week, disrupting the movement of both travelers and goods.

Utilities appeal ruling blocking line

MADISON, Wis. — Developers of a \$492 million transmission line are appealing a federal judge’s ruling that blocks the project’s crossing through the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife Refuge.

American Transmission Co., ITC Midwest, and Dairyland Power Cooperative are building the 345-kilovolt transmission line which would run more than 100 miles from Dane County to Dubuque County in Iowa.

The Driftless Area Land Conservancy and the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation have mounted a number of legal challenges to the project in state and federal court.

In a ruling earlier this year, a federal judge sided with the conservation groups that sued the agencies that issued approvals for the line. The groups argued that Rural Utilities Service violated federal environmental law because the agency failed to fully review alternatives to the project.

U.S. District Judge William Conley sent the environmental impact statement back for further review, Wisconsin Public Radio reported.

The utilities are asking a federal appeals court to put a hold on that ruling until an appeals panel decides the case. They argue federal agencies fully complied with federal environmental law, adding the project can cross the refuge with “appropriate environmental conditions.”

Utilities are hoping to have the line complete and in service by December of next year. A spokesperson for the Rural Utilities Service says the agency doesn’t comment on pending litigation.

Bill seeks to expand legal access

FORT KENT, Maine — One of the U.S.’s most rural states is looking to improve access to lawyers for residents who live far from urban areas.

The Maine Senate on Tuesday unanimously passed a proposal from Democratic Senate President Troy Jackson that would authorize the University of Maine School of Law to open a satellite rural legal aid clinic in Fort Kent. Jackson, who represents a district in far northern Maine, said the move is about protecting “the rights of rural Mainers while creating opportunities for young people to pursue a legal education and set up a practice in the rural, underserved parts of our state.”

The bill would create a three-year pilot program designed to expand free legal aid access, recruit new attorneys to rural Maine and help students launch law careers.

The Senate passed the bill unanimously. It now faces more votes before enactment.

First Latina on California Supreme Court

LOS ANGELES — A San Diego appeals court judge who is the daughter of Mexican immigrants was confirmed Tuesday as the first Latina to serve on the California Supreme Court.

Justice Patricia Guerrero was approved by a 3-0 vote of the Commission on Judicial Appointments to fill the vacancy left by Associate Justice Mariano-Florentino Cuéllar, who stepped down last year.

Guerrero, 50, grew up in the agricultural Imperial Valley and has worked as a prosecutor, law firm partner and Superior Court judge and is on the state’s 4th District Court of Appeal. She will be sworn in Monday by Gov. Gavin Newsom, who nominated her.

Guerrero, who was praised by colleagues and members of the panel that included Attorney General Rob Bonta and Supreme Court Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye, said she was humbled by the historic significance of her elevation to the court.

She said she stood on the shoulders of her grandparents and parents who immigrated from Mexico to give their children a better life.

“As I’ve tried to express, this is not just about me, or really even just about my parents, but it’s about so many others just like us,” Guerrero said. “This is a story of the American dream, the belief that with hard work, perseverance and opportunities, anything is possible. And for that I am thankful.”

Utah governor vetoes transgender sports ban

SALT LAKE CITY — Utah Gov. Spencer Cox vetoed a ban on transgender students playing girls’ sports on Tuesday, becoming the second Republican governor this week to overrule state lawmakers taking on youth sports amid broader culture wars as LGBTQ visibility grows.

Leaders in the GOP-dominated Legislature, however, quickly called a veto override session and indicated they had enough support to keep the ban in place.

There’s also pushback against Indiana Gov. Eric Holcomb’s Monday decision to veto a statewide ban. Holcomb said Indiana’s Legislature had not demonstrated that transgender kids had undermined fairness in sports.

Cox, for his part, referenced the potential effects on transgender youth.

“I struggle to understand so much of it and the science is conflicting. When in doubt, however, I always try to err on the side of kindness, mercy and compassion,” Cox wrote in a letter to Utah legislative leaders.

The vetoes come as Cox and Holcomb’s counterparts in nearly a dozen conservative-leaning states have enacted similar legislation and politicians have honed in on transgender kids in sports as a campaign issue in states ranging from Missouri to Pennsylvania.

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GOP senators criticize Jackson's record, question views

WASHINGTON (AP) — Supreme Court nominee Ketanji Brown Jackson returned to the Senate for a third day of hearings Wednesday as Republicans try to paint her as soft on crime and Democrats herald the historic nature of her nomination to become the first Black woman on the high court.

"America is ready for the Supreme Court glass ceiling to shatter," Sen. Dick Durbin, the Judiciary Committee chairman, said as Jackson's second and last day answering senators' questions began.

In Tuesday's marathon hearing, Republicans aggressively questioned her on the sentences she has handed down to sex offenders in her nine years as a federal judge, her advocacy on behalf of terror suspects at Guantanamo Bay, her thoughts on critical race theory and even her religious views. At one point, Republican Sen. Ted Cruz of Texas read from children's books that he said are taught at her teenage daughter's school.

Several GOP senators grilled Jackson on her child pornography sentences, arguing they were lighter than federal guidelines recommend. She said she based the sentences on many factors, not just the guidelines, and said some of the cases had given her nightmares.

Could her rulings have endangered children? "As a mother and a judge," she said, "nothing could be further from the truth."

In what Durbin described as "a trial by ordeal," Jackson spent her first day of hearings answering GOP concerns and highlighting her empathetic style on the bench. The committee's Republicans, several of whom have their eyes on the presidency, tried to brand her — and Democrats in general — as soft on crime, an emerging theme in GOP midterm election campaigns.

Jackson told the committee that her brother and two uncles served as police officers, and that "crime and the effect on the community, and the need for law enforcement — those are not abstract concepts or political slogans to me."

Wednesday's hearing is the second

day of questioning, and the third day of hearings, after Jackson and the 22 members of the panel gave opening statements on Monday. On Thursday, the committee will hear from legal experts before an eventual vote to move her nomination to the Senate floor.

President Joe Biden chose Jackson in February, fulfilling a campaign pledge to nominate a Black woman to the Supreme Court for the first time in American history. She would take the seat of Justice Stephen Breyer, who announced in January that he would retire after 28 years on the court. Jackson would be the third Black justice, after Thurgood Marshall and Clarence Thomas, and the sixth woman.

Barring unexpected developments, Democrats who control the Senate by the slimmest of margins hope to wrap up Jackson's confirmation before Easter, though Breyer is not leaving until the current session ends this summer.

Jackson said the potential to be the first Black woman on the court is "extremely meaningful" and that she had received many letters from young girls. Her nomination also "supports public confidence in the judiciary," Jackson said.

Democrats have been full of praise for

Biden's Supreme Court nominee, noting that she would not only be the first Black woman but also the first public defender on the court, and the first with experience representing indigent criminal defendants since Marshall.

Republicans praised that experience, too, but also questioned it, focusing in particular on work she did roughly 15 years ago representing detainees at the U.S. facility in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Jackson said public defenders don't pick their clients and are "standing up for the constitutional value of representation." She said she continued to represent one client in private practice because her firm happened to be assigned his case.

Picking up on a thread started by Sen. Josh Hawley, R-Mo., and amplified by the Republican National Committee in fundraising emails, Cruz questioned Jackson on her sentences for child pornographers, at one point bringing out a large poster board and circling sentences he said he found egregious.

In most of those cases, prosecutors or others representing the Justice Department generally argued for sentences that were lighter than those recommended by federal guidelines.

Jackson defended her decisions by

saying she takes into account not only sentencing guidelines but also the stories of the victims, the nature of the offenses and the defendants' histories.

"A judge is not playing a numbers game," she said. "A judge is looking at all of these different factors."

Cruz, Hawley and Sen. Tom Cotton, R-Ark., are potential 2024 presidential candidates, and their rounds of questioning were some of the most combative, hitting on issues that are popular with the GOP base. Cruz asked her about critical race theory, a premise that centers on the idea that racism is systemic in the nation's institutions. Jackson said the idea doesn't come up in her work as a judge, and it "wouldn't be something I would rely on" if confirmed.

The Texas senator also questioned her about her daughter's private school in Washington, where she sits on the board, bringing up a book called "Antiracist Baby" that he said was taught to younger children at the school.

"Do you agree with this book that is being taught for kids that babies are racist?" Cruz asked.

Visibly annoyed, Jackson took a long pause. She said no children should be made to feel they are racists, victims or oppressors. "I don't believe in any of that," she said.

Asked about abortion, Jackson readily agreed with comments that conservative Justices Amy Coney Barrett and Brett Kavanaugh made about two landmark cases when they were up for confirmation. "Roe and Casey are the settled law of the Supreme Court concerning the right to terminate a woman's pregnancy. They have established a framework that the court has reaffirmed," Jackson said.

Jackson's answers bypassed a key point: The court right now is weighing whether to overrule those cases that affirm a nationwide right to abortion.

Near the end of the day, Sen. John Kennedy, R-La., asked Jackson when life begins. She told him that she didn't know, and added, without elaborating, "I have a religious view that I set aside when I am ruling on cases."

Prosecutors say requiring cash bail would clog jails

ATLANTA (AP) — Two Georgia district attorneys are among those criticizing a bill to require cash bail before anyone charged with a felony could be released from jail, saying it could maroon poor people behind bars and reduce access to pretrial diversion and alternative courts.

Senators last week voted 30-22 along party lines to pass Senate Bill 504, sponsored by Sen. Randy Robertson, a Cataula Republican. Last year, Robertson sponsored a law to increase to 28 the number of felony offenses for which cash bail is required. Now he wants to apply the same rule to all of Georgia's more than 600 felony charges.

Robertson, a former Columbus police officer, argues that forcing people to put up money to get out of jail would make more of them appear for court and make them less likely to commit a crime while awaiting trial.

"When individuals get out freely and understand there's a turnstile at the county jail to where they really

don't have to have any skin in the game, then those individuals devolve into the recidivists that we see today," Robertson said during a subcommittee hearing Monday of the House Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee. "They go out and prey on our citizens within our community because they know the criminal justice system has no teeth."

The subcommittee did not vote on the measure.

Robertson said judges can set bail as low as one dollar if people don't have money. But Robertson said ultimately he's not worried about people staying locked up because in his experience, most people arrested on felony charges are guilty.

"I do push back on the belief that our jails are full of a lot of innocent people, because I know that not to be true," Robertson said.

Opponents say Robertson's plan would trample upon the presumption of innocence and create a two-tiered justice system where only the rich could get out

before trial. They also say that under the bill, only people who could afford bail could access pretrial diversion programs letting them avoid a felony conviction, or access drug courts or mental health courts aimed at providing treatment.

DeKalb County District Attorney Sherry Boston said Robertson's bill would likely clog jails with people arrested for nonviolent felonies like theft over \$500 and possession of narcotics. She said it isn't "practical" that judges would set low bails for such defendants when misdemeanor bails in her county are already typically in the thousands of dollars.

"All felonies are not created equal," Boston said. "And what this piece of legislation would do is it would equate all of those felonies."

Jared Williams, district attorney for Richmond and Burke counties, said keeping people jailed and cutting off access to alternative programs won't discourage crime, but encourage it. He said even short jail stays can cause the

loss of jobs and houses. And he said that sending someone to drug court or mental health court offers real solutions.

"This bill robs the courts of the same weapons and tools that we have to combat making this a way of life for so many defendants," Williams said.

Coco Papy of Savannah's Deep Center said that the typical prisoner awaiting bail in the Chatham County jail is there for three days. At \$74.51 a night, she said the bill could cost \$287,000 a year for Chatham County alone.

"Who pays for it, and if this is just what it looks like in Chatham County, what will it look like across the state and in your districts?" Papy asked.

But Robertson said all those advocates were ignoring the concerns of crime victims.

"I did not hear one person show any compassion for the citizens of this state, the poor, the middle class and the wealthy, who work every day and want to live in a safe community."

Bill to eliminate some court fines, fees earns bipartisan support

A bill that would reduce court fines and fees associated with criminal convictions is gaining support in the legislature.

Senate Bill 1458 by Sen. Roger Thompson, R-Okemah, unanimously cleared the upper chamber on March 14. Rep. Kyle Hilbert, R-Bristow, is carrying the proposal in the House.

Thompson's bill proposes that the state instead funds these agencies entirely through direct appropriations.

Senate Bill 1458 would also prohibit district attorneys from charging a \$40 a month probation fee. Individuals on probation would be required to pay at most \$20 a month to support the costs of their supervision.

Justice reform advocates have long criticized Oklahoma's court funding system as being inefficient and overly dependent on collections from mostly low-income people. Court fines and fees accounted for 66% to 90% of district court funding between 2007 and 2019, a Tulsa World analysis found.

Speaking on the Senate floor last

week, Thompson said the estimated cost of the proposal is \$13 million in Fiscal Year 2023 and \$26 million to \$28 million in Fiscal Year 2024. Lawmakers could use American Rescue Plan funds to ease the transition, The Frontier reported last month.

"I definitely believe someone who is convicted of breaking the law should be held accountable, but the current system of funding courts through fees

can actually prevent individuals from turning their lives around," Thompson said in a statement. "When they can't pay, then the courts don't get funded, warrants are issued, and people are arrested to get them to pay something they couldn't afford in the first place. We need to help citizens obey the laws of the land without being overly burdensome."

When I heard that this bill passed the Senate, the first person I thought of

was Robert Lavern, a 53-year-old native of Talala who was convicted of drug possession with intent to distribute in 2020.

I first spoke with Lavern in October 2020, weeks after he was released from the William S. Key Correctional Facility in Fort Supply. Our conversations initially centered around his experience catching COVID-19 behind bars and recovering from a severe case of the virus.

Over the next several months, as Lavern worked to reintegrate into society and stay sober, our conversations shifted to the conditions of his probation and fees he was required to pay. A \$40 monthly supervision fee is a lot to pay when you're between jobs, he told me.

I called Lavern on Monday to catch up and get his thoughts on Senate Bill 1458. He told me he's pleased that lawmakers are working to make life a little easier for people coming out of the justice system.

"The fines make things tough," Lavern said. "They want you to be rehabilitated and get out and be a thriving model citizen, paving your own way, but they have their hand out the whole damn way."

A similar proposal, Senate Bill 1532 by Rep. Julie Daniels, unanimously cleared the Senate last week and is eligible to be heard in the House. If enacted, courts could waive fines and fees if a person has made regular installment payments over several years.

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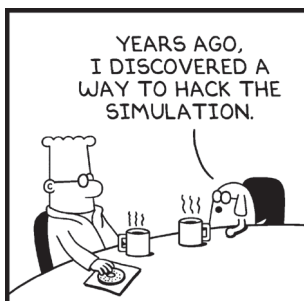
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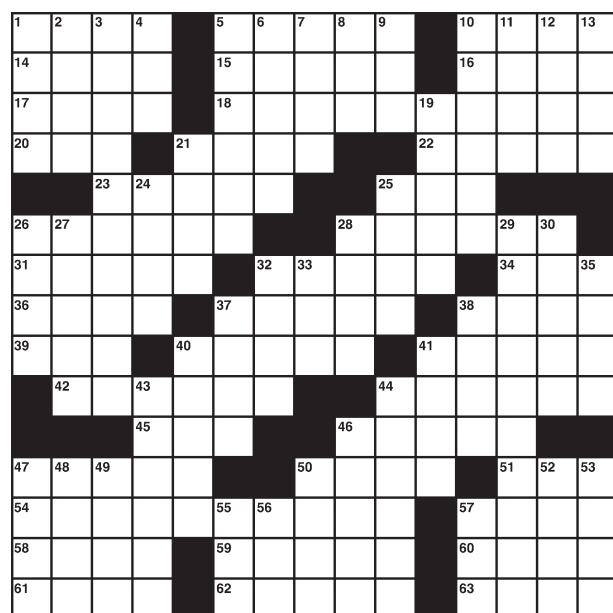
